Teacher Qualifications

In the event, that your child is taught for 20 days or more by a non - highly qualified teacher you will receive the teacher's status in writing.



All parents have the right to request the following:

- A teacher's professional qualifications, licensure, grade(s) certification, and waivers
- A teacher's baccalaureate and/or graduate degree, fields of endorsement, and previous teaching experience
- A paraprofessional's qualifications
- An assurance that their child's name, address, and telephone listing not be released to military recruiters.

Parents Rights To Know



All parents will receive information on the following:

- Their child's level of achievement on each of the Tennessee academic assessments
- Their option to request a transfer to another school within the district if their child is the victim of a violent crime at school
- Their right to timely notification that their child has been assigned, or has been taught for four or more consecutive weeks by a teacher who does not meet the required licensing and endorsement of the subject being taught


