The pupil and his/her family stipulate the facts of the case as presented by the school, accepting one of the following consequences: *(S) suspended expulsion, **(S) expulsion one semester, suspended expulsion one semester, (S) expulsion two semesters.

(YC) Youth Court is a SBCUSD program for youth who have committed education code violations 48900 or 48915 offenses (excluding mandatory offenses) for which they could be given an expulsion but are instead given the option of appearing before a jury of their peers to explore the factors contributing to the education code violation(s) ensuring that students understand who were impacted by their actions, and what needs to be done to repair the harm caused by their actions as well as to address other contributing factors that led to the decisions made.

Pursuant to California Education Code sections 51222, 51241, 51242, 51246, and 52316, and in accordance with Board Policy and Administrative Regulation 6142.7 - Physical Education Course Permanent Exemptions, the Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all Physical Education (PE) exemption requests are administered in compliance with state law and that appropriate documentation is maintained for monitoring and auditing purposes.

Administrative Regulation 6142.7 requires that a list of students seeking Physical Education exemptions be compiled at least annually and submitted to the Board of Education for approval, identifying the type of exemption requested (permanent, athletic, or medical).

Students requesting a Permanent Physical Education Exemption have opted in with parent/guardian approval. Written consent is maintained in the student's cumulative record and in the District's recognized student information system. Exemptions do not reduce the minimum instructional minutes otherwise required of the student, and elective Physical Education opportunities remain available during the 11th and 12th grade years.

The attached list is FERPA-compliant and includes student identification numbers and exemption type only; all supporting documentation and written consents are maintained in the District's recognized student information system and on file with Business Services.

Parents and students are informed annually of the following:

- Physical Education graduation requirements
- Exemption criteria and requirements
- Continued availability of elective Physical Education opportunities for exempted students

Staff Analysis:

The State Allocation Board has established regulations for the State of California's School Facility Program (SFP), which allows districts to allocate new construction grants to different grade levels than the grants available through SFP eligibility calculations. This creates more flexibility for districts to meet their student housing needs. In order to request new construction grant eligibility determined at different grade levels, the District must adopt a school board resolution that has been discussed at a public hearing at a regularly scheduled board meeting.

Construction funding under the current state building program is allocated through a per-student grant allowance. According to the Districts current new construction eligibility for the 2024/25 year, the District does not have sufficient pupil grants available for the Indian Springs HS performing arts center new construction project submitted in 2022. However, the School Facility Program allows the borrowing of grants from other grade levels as long as the District can show that the grants (which represent unhoused students) being borrowed are being housed. As the Districts maximum contractual classroom loading standards exceed the States classroom loading standards, the District will be able to house the students that these grants would have housed. Therefore, in order to maximize funding for this new construction project, the new construction funding application must borrow pupil grants from the K-6 grade level, in an amount which does not exceed the total capacity of the project, as allowed under School Facility Program regulation section 1859.77.3(b).

Approval of this resolution will allow staff to file and finalize the previously filed state building program application for this new construction project.
