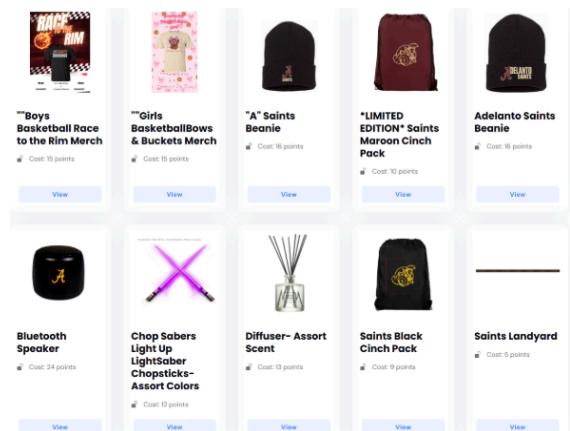
## NATIONAL DAY CELEBRATIONS
