#### **New Year Reminder to Keep School Areas Smoke-Free**

As 2026 begins, this is a time to refocus on the small choices that help keep our children and community safe. School campuses are places kids move through constantly — not just during the school day, but before and after school, during practices and weekend activities. Because students are always coming and going, what happens in the areas around campus matters.

Health experts agree there is no safe level of exposure to secondhand smoke for children. Even brief exposure can affect kids, especially those with asthma or sensitive airways. It is critical to remember that smoke does not always stay where it starts and can drift through entrances, sidewalks and gathering areas as children pass by.

To support student health, the City of Cypress reminds parents, caregivers, and visitors not to smoke or vape on or near school campuses at any time.
