WHEREAS, following retirement, Dr. Hill continued her service as an assistant superintendent with the San Bernardino County Superintendent of Schools until 2012, and authored two books, *Its All About the Children* and *From Sharecropping to Non-Stopping*; and

WHEREAS in December 2011, Dr. Hill became a San Bernardino City Unified School District Board Member, where she remained until 2021; and

WHEREAS, she dedicated her life to community service through numerous organizations, including Kiwanis of Greater San Bernardino, Time for Change Foundation, and the San Bernardino Black Culture Foundation, among many others; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Hill received countless honors recognizing her leadership and lifelong commitment to education and equity, and in 2019 the District named its remodeled boardroom the Dr. Margaret Hill Community Room; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Hill passed away on December 19, 2021, leaving behind a legacy of compassion, service, and advocacy for all children. She will be forever missed by her family, colleagues, and the countless lives she touched.

(S) A stipulated expulsion is a process whereby the pupil and his/her family acknowledge responsibility for the behavior leading to the recommendation for expulsion by the school administration and waive their right to a hearing by admitting to the facts in support of an expulsion recommendation. The pupil and his/her family stipulate the facts of the case as presented by the school, accepting one of the following consequences: *(S) suspended expulsion, **(S) expulsion one semester, suspended expulsion one semester, (S) expulsion two semesters.

(YC) Youth Court is a SBCUSD program for youth who have committed education code violations 48900 or 48915 offenses (excluding mandatory offenses) for which they could be given an expulsion but are instead given the option of appearing before a jury of their peers to explore the factors contributing to the education code violation(s) ensuring that students understand who were impacted by their actions, and what needs to be done to repair the harm caused by their actions as well as to address other contributing factors that led to the decisions made.

Staff Analysis:

Bid No. 26-08 Requirements Contract for Drinking Fountain Replacement at Various School Sites Districtwide. The Bid was advertised on September 19 and 26, 2025 with OpenGov Procurement, the San Bernardino Sun, El Chicano, Black Voice, and emailed to SB Chamber of Commerce. This bid is for the replacement of

drinking fountains at various school sites. The Bid was publicly opened on October 10, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. The District received Eleven (11) responsive bids: Acco Engineered Services, Riverside, CA, EMH Construction LLC, Riverside, CA, Epsilon Engineering Inc. Moreno Valley, CA, Fischer Inc, San Bernardino, CA, Harbor Coating and Restoration, Orange, CA, J & A Engineering Corp. dba J&A Fence, Azusa, CA, New Millennium Construction Services, inc., Chino Hills, CA, No Limit Construction, Hesperia, CA, Perfection Painting Corp, Santa Clarita, CA, Plyco Corp., Jurupa Valley, CA, Royal Construction Group Inc. Upland, CA;and four (4) "No Bid" responses.

The District recommends awarding Bid No. 26-08 to Royal Refrigeration and Contractors Inc. dba RCG Roy Construction Group, Upland, CA, as the most responsive, responsible bidder meeting District specifications.
