Per Senate Bill 153 (2024), California Education Code (EC) Section 32282(a)(3) now requires all Local Educational Agencies (LEAs) including school districts, charter schools, and county offices of education to adopt an Instructional Continuity Plan (ICP) as part of their Comprehensive School Safety Plan (CSSP). This plan intends to ensure that all students have equitable access to instruction during natural disasters or emergencies that disrupt in-person learning. Beginning July 1, 2025, every LEA in California must include an ICP in its Comprehensive School Safety Plan. This requirement will be tied to future Form J-13A waivers for instructional time and attendance credit in the event of an emergency starting in FY 2026/27. The ICP must be reviewed and updated annually by March 1 per EC Section 32286.

This plan is structured to fulfill the ICP requirements under EC Section 32282(a)(3), including:

- Engaging families within five calendar days of an emergency,
- Ensuring instruction resumes within 10 instructional days,
- Aligning remote instruction with independent study requirements under EC Sections 51747 and 51749.5,
- Addressing mental health, technology, equity, and access for all students, including English learners, foster youth, homeless students, and students with disabilities.

This plan will be embedded directly into the CSSPs that the Board approved on February 18, 2025.

### Staff Analysis:

On April 1, 2025, the Board approved an Operating Agreement with St. Johns Community Health for the operation of a School-Based Wellness Center located at Pacific High School, effective April 2, 2025 through June 30, 2029. The agreement included a no-cost service provision model, with St. Johns to occupy 730

square feet in the Bio Medical Building on the school campus to provide a range of health services to students and community members.

As of the date of this agenda item, no services have commenced, and St. Johns has not occupied or prepared the facility for use. Based on administrative review and in alignment with the Districts strategic direction and vendor management objectives, the District recommends terminating the agreement using the without cause provision (Section 33.A) of the executed contract.

The 90-day notice of termination was issued on June 24, 2025, making the agreements final termination date September 22, 2025. This Board item serves to formally acknowledge the Districts cancellation for convenience and to document the closure of this contract relationship in the Boards governance record. Termination is proceeding under the authority delegated to the Director of Purchasing Services pursuant to Education Code §17604 and Board Policy 3312.
