The pupil and his/her family stipulate the facts of the case as presented by the school, accepting one of the following consequences: *(S) suspended expulsion, **(S) expulsion one semester, suspended expulsion one semester, (S) expulsion two semesters.

(YC) Youth Court is a SBCUSD program for youth who have committed education code violations 48900 or 48915 offenses (excluding mandatory offenses) for which they could be given an expulsion but are instead

given the option of appearing before a jury of their peers to explore the factors contributing to the education code violation(s) ensuring that students understand who were impacted by their actions, and what needs to be done to repair the harm caused by their actions as well as to address other contributing factors that led to the decisions made.

WHEREAS, the San Bernardino City Unified School District (District) is the owner in fee of real property located at 701 N E. Street, San Bernardino, California 92410, bearing San Bernardino County Assessors Parcel Number 0140-281-53-0000 (the Property), more particularly described in Exhibit A attached hereto and incorporated herein;

WHEREAS, Government Code section 53094 provides that a school district, by a vote of two-thirds of its members, may render city or county zoning ordinances inapplicable to a proposed use of property by a school district, unless the proposed use of the property is for nonclassroom facilities;

WHEREAS, the District proposes to construct a building to serve as the Districts future police headquarters (the Public Safety Building or the Project);

WHEREAS, the District has complied with the California Environmental Quality Act (Public Resources Code section 21000 et seq.) with respect to the Project;

WHEREAS, the District will use the Public Safety Building to house various programs and activities, including its student Cadet Program and Explorer Program;

WHEREAS, the Districts Cadet Program provides internships with career technical education opportunities for District students considering careers in law enforcement;

WHEREAS, the Districts Explorer Program provides District students considering careers in law enforcement with experiential learning opportunities, including classroom instruction in the Public Safety Building and other programming;

WHEREAS, because the Public Safety Building will house student programs, design plan review and construction of the Project will be under the jurisdiction of the Division of the State Architect (DSA) to confirm compliance with laws governing the design and construction of school buildings;

WHEREAS, the proposed Public Safety Building is located within the boundaries of the City of San Bernardino in the County of San Bernardino, California (City);

WHEREAS, there are no equivalent sites at which the District can construct the Public Safety Building, and it is important for the District to have adequate facilities for the Cadet and Explorer Programs;

WHEREAS, the District has balanced the interests of the public, including those of District and the City, and determined that the interests of the public are best served by the District exercising its rights under Government Code section 53094 in order to exempt the Project from City zoning ordinances, and commencing and completing the Project under DSA review;

WHEREAS, the District has complied with Government Code sections 65353.3 and 65402, and Public Resources Code section 21151.2 to the extent applicable.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE GOVERNING BOARD OF THE DISTRICT HEREBY FINDS, DETERMINES, RESOLVES, AND DECLARES AS FOLLOWS.

1. That the above recitals are all true and correct.
2. That, pursuant to Government Code section 53094, subdivision (b), the District Board of Education (Board) renders the City's zoning ordinances inapplicable to the Property with respect to the Project.
3. The Board adopts each ground and each statement in the Recitals and as set forth herein as a separate finding in support of its action and reserves the right to establish, expand upon, and include additional documentation not already referenced in support of this Resolution.
4. Any and all unprivileged written documents, communications and resolutions, including all planning documents with respect to the proposed Public Safety Building, are incorporated by reference as evidence in support of the findings set forth herein, including any and all staff reports relating to this Resolution.
5. That the District Superintendent or his designee is hereby authorized and directed to do any and all things which he may deem necessary or advisable in order to consummate the directives herein authorized and otherwise carry out, give effect to, and comply with the terms and intent of this Resolution. The District Superintendent, or designee, is directed to notify the City of this action within ten (10) days of the Board's approval of this Resolution by delivering a copy of this Resolution to the City.
6. That this Resolution shall be effective as of the date of its adoption.
