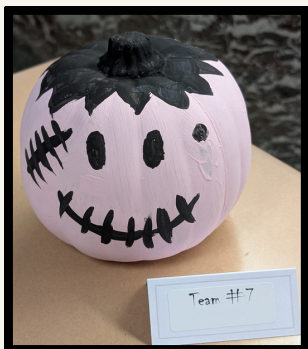
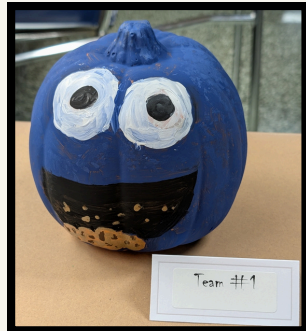
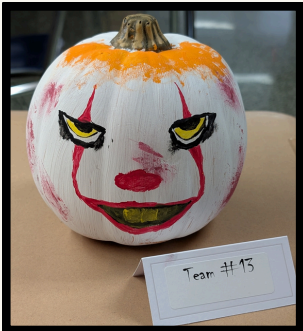
## Pumpkin Decorating Contest

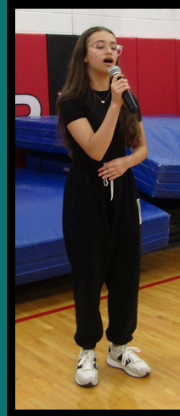

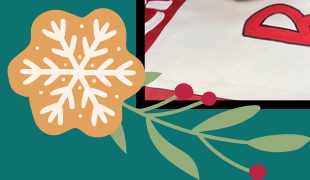
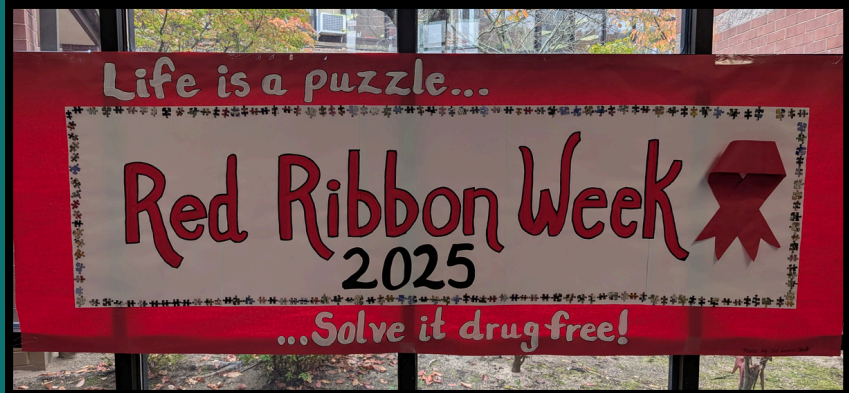

# History of Minecraft

Minecraft was originally created in 2009 by Mojang Studios, but it was not released until November 18, 2010. The game is now 15 years old and has had many updates like the Caves and Cliffs update. The original creator of the game was Markus "Notch" Persson but Mojang was then handed down to Jens "Jeb" Bergensten following the release of Minecraft. The game was originally going to be called Cave Game but changed to Minecraft: Order of the Stone before being changed to Minecraft. There have been plenty of versions of Minecraft for different devices (for example: Bedrock, Java, Pocket, Pi, Earth, Edu, Alpha, Classic, etc) and there are countless mods and add-ons for Minecraft.

We'll start our journey through the history of Minecraft sometime in May 2009 when Notch started work on the initial version of Minecraft called "Cave Game." On May 17, 2009, Notch released the first public alpha version to an independent game developer forum TIGSource. In 2010 he officially changed the name to Minecraft. However, on July 31, 2010 the infamous creepypasta character Herobrine was first spotted. Since then, the patch notes for later Minecraft updates have stated "Removed Herobrine," but many players still "see" Herobrine. Since then, the game's development continued for over two years before the official full release on November 18, 2011.

In 2012, the "Pretty Scary Update" (1.4), was released, which included Withers, Anvils, and Bats. Then in 2014 Microsoft bought Mojang (pronounced like the English version Moe-jang or the Swedish version Moe-yang), the company that Notch created, for \$2.5 billion. In 2017 the "World of Color Update" (1.12) introduced more colored blocks and Parrots. Then the 2019 "Village & Pillage Update" (1.14) introduced Pillagers, Foxes, Pandas, and other content to the game. On June 17, 2025, the "Chase the Skies Update" (1.21.6) added the Happy Ghast, the Player Locator Bar, etc. Last but not least, the most recent update came out December 9, 2025 called the "Mounts of Mayhem" (1.21.11) which will add the Nautilus, the Spear, and other items. There are many more updates, too many to mention.

The nautilus, one of the new mobs was added to Minecraft on December 9, 2025.





## History of Minecraft (cont'd)

There have been many cool things in Minecraft, such as the Starting House which was an old feature in an Infdev (Infinite Development) version of Minecraft made of Mossy Cobblestone that the player spawned in. (Mossy Cobblestone was not found naturally in the Infdev version of Minecraft.) There were chests in the house which stored 99 blocks per stack of blocks but was later changed to 100 before being changed to a wooden house with no chests. It was later removed from the game. Another cool thing that happens in Minecraft is that every April 1st there is a fake update or fake thing for Minecraft, like the Craftmine "Update." The Craftmine "Update" was where the player uses the Mine Crafter to craft randomly generated levels, or "Mines," that the player had to complete. However, sometimes, the "Updates" are made into real mods or add-ons. The Craftmine "Update" is one of those.

There are also cool little easter eggs. For example, the "Jeb\_" rainbow sheep nametag trick or the "Dinnerbone" upside down mobs name tag trick. Try the easter eggs yourself!

That's all about the history of Minecraft. Happy Building!

### TRY IT NOW

There is a cool Minecraft easter egg on Google. All you have to do is search "Minecraft" and there will be a Minecraft block at the bottom. Tap it and you can mine the search results, revealing randomly generated Minecraft biomes with breakable blocks. There is a block counter at the bottom of the screen that counts every block you break.



The four main name tag easter eggs are "Dinnerbone," "Jeb\_," "Toast," and "Johnny."

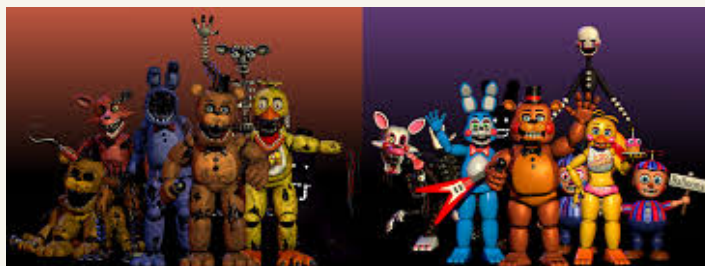


Five Nights At Freddy's (FNaF) is a game series with more lore than game. It is a survival horror game developed by Scott Cawthon. He was inspired by feedback he received from another game he created called Chipper & Sons Lumber Co. Someone gave him a bad reputation by saying the characters in that game were like scary animatronic animals. In FNaF, you play a security guard at Freddy's Fazbear's Pizza. You need to survive from midnight to 6 am for five shifts, also known as "nights". The animatronics are trying to get you. Here is a description of each game.

**FNaF 1:** You have limited power, two heavy doors, lights, and cameras which all cost power. You fight against 4 new animatronics and 1 old one which all have a child's soul in them, based on "the bite of '83". Bonnie will appear at your left door and Chica on your right. You must close their door so they don't kill you. You must watch Foxy's Cove in order to stop him. When he is not there, close your left door until you hear him bang on your door, Freddy will only appear in the dining room on the cameras. If he's not there after a laugh, close your right door or he will disable it.



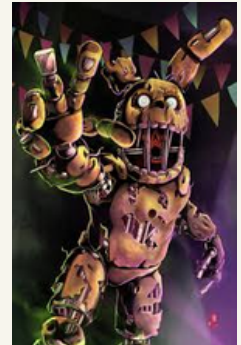
**FNaF 2:** You have unlimited power and one flashlight. You're probably wondering "how would I survive?" and I will tell you. Of 6 new animatronics called "the toys," the Freddy mask should deal with 4 of them. Balloon Boy isn't evil, but he will disable your flashlight. The old gang has been withered. The Freddy mask should work on them but not Foxy. You'll need to flash a light on him. The puppet can't be stopped unless you wind up the music box.

**FNaF 3:** You are William's older son going against William after the "springlock failure" which has been used for the company's horror attraction. Nothing will happen on the first night. To lure him away, you must play a sound to a camera. The rest only mess with O2, cameras and audio.



**FNaF 4:** This is the SCARIEST game of the series. Unlike the rest, it takes place in a bedroom right before the "bite of '83" with no cameras and you a child. Nightmare Freddy's children will appear on the bed - flash him before Nightmare Freddy comes. Nightmare Foxy will appear in your closet - close the closet until he leaves. Nightmare Bonnie and Chica appear in the hallways - listen for breathing. If there's no breathing, close your door. Otherwise, flash your light all you want. Listen closely for his footsteps. Do not shine the light on him if you hear footsteps from Nightmare Fredbear in the hall, just listen.

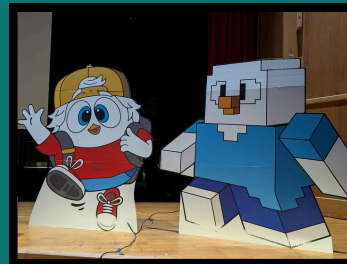
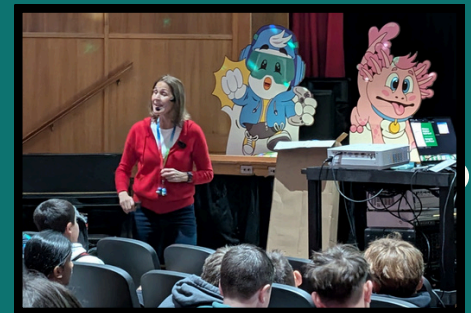
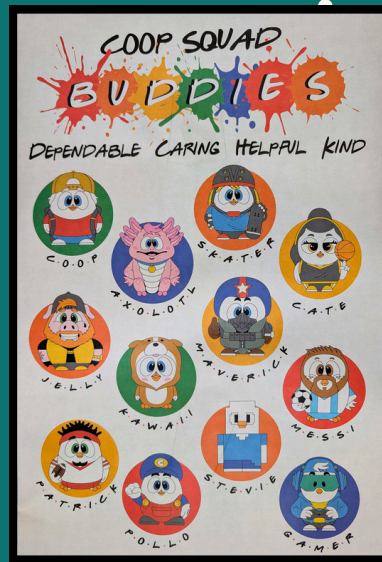
# Coops Fundraiser
