



Message from the Superintendent

Dear Lewiston-Porter Community,

Happy New Year and welcome back to 2026! We return for the winter and spring stretch of the school year, proud of our students' accomplishments and excited for what lies ahead. As many have noticed, work tied to our \$11.15 million capital project has paused due to sustained periods of poor weather. All remaining exterior work at Elia Stadium is now temporarily on hold and may not resume until conditions improve in the spring. The solar project included in Phase II bids was opened for solar panel installations on the IEC and Middle School rooftops. We are now working with Solar Liberty, a local Western New York company, on this portion of the project. These bids were highly favorable and, as a result, we will finalize the remaining scope of Phase II and determine how any remaining capital funds may support additional priorities, including Phase III planning, such as replacing the high school parking lot and continuing facility upgrades to enhance the athletic/fans experience at our stadium.

As we enter the second half of the school year, we are also continuing our focus on student well-being and school culture. The new districtwide personal electronic device/cell phone policy has now been implemented across all buildings. By this point, students are expected to have a full understanding of the procedures and expectations at their grade level. The goal of the policy is to reduce distractions during the school day and limit opportunities for harassment and bullying that can occur through technology use. While our first months were focused on education and adjustment, families should be aware that expectations for compliance will be high going forward. Consequences for ongoing violations will become more significant, in alignment with state law and with our shared commitment to student safety. Alongside this policy, anti-bullying education and prevention programming remain active in every building, and families can find reporting tools and supportive resources through the district website.

Finally, we are thrilled to share that our redesigned district website is now live with a brand-new look. This launch marks a major milestone and reflects months of work by our communications and technology team in partnership with O/N BOCES. The new design offers clearer navigation, more accessible information for families, and a modern platform for district announcements, program updates, and school events. Content across all departments and schools is being updated daily as pages transition fully into the new system. We encourage families to explore the site and use it as their first stop for calendars, forms, FAQs, and resources including a reminder that the second semester for students in grades 6-12 begins on January 26. Thank you for your continued support of our students, staff, and schools. We look forward to a strong and successful 2026. One Purpose, Your Pathway, Our Promise.

PEC Celebrates Leader in Me Lighthouse School Certification

Congratulations to the Primary Education Center as they celebrate their recent achievement of being certified as a Leader in Me Lighthouse School by FranklinCovey Education!

The Lighthouse School certification is a highly regarded standard and given to schools who have experienced significant measurable results and having an extraordinary impact on staff, students, parents and the greater community.

The school has been modeling the Leader in Me education teachings to achieve the district's common goal of preparing students with college, career and life readiness skills.

Students and staff gathered to celebrate the remarkable feat in a special ribbon cutting ceremony on September 26, which was led by PEC students on the Lighthouse Leadership Cabinet. They also revealed the theme for the 2025-2026 school year — “Shine Your Light.”



In conjunction with achieving this prestigious certification and this year's “Shine Your Light” theme, students will be keeping track of their good deeds in their portfolios, some of which will be shared during the morning announcements throughout the school year.

The prestigious honor places the PEC among an elite group of fewer than 10% of Leader in Me schools worldwide that have achieved this tremendous accomplishment. Out of the more than 7,000 schools across 70 plus countries that have adopted the Leader in Me model, only about 700 of those schools have achieved the prestigious Lighthouse Certification.

FranklinCovey's Leader in Me is an evidence-based PK-12 model, developed in partnership with educators, designed to build resilience and leadership in students, create a high-trust culture, and help improve academic achievement. It helps students, their families and educators with leadership and life skills needed to thrive, adapt and contribute in a dynamic world.

The PEC will maintain its Lighthouse Certification for two years and will continue to foster its growth and proficiency in exemplifying a leadership culture and principles. At the end of the two years the school will recertify its Lighthouse Certification through a virtual self-assessment, describing and celebrating its growth and accomplishments since its original Lighthouse designation.

An International Visit

In September, Lewiston-Porter welcomed Ambassador CHEN Li, Consul General of the People's Republic of China in New York.

Ambassador Chen was also joined by Education Counselor YU Yougen, Consul LIN Yu, and Consul QIN Qilun as part of an official visit to explore Lewiston-Porter's internationally recognized Chinese language and cultural exchange programs.



During the visit, the delegation toured classrooms, observed Chinese language instruction at both the Intermediate Education Center and Middle School, and met with district leaders to discuss expanded opportunities for student travel and educational collaboration.

"Lewiston-Porter has long embraced a vision of global education, providing our students with opportunities to develop language skills and cultural competencies that prepare them to thrive in an interconnected world," says Paul J. Casseri, Superintendent of Schools. "We are honored to host Ambassador Chen and his delegation as we work to deepen our relationships with Chinese schools and expand exchange programs for our students."

Lewiston-Porter has maintained a long-standing relationship with schools across China, fostering educational, cultural, and people-to-people exchanges for over 20 years through their International Program. That has also included a multi-dimensional program that integrates Chinese language and culture into the very fabric of our school district.

Following the morning program at Lewiston-Porter, Ambassador Chen and the delegation continued to Niagara University (NU) in the afternoon to review existing partnerships between NU and Chinese institutions. Lewiston-Porter's global initiatives are strengthened by a close partnership with Niagara University, which maintains multiple collaborations with Chinese universities.



Regional Rocketry



On Saturday, October 18, two teams of Lew-Port Middle and High School students participated in the Regional Rocketry Challenge, an annual event hosted by Moog Inc. at the National Warplane Museum in Geneseo, NY.



Our Lew-Port teams came home with 3 out of the 5 awards: Best School Spirit, Best Rocket Craftsmanship, and a \$250 gift card for rocketry parts for the Best 2nd Flight.

The event brought together over 100 middle and high school students from nearly a dozen schools to launch their rockets. Participants recorded flight data and performance scores, gaining hands-on experience in engineering and problem-solving.



Lewiston-Porter Students Inducted into National Technical Honor Society

Congratulations to our Lewiston-Porter students from the Niagara Career and Technical Education Center, who were recently inducted into the National Technical Honor Society. Out of all the high school students in the United States, the National Technical Honor Society students who receive this honor comprise 1.6 percent of that population. For staff at the Orleans/BOCES centers, they represent the four pillars of the National Technical Honor Society: scholarship, leadership, service and character.

The students were honored in front of their teachers, families and school district representatives. The students had to maintain an 89.5 grade average in their career and technical education programs and an 84.5 average at their high schools, have superior attendance, exemplary behavior, be a member in good standing with SkillsUSA and have a recommendation from a faculty member.

Senior is First-Ever Student Member of the School Board

Senior Kaitlyn Szarejko has always been an active student in her school community throughout her time at Lewiston-Porter Schools.

This year, Kaitlyn is the President of the High School Lancer Student Council, a member of the volleyball and track teams, Spanish Club, Key Club and takes photos for the yearbook.

All of those experiences have served her well as she takes on a new role as Lew-Port's first ever Student Ex-Officio Member of the School Board.

"I think that with all of the extra-curricular activities that I do it kind of gives me a good range of people, peers and faculty that I know. It gives me a broader sense of what people want in school, or what we like and what we don't like," she says.

Recently passed New York State law that mandates all school districts appoint at least one ex-officio, non-voting student member to their boards of education.

In her role, Kaitlyn has the opportunity to be a voice for the student body on the School Board and sees herself as the link between the board and her fellow students.

"I really just want to kind of make it a more transparent transition from the students to the board, and kind of give everyone that clear view from both sides, and just help the students feel like they're being heard," she says.

Every month, Kaitlyn and the other members of the Lancer Council will meet to discuss things that have been going well, what students are enjoying in school, concerns that they might have and so we brainstorm together as a group. She will then implement those into the presentation she gives to the School Board during their meetings.

"Kaitlyn represents the very best of Lewiston-Porter — she is thoughtful, engaged and deeply committed to elevating the student voice," says Superintendent of Schools Paul J. Casseri. "As our first-ever Student Ex-Officio Board Member, she is helping to build a stronger bridge between students and the Board of Education. Her leadership, integrity, and desire to serve will not only benefit our district today, but will set a standard for all who follow."

Junior Zoe Droegmyer, who is Vice President of Lancer Council currently serves as an alternate Student Ex-Officio and will succeed Kaitlyn next year.

Ultimately, Kaitlyn hopes serving as the Student Ex-Officio will give her good experiences to prepare her for the future.

"This is kind of like a good stemming point to kind of work on these leadership skills and public speaking skills, and kind of use those when I get to college, to kind of branch myself out and put myself in new positions."
