Tournament Notes & Reminders

Central Challenges

- The schedule shows abbreviated performance challenge levels. They are as follows:
 - EL = Elementary Level
 - SL = Secondary Level
 - ML = Middle Level
 - RS = Rising Stars
- Teams should report to their Challenge Prep Area 20 minutes before their scheduled Presentation time.
 - Above and Beyond (Engineering) teams should report to the Check-In Area at least ONE HOUR before their presentation. The Check-In Appraiser(s) will verify that your team has at least 2 and no more than 10 Structure parts, that there are no more than 10 weights, and that each weight meets the materials requirements and is labeled.
- Spectators will NOT be allowed to enter the Presentation Area once a team's Presentation has begun.
- Do NOT enter closed doors. Entering after a team has started their presentation is very distracting.
- Teams are encouraged to view other teams' solutions throughout the day as a way to celebrate the journey and show good sportsmanship.

Instant Challenges

- Teams should report to the Instant Challenge Check-in 15 minutes before their scheduled Instant Challenge Time. Instant Challenge is located upstairs.
 - Teams are only allowed upstairs when they are checking in for their Instant Challenge.
 - Spectators are NOT allowed for Instant Challenges and should wait downstairs for your team to return.

Pin Trading

- Teams are encouraged to trade pins as a way to meet new friends and show good sportsmanship.
 - Pin trading should only take place in the cafeteria and proper trading etiquette should be followed. Make sure any pin wrappers are disposed of properly.

Rules of Interference

- Parents, spectators, and team managers: Remember to respect the rules of Interference. Do not interfere with the team's solution.

Concessions and Souvenirs

- Concessions and souvenirs will be available for purchase at North Point High School.

Awards

- All teams should report to the gymnasium at 3:15. The Blue Crab DI Awards begin at 3:30. Doors open at 3:00.
 - Rising Star teams will receive their medals during their presentation. Rising Star teams do not need to attend the awards ceremony.

- Talk to teams, parents and volunteers about their experience with this season of Destination Imagination. Tell them you're considering starting a team and ask them to share their favorite thing about DI—you'll be amazed by the different answers you hear.
