Great College Visit Days for During the School Year

One goal for members of the Class of 2027 is to visit a variety of college campuses between now and January of their junior year so they can articulate to their college counselor what they want in a college by their January junior interview. Then, students may begin targeted visits. The following dates are weekdays when students do not have school, but colleges should be in session, making for great campus visit days:

- End of August (school does not begin until September 3) – many Southern colleges start school in August, so their campuses will be populated with students.
- October 3-5 - Fall Break
- November 21 – No school. Caregiver Conferences with teachers
- December 1 – Monday after Thanksgiving. Teacher In-Service
- January 19 – Martin Luther King, Jr. Day
- February 13-16 – President's Weekend
- **March 20-April 3 – Comment Writing Day / Spring Break / Easter**

Standardized Test Guidance and Dates for 2025-26

Recommended Standardized Testing Timeline

Sophomore year

- In spring of the sophomore year, students take practice ACT and SAT exams to determine their preferred test.
- Some students opt to prep for standardized tests over the summer between their sophomore and junior year; others do so during the academic year.

Junior year

- In October, take the official PSAT or take a practice ACT through Compass Prep.
- Some students opt to prep in the months leading up to their first test.
- Take an official ACT or SAT in the early winter or by April at the latest. Senior year
- Many students retake tests in August, September, and October of their senior year.

Registration for Standardized Tests

- SAT - register at www.collegeboard.org
- ACT - register at www.act.org
- You will need a credit card to register.
- Record your username and password. Never create an additional account if you are having trouble accessing your initial one. See your college counselor for help.
