### Initial Fees for New Students

- A non-refundable Application Fee is payable at the time of application and required for consideration of each application. Applications will remain valid for a two-year period from the date of submission.
- A non-refundable Registration Fee and Capital Contribution Fee are charged to all new students regardless of when they enter during the school year. The Registration Fee finalizes a student's enrollment at CA and reserves their space in the grade level. The Capital Contribution Fee supports the ongoing maintenance, renewal, and replacement of campus facilities.
- The Registration Fee and the Capital Contribution Fee are payable within 30 days of the date of the letter of acceptance, or before the student's first day at school, whichever is earlier.
- Students who leave CA for twelve months or more are required to pay the Registration Fee upon re-enrolling. The Capital Contribution Fee is not payable in this circumstance.

### Annual Fees

- The Building & Development Fee is charged annually to all students who attend CA. In conjunction with the Capital Contribution Fee described above, proceeds of this fee are directed to the ongoing maintenance, renewal, and replacement of campus facilities.
- The Building & Development Fee is not prorated for families joining CA during the school year or withdrawing before the end of the school year.
- The Building & Development Fee is fully refundable only to families who withdraw from CA according to the following schedule. Withdrawal requires completion of the school's withdrawal form, accessible via the QR code below.
  - Students entering in Semester One: Withdrawal on or before July 1, 2026.
  - Students entering in Semester Two: Withdrawal on or before December 1, 2026.



### Tuition Fees

- Tuition Fees are annual fees charged to all students who are enrolled at the school.
- Tuition Fees will be prorated as follows for students enrolling during the school year:

- Tuition Fees are refundable only to families who withdraw from CA according to the following schedule. Withdrawal requires completion of the school's withdrawal form, accessible via the QR code above.

### School Bus

- The school offers a transportation service for students living in areas serviced by the three school buses. The school does not offer transportation to those living in other areas.

- The fees listed above are for a year-long commitment to the bus program. Year-long riders will receive 10 complimentary daily tickets for use by friends. Daily tickets are otherwise available for purchase from the Operations Office for occasional bus riders at a cost of ¥ 1,200 per ticket.
- Daily tickets may only be used depending on availability of spaces on the bus. Priority will be given to year-long riders.
- The payment schedule and pro-rating of fees for families arriving and/or departing during the school year is in line with those noted elsewhere in this document for tuition fees.

### Boarding Program

- The school offers a boarding program for students in Grades 9 to 12 with an annual fee of ¥ 3,500,000, payable in addition to the tuition fee.
- The boarding fee is inclusive of the student's participation in the school's Residential Life Program, inclusive of all induction, team-building, and cultural activities offered during term time, as well as all meals during term time.

- Alternate activities organized by the school during the weeks of Fall and Spring break will carry an additional cost.
- Students entering the boarding program at any point in Semester One are charged the boarding fee in full. Students entering the boarding program at any point in Semester Two are charged 50% of the full boarding fee.
- CA recruits students for the boarding program from around the world, with long lead times required for the obtention of student visas. The boarding program is a year-long commitment and the fee for the boarding program is non-refundable to families withdrawing from CA during the school year.
- A deposit of ¥ 500,000 is charged to all new students entering the boarding program to reserve their space in the program, payable within 30 days of the letter of acceptance, or before the student's first day of school, whichever is earlier.
- Existing students intending to return to CA in the following school year are charged a deposit of ¥ 500,000 to reserve their space in the boarding program, payable within 30 days of the date of the intentions form circulated by the Admissions Office.
- In both cases, the deposit is applied directly to the boarding fees, which are invoiced according to the schedule outlined elsewhere in this document. In the event that a family withdraws from the school after payment of the deposit, the deposit becomes non-refundable in principle.
- New students are also charged a security deposit of ¥ 50,000, which is held by the school to offset the cost of potential damages or outstanding charges while the student is enrolled at CA. This amount is refunded to the family, net of any deductions, upon the student's departure from the school.
- In cases where CA is sponsoring the student's visa to enter and study in Japan in order to attend the school, the student is required to live in the dormitory for the duration of their enrollment at Canadian Academy.

### **Student Support Services**

#### *English as an Additional Language (EAL)*

- At the time of application, for students entering Grade 1 or above, the school will reach a determination as to whether the student requires EAL services. This determination is reached at the sole discretion of the school and is a condition of enrollment.
- The school does not charge additional fees for EAL services.

#### *Tiered Learning Support Model*

- Any student who in the determination of the school requires significant one-on-one learning support from a Learning Support teacher and/or assistant will be assessed a fee of up to ¥ 3,500,000 for participation in the Learning Support program.
- This determination can be made during the enrollment process or at any point during the student's tenure. In specific circumstances, upon review of the application made to the school, a student's acceptance to CA will be contingent on enrollment into the program.
- The fee for participation in the Learning Support program may be pro-rated depending on the school's assessment of the student's level of need.
- The Learning Support fee helps to subsidize the staffing costs associated with the Learning Support program, and is in addition to the standard tuition fee.
- The family will be invited to participate in discussion regarding the need for a student's ongoing participation in the program in advance of each new school year. However, the final decision regarding program participation remains at the sole discretion of the school.

### **Government Scholarships and Subsidies**

- CA participates in several tuition support programs, including the national government's High School Tuition Support Fund (*shugaku shien-kin*), and two programs available through Hyogo Prefecture: the Grants for Supplemental Scholarship (*shogaku kyufu-kin*), and the High School Tuition Reduction Support (*jyugyoryo keigen hojokin*) program.
- Households must meet certain income requirements to be eligible for these grants.
- Families with students in Grades 10-12 wishing for additional information regarding any of these programs are invited to contact the Finance Team.

**Payment of Fees**

- School fees for new families are due in full within 30 days of invoicing or before the new student's first day at school, whichever is earlier.
- The Admissions Office contacts families in January to invite them to re-enroll their children for the following school year. A re-enrollment deposit of ¥ 300,000 per student is required to confirm their space, payable by February 27, 2026.
- The re-enrollment deposit is applied directly to the following year's school fees for returning families, which are due in full by July 1. In the event that a family withdraws from the school after payment of the re-enrollment deposit, the deposit becomes non-refundable in principle.
- Returning families paying privately for school fees may request to pay in six monthly installments from July to December 2026. This arrangement carries a service charge of ¥ 25,000 per student. Interested families are invited to contact the Finance Team before the May 31 preceding the start of the school year.
- Corporations sponsoring school fees are required to pay in full by the due date.
- Any amount owing to the school for greater than 30 days will attract a penalty charge of ¥ 5,000 per week.
- The school reserves the right to withhold or terminate access to school of a student whose family has an outstanding amount owing to the school. This may also include withholding report cards, transcripts, references, or diplomas, or refusing access to campus, participation in examinations, field trips, activities, or other school events.
- Any matter pertaining to outstanding financial amounts will be referred by the school to legal counsel for further action.
- The school reserves the right at any time to refuse enrollment and/or expel any student who, in the sole and indisputable opinion of the school, is an unsatisfactory member of the CA community.

**School Bank Details**

- The school accepts payment of fees via bank transfer only. Payments can be made online or at any branch of MUFG Bank, Ltd. using the details listed on the invoice.
- Each CA family is assigned an individual bank account code at the time of admission, which remains the account to use for payment of fees for the duration of the family's enrollment at the school.
- All bank transfer fees are the responsibility of the payor.

**Miscellaneous**

- CA does not operate a program for two-year-old children on campus. The school recommends the Peter Pan International Pre-School which operates an English-language program on Rokko Island. Interested families should contact the Admissions Office for further information.
- The school's food services provider is Cezar's Kitchen. All students will be assigned a Cezar's Kitchen account during their enrollment at CA. Families are responsible for topping up their children's accounts throughout the year. Cezar's Kitchen manages account balances directly without the school's involvement.
- Families are advised that, in order to facilitate student sign-up to the service, CA will provide basic demographic information to Cezar's Kitchen on an annual basis, and Cezar's Kitchen will create accounts on their platform using this information.
- The school's after school activities and extra-curricular programs may carry additional costs depending on the number and nature of activities selected. Further details are communicated to families via the Activities Office and are shared during enrollment.
- In the case of corporations meeting the criteria of (i) having three or more employee children enrolled at Canadian Academy, and (ii) not participating in the Corporate Contribution Plan or engaged as Long-Term Strategic Partners of the school, a separate schedule of fees applies and is accessible via the school website.
