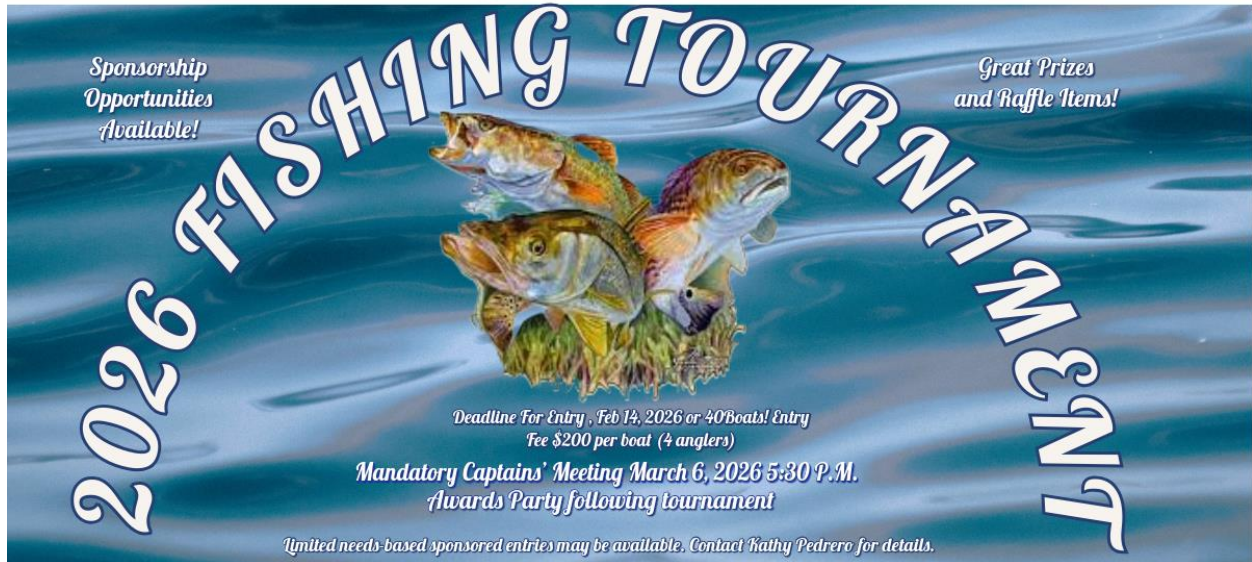

Only the team leader will need to complete the registration links below. Both steps must be complete in order to secure your spot.

Step One:

- **On your mobile device**, go to <https://www.fishdonkey.com/app> and download the app. Android and IOS versions available. Only one app per team is necessary. You may share username and password with other devices after you register.
- Tap: Fish in a Tournament
- Join: Jesuit Dads'
- Enter info for your team leader and pay your entry fee

FISHDONKEY TIP SHEET FOR TEAMS

➔ Practice before you get out on the water



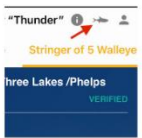
JOIN the tournament called: PRACTICE ENTERING A FISH. Get familiar with the app's camera and video.

➔ What should I do when the event starts?

Open the FD App. Tap on the event title on the home screen. Then 'Leaderboard'

➔ Digital Livewell / No pics on the board?



The fish icon is your Digital Livewell. It will show fish that are waiting to get on the leaderboard. When you return to good reception, simply tap your livewell and leave it open until all fish are RECEIVED.

➔ Stringer / Overall Champ



Each fish should be recorded one at a time, as they are caught. The app will auto-cull for each team. It will toss out smaller fish once stringer capacity is reached.

The Overall Champion column adds your 3 stringers together for a grand total.

➔ Required Documentation

1. Photo of a team member holding the fish
2. Photo of the fish on the measure board



SHARING YOUR TEAM ACCOUNT

If both people on your team would like to help record fish and/or view the leaderboard through the app, the person who registered your team can share their user/pass with other member. Once they share the user/pass, the partner will need to download the app and log in with those credentials.

It is wise to designate one person to record the fish for the entire team to maintain consistency. But not necessary if both feel competent. And it's good to have a back up phone.

To reflect a team name on the leaderboard, tap the profile icon and edit the First/Last name to read your team name(s).

➔ No Internet?

Open the app before you head out. Tap on the name of your tournament. That is all it takes to have the event loaded on your device. Leave the app open. It's ok to let it time out. Just don't log out. Enter fish through the button ENTER A FISH. Open your Digital Livewell when you return.

➔ Hidden Leaderboards

If your director hides the leaderboard, you will not be able to see the results. Continue to enter fish through the button ENTER A FISH. You can check a log of your fish entries in your Digital Livewell (fish icon) until your director unveils the results.

Jesuit Dads' Club Fishing Tourney FAQ's

When is the tourney?

Mandatory Captains' meeting 3/6/26 at 5:30pm, fishing 3/7/26, 6am til 3pm

How much does it cost to register?

\$200 per boat plus small app fee and credit card processing fee

What's included?

Captains' Party, Awards Party, t-shirt for first 40 boats that register

Do I need a boat to participate?

You will need to provide your own boat, gear, bait, etc... We will do our best to match up anglers with boat owners who are able to take guests. There is no guarantee space will be available.

When is the deadline to register?

Feb 14, 2026. We may be able to accept registrations after that date, but we cannot guarantee a shirt for late registrants.

How do I register?

Via the 2 step process outlined above.

When is the deadline for sponsors?

In order to be able to include your logo on the shirt, you must commit by 1/30/2026

How many anglers participate?

In 2025, there were 185 registered anglers on 40 plus boats!

What happens at the captains' meeting?

At least one representative from each team must attend the captains' meeting to receive the required measuring device and miscellaneous items needed for the tournament. Great raffle prizes can be won. All registered anglers are invited to attend.

What if I'd like to participate, but cannot afford it?

Jesuit Dads' Club Fishing Tournament

Saturday, March 7, 2026

0600-1500 (6am - 3pm)

The Tournament is an event for the casual angler fishing with their team. This event is designed to advance the camaraderie among the Jesuit community and promote awareness of the importance of serving as "Men for Others". The tournament is open to all alumni, current Jesuit students, and our generous sponsors.

Entry Fee

\$200 per boat plus app fee and credit card processing fee.

Entry fee includes a t-shirt for each registered angler, food and drinks at the captains' party and awards party, awards, and a chance at some nice raffle prizes. Registration will be capped to the first 40 boats to register.

Please be aware that entry fee is only for entry into the tournament. You must provide your means to fish on your own. You are welcome to fish on your own boat, hire a captain, or fish from shore. No fishing equipment, boats, bait, etc.... will be provided by the tournament.

Categories and Prizes

This is a team tournament for the largest 2 snook, 2 redfish, 2 trout plus a non-slam category

Team Entries

A team may consist of 2, 3, or 4 anglers. The following categories will be for entries entered by a team of 2-4 anglers.

First Place Overall Team (Tournament Champion)

Most total inches per team of 2-4 anglers of the following: 2 Snook, 2 Redfish, 2 Trout. Must catch at least one of each species to qualify*

The Tournament Champion

The winning team will receive the top prize (TBA)

Second Place Overall Team (Tournament Runner-Up)

Team of 2-4 anglers with the second most total inches of the following: 2 Snook, 2 Redfish, 2 Trout. Must catch at least one of each species to qualify*

Prize (TBA)

Third Place Overall Team (Tournament 2nd Runner-Up)

Team of 2-4 anglers with the third most total inches of the following: 2 Snook, 2 Redfish, 2 Trout. Must catch at least one of each species to qualify*

Prize (TBA)

*The Tournament reserves the right to reduce the qualification if necessary

Largest Non-Slam fish

Award given to the angler/team who catches the biggest single fish (inches) that is not a snook, trout, or redfish.

Prize (TBA)

Largest Snook

Award given to the angler/team who catches the biggest single fish Snook (inches)

Largest Redfish

Award given to the angler/team who catches the biggest single fish Redfish (inches)

Largest Trout

Award given to the angler/team who catches the biggest single fish trout (inches)

Largest Non-Slam fish

Award given to the angler/team who catches the biggest single fish (inches) that is not a snook, trout, or redfish.

Rules

Mandatory Captains Meeting Friday, March 6, 5:30 PM

There will be a raffle for some great items. All registered anglers are welcome to attend the meeting. We will review the rules and answer any questions.

Entered Species

Your entries will be auto culled by the FISHDONKEY app.

Hours, Location, Ethics

Lines in the water at 6am (Honor Start). Lines out at 3pm. Anglers may fish anywhere inside of Tampa Bay including Old Tampa Bay. **Any area West of the Skyway bridge is off limits. This includes Fort Desoto, Tierra Verde, Boca Ciega or intercoastal waters North of those areas.** You may use any bait you choose, but all fish must be caught with the traditional method of a rod and reel combo. No spearing, snagging, or netting fish. If fishing any bridges, you fish may be hooked within the confines of the outermost spans of the Skyway Bridge. This means you may hook your fish under the bridge, however, you must land your fish inside of the bridge.

This will be a photo/release tournament. Each team will receive a measuring device and must record the catch on the FishDonkey app. (More on this below) All fish entered for consideration must be landed and recorded on the app no later than 3pm. Any catches recorded after 3 pm will receive a high five but cannot be considered for prize and award purposes.

Although we encourage releasing your catch, any legal fish may be kept at your discretion. Remember, all FWC Rules shall apply.

In the event of a tie in inches, the team with the most entered species will win. In the event that each team has the same number of species and inches, the team that recorded its first fish the earliest will win.

Awards Party

Immediately following the tournament...location same as Captains' Meeting.

Registration

STEP One:

Each team must download and pay via the Fishdonkey app. If you have more than 4 anglers aboard, they are welcome to fish but please do not enter fish for that angler.

On your mobile device, go to <https://www.fishdonkey.com/app> and download the app. Android and IOS versions available. Only one app per team is necessary. You may share username and password with other devices after you register.

FishDonkey App

The registration and payment for you or your team must be completed using the app. The FishDonkey App will be used to photo document fish and will generate live leaderboards. The team leaderboard category will update throughout the event as fish are submitted. All entries will be considered unofficial until verified.

Measuring & Photo Documenting

- All photos must be taken through the FishDonkey app and measurements must be on a valid measuring board.
- Fish should be recorded immediately, and measurements noted by length.
- All submissions must include at least two photographs: 1) A pic of you holding the fish 2) A pic of the fish on the measuring board **DIRECTLY ABOVE THE FISH!**
- Close the fish's mouth. The nose should touch the bump of the measuring board (the belly is facing you). This photo needs to include the entire fish on the board.
- If the fish tail is touching the graduation line on the board, then that is the exact measurement. If the tail crosses a graduation line, round up ¼".
- **All fish must be submitted immediately as they are caught. Fish may not be stored in your livewell, cooler, etc...**
- All participants must have their fish submitted before the end of the tournament.
- Entries with an open mouth will receive a deduction penalty of 1", as an open mouth can extend the length of the fish.
- Extra-large fish are difficult to measure with a bump board and photographs. Bump the nose of the fish against a vertical surface and use a

commercial measuring tape to measure the fish. Video from nose to tail, covering the complete length of the fish.

FishDonkey in poor reception areas

The app will work without the internet. Open the app before heading out to poorly covered areas. Tap on the name of the tourney. Once you see the button 'Enter a Fish', head out and fish away. Fish should be entered as normal in bad reception areas. Your Digital Livewell® (fish icon) will show you if there are fish waiting for an internet connection to get pushed into the leaderboard. When you get back to a well-connected area, open your Digital Livewell® and leave that screen open/active until all fish are "Received". If your pictures are missing from the leaderboard, this is what you need to do. Until your pictures are received, do not delete, or alter the photos on your phone, as the software will not accept your photos as originals.

Missing pictures on the leaderboard?

Open your Digital Livewell (fish icon) when you get back to an area with good reception. Leave that screen open until all fish are "Received". Never delete anything from your Digital Livewell.

Measuring Boards

Each team should receive a measuring board at the captains' meeting. If you do not receive one for some reason, any measuring devices must be commercially made. You are required to have a board with a 90-degree bend which marks 0, and at least ¼" lines. No handmade measuring boards, stickers, or tape measures allowed. No sliding, retractable, or foldable measuring devices are allowed unless you are submitting an oversized fish. If your measurement is not clearly readable in your submission photo, it may not be accepted, or could be penalized.

Extra-large fish are difficult to measure with a bump board and photographs. Bump the nose of the fish against a vertical surface and use a commercial measuring tape to measure the fish. Video from nose to tail, covering the complete length of the fish.

Tournament Director

Your Tournament Directors is Ryan Harris. If you need to reach your director, their contact info is in the "i" Info icon within your tournament in the app.

The interpretation and enforcement of the rules is at the sole discretion of the committee. The tournament director may change rules or impose sanctions as they deem appropriate, including but not limited to disqualifications, forfeiture of prizes, and prohibition from competing in future tournaments. All decisions made by the tournament director are final.

Sportsmanship

All participants are expected to follow high standards of sportsmanship, courtesy, safety, and conservation. Any participant who displays poor sportsmanship, violates these rules, or brings unfavorable publicity to the sport of fishing or Jesuit High School could be disqualified. Encroachment is considered a sportsmanship rule.

Body of Water

Participants must fish inside of the Skyway Bridge. You may only hook your fish from within the outer spans of the western side of the bridge eastward. This means that you may fish under the bridge. . Anglers may fish anywhere inside of Tampa Bay including Old Tampa Bay. **Any area West of the Skyway bridge (275) is off limits. This includes Fort Desoto, Tierra Verde, Boca Ciega or intercoastal waters North of those areas.**

Inclement Weather/Cancellation

Keep your phones on throughout the tournament in order to receive communication from the director in the event of postponement or cancellation. Due to the nature of tournament fishing, no refunds will be issued. This is at the discretion of your tournament director.

Tiebreakers

In the event of a tie in inches, the team with the most entered species will win. In the event that each team has the same number of species and inches, the team that recorded its first fish the earliest will win.

Claiming Prizes

Ensure that your correct address, email, and mobile number appear in your app profile for prize announcements and delivery. Prizes are the responsibility of the winners. Transportation, taxes, and incidentals are the responsibility of the winner.

It is the responsibility of the tournament director to disburse all prizes.

From our terms and conditions, you have agreed to the following.

As stated above, FishDonkey is not in any way responsible, but if you believe there is a problem with your tournament director or if something seems suspicious such as not paying out the funds or prizes, please contact FishDonkey and let us know ASAP.

Laws and Regulations

All federal, state, and local laws and all fishing and boating rules must be abided by.

Failure to comply with any tournament rules subject's participants to disqualification and removal from the competition, as determined by the tournament officials. The right to refuse sale and/or revoke a competition ticket to anyone is hereby reserved.

Cheating

- All protests must be brought to the director's attention before the end of the event.
- Anyone caught breaking the law or disobeying the rules will be disqualified.
- Fish must be hooked and caught live in a conventional manner. Fish cannot be snagged, netted, speared, etc.
- Participants may be required to take polygraph exams as part of the tournament requirements. If deception is detected or the participant refuses to take the exam, the prize will be forfeited, and the participant will be disqualified. Anglers taking a polygraph examination may be responsible for any and all costs incurred.

Safety

Participants are responsible for their own safety, actions, and property at all times.
