Attached to this letter is your student's course selection form for their grade level next year. These documents will help you and your student make course requests for the 2026-27 school year:

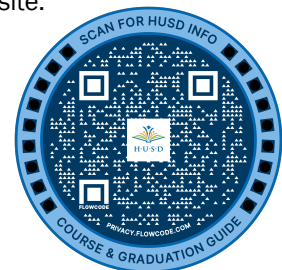
- Senior Course Selection form for 2026-2027. You and your student need to thoroughly complete this form. This form must include a student and parent signature. Please read through each section on the Course Selection form carefully and select one course for each core class: English, Math, Social Studies, and Science, AND indicating which courses were completed in prior years. Students will write in their top 6 elective choices on the back.
- List of elective options for WFHS is also attached. Please use this list to choose the top 6 electives for next year. Take note of what grade level is eligible to take each class. Course descriptions are available in the course guide located on the HUSD and WFHS websites. Please note that elective choices are not guaranteed and are based only on availability. Schedule changes are limited to errors and not for elective preferences.
- Graduation Requirements & Course Pathways for English, Math, Social Studies and Science for HUSD students to follow. Please follow the course pathways outlined. The pathways can also be found in the HUSD Course Guide. If you have any questions about course sequencing the course pathways will be able to guide you on the correct course(s) to select.
- AP/Honors Agreement Form (Optional) – this form is required at the time you submit the course selection form only *IF* your student plans on taking any AP/Honors classes for the 2026-27 school year. If students are unsure about taking an AP/Honors class, it is recommended that they talk with their current teachers who are familiar with their abilities. Student and parent should read the AP/Honors agreement thoroughly before selecting any AP/Honors classes. If this form is not included, then the student will not be placed in their requested AP/Honors class.

Once all other enrollment paperwork has been submitted to the registrar, then the Course Selection form will be input by counseling. Reminder that this form must be completed and signed by a parent/guardian. The courses selected on this form will be used to create the student's schedule for the 2026-27 school year. Courses selected are not guaranteed and based on availability.

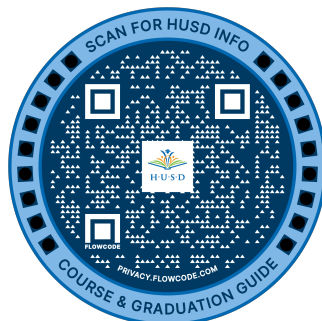

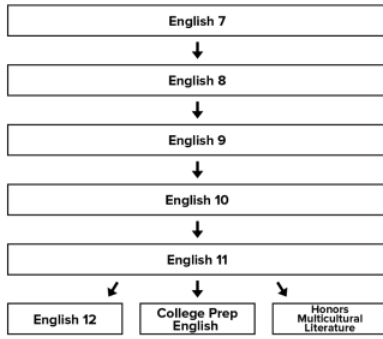

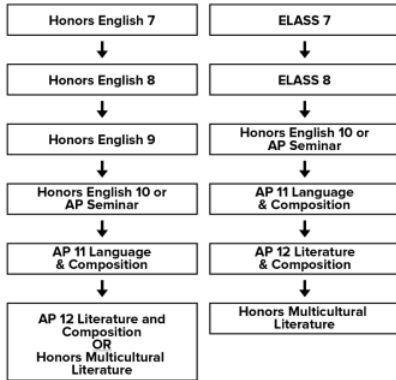


English Pathways

On Level Pathway

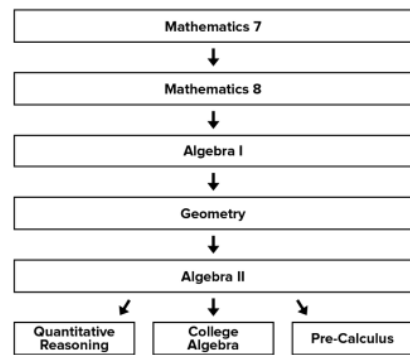


Honors Pathway

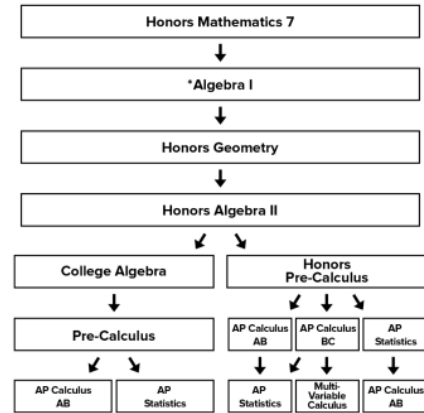


Mathematics Pathways

On Level Pathway



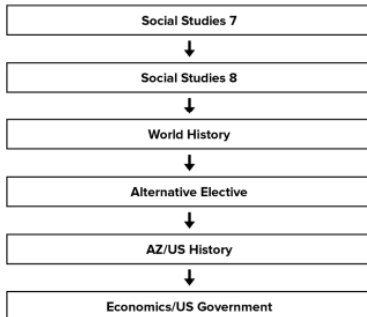

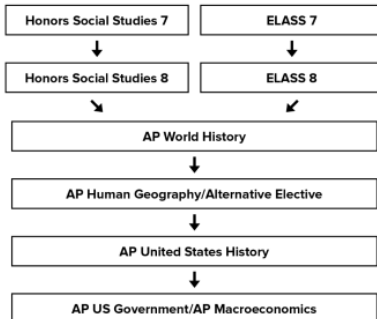

On Level Pathway

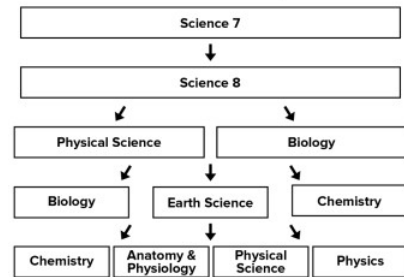


Honors Pathway



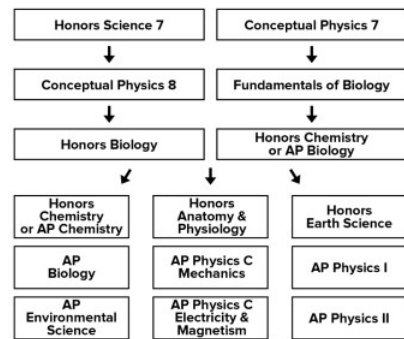
Science Pathways

Other Schedule Considerations

Seminary - Takes up a period in your schedule but is not eligible for credit, students schedules will show "Release Time"

Release Period - 12th graders can take up to 2 release periods if they are on track for graduation. Keep in mind that Seniors must take at least 4 credit-bearing classes.

EVIT - 11th and 12th graders can concurrently enroll at EVIT. EVIT will take up 3 class periods each year and students will need to ensure they still meet all graduation requirements.

Middle School Credit - If you earned high school credit in middle school, this will count towards your elective requirements. You will still have to take 4 years of math in high school.

Reminders

When selecting your classes, make sure you select the 1st and 2nd semester section of the course (unless it is a semester-only class).

Seniors, you can add release time to your schedule, please make sure to select the sections that correspond to the periods you wish to have free.

Some classes may not be visible during online registration as they require auditions, portfolios, or teacher approval, please sign up for the beginning level course and the teacher will move you to the appropriate level.

EVIT students, please make sure to select each section of AM or PM EVIT **3** times to block off 3 periods for EVIT.

HUSD High School AP/Honors Academic Agreement

Honors, Dual Enrollment, and Advanced Placement course are courses that exceed the state content standards and expectation. Participation in these classes often requires summer work, rigorous testing, individual/ group projects, presentations, and a higher expectation for classroom participation and discussion. *Colleges rank "grades in college prep courses" and "strength of curriculum" as the top two factors in the admission decision. **85% of selective colleges and universities report that a student's AP experience favorably impacts admission decisions.

Choosing to take an Honors, Dual Enrollment, or AP course is a serious decision. There are many benefits to taking such courses, but there are some risks as well. Students who successfully pass the College Board AP exam in their content with a score of 4 or 5 often receive college credit that is recognized nationwide. However, not all AP courses are accepted at all colleges and universities. Students taking an AP course are not guaranteed college credit, and understanding the difference between local colleges and state universities is important.

Cost:

The cost incurred with Dual Enrollment or the AP exam will be the responsibility of the parents. All students taking AP courses are expected to take the associated AP exam at the end of the school year in May. AP exam costs vary by year. Each AP class will incur a \$10 class fee. Tax credit is now available for all AP exams. Students facing a financial need may qualify for a fee reduction through College Board. See your school counselor for more information.

Prerequisite:

See the HUSD course guide for Advanced Placement Recommendations for the appropriate course recommended prerequisites and expectations.

Statement of Rigor:

Students are not required to take Honors courses prior to taking an AP course, but it is highly recommended. (This may not apply to Math.) Teachers of AP courses are required to adhere to strict pacing and rigor of their courses as they are approved by the College Board, and help prepare students to take the AP exams every spring. If a student struggles in a traditional course, it is not recommended the child be placed in AP or Honors course. The scope, sequence, and pacing of advanced courses differ greatly from the traditional classroom.

Student Responsibility:

- I agree to take full responsibility and understand that I am in this Honors, AP, or Dual Enrollment course for the length of the entire course. **I will not be permitted to exit the class.**
- To attend class daily. I recognize my absences should be kept to a minimum, as being absent will hinder my progress, grade, and participation in the course.
- To complete all work assigned, procuring and completing make-up work, and communicating with teacher upon my absence.
- In completing my own work in order to improve my ability to reason, analyze, and understand.
- To organize my time and study habits to successfully complete the course. I understand that this course will require a large amount of commitment. I understand I must keep up with the rigor of the class.
- To confer with the teacher and take immediate action should I fall behind in the course. It is my responsibility to keep up with my grade, to meet with the teacher, and attend tutoring if needed.
- If taking an AP course, I understand I am also preparing for the AP exam in the spring.
- I will have a conversation with my current teacher to understand the expectations in the next course and make sure that I am prepared to take the course.

Parent/Guardian Responsibility:

- I agree and understand that my child will be required to fulfill the requirements stated in this agreement, **and will not be permitted to exit their Honors, AP, or Dual Enrollment course.**
- I agree to be familiar with the course requirements located in the course syllabus.
- I agree to allow my child to participate in this course.
- I agree to allow my child to read the required materials for this course.
- I agree to help my child organize their life and study habits to support them in successfully completing the class.
- I agree to encourage my child to communicate with the teacher should curricular, discipline, other issues, or conflicts arise.
- I understand that the coursework is stringent and outside study time can amount to one to two times the actual school class time.
