**The Board does hereby expel the pupil for a period of one semester and does hereby order the enforcement of the expulsion suspended for the following semester, allowing him/her to be considered for re-enrollment in the district under suspended expulsion as deemed appropriate for the rehabilitation of the pupil, per Education Code section 48917.

(S) A stipulated expulsion is a process whereby the pupil and his/her family acknowledge responsibility for the behavior leading to the recommendation for expulsion by the school administration and waive their right to a hearing by admitting to the facts in support of an expulsion recommendation. The pupil and his/her family stipulate the facts of the case as presented by the school, accepting one of the following consequences: *(S) suspended expulsion, **(S) expulsion one semester, suspended expulsion one semester, (S) expulsion two semesters.

(YC) Youth Court is a SBCUSD program for youth who have committed education code violations 48900 or 48915 offenses (excluding mandatory offenses) for which they could be given an expulsion but are instead

given the option of appearing before a jury of their peers to explore the factors contributing to the education code violation(s) ensuring that students understand who were impacted by their actions, and what needs to be done to repair the harm caused by their actions as well as to address other contributing factors that led to the decisions made.
