2025-2026 FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

What are the school hours?

School begins at 8:00 am; doors open for students at 7:40 am.

What can my child wear to school?

How much are school lunches?

For the 2025-2026 school year, the Clark County School District (CCSD) will be providing free school meals to all children 2-18 years of age. Visit www.ccsd.nutrislice.com for menu information.

When can we purchase PE uniforms?

The cost of PE uniforms are as follows: Set \$40; shirt or shorts \$20 each. We accept cash or money orders. PE clothes will be distributed when the student presents their receipt to the PE teacher.

When can we pay elective class fees if it applies to my student?

Elective fees will be payable in the main office with our baker during the first two weeks of school. We accept cash or money orders.

What are visitation procedures?

Please check in with the front office when visiting the school for any reason. If you wish to visit a classroom or observe, please know that we ask for 24 hours notice. You must have a valid ID available to obtain information about your child. Also, we are unable to get messages to students when they are in school.

Will there be a late activity bus?

We will have a late activity bus, Monday through Thursday. Pick up time is 4:00 pm. Please ask your child to listen to the morning announcements for late bus information.

Where do I drop my child off?

The doors that will be open for student to enter are located on Quadrell Street and Conough Street. Parking lots are closed to vehicles from 7:10 am – 8:25 am and 2:00 pm – 2:45 pm daily. These closures are in place to facilitate student safety during arrival and dismissal of school. Your assistance in this safety procedure is greatly appreciated. Exceptions will be made for children with a physical limitation.

What happens if my student's phone is confiscated?

Students who have their phone confiscated will be assigned an after-school detention. The first time a student's phone is confiscated, it will be returned to the student at the end of the school day. Any subsequent confiscations will require the parent to pick up the phone.
