
5TH GRADE STEM PRESENTATION

CELEBRATING HOLIDAYS AROUND THE WORLD

The holidays gave Nashport kindergarten classrooms a wonderful opportunity to explore the world beyond their own communities. "Holidays Around the World" activities focused on simple traditions, symbols, music, and stories. Teachers introduced countries using globes or maps, helping children locate places while learning that people everywhere celebrate in unique ways. Through storytelling, crafts, songs, and food-related activities, students experienced how traditions can be both different and similar.

Hands-on activities are at the heart of kindergarten learning. Teachers set up holiday stations with crafts, flags, traditional colors, and music from each country. Singing holiday songs from around the world, reading multicultural picture books, and creating a "passport" activity where children collect stamps for each country helps make learning interactive and exciting.

Celebrating holidays around the world in kindergarten classrooms is an early lesson in global citizenship. Through play, creativity, and storytelling, young learners discovered that while traditions may look different, the spirit of love, giving, and community is shared across cultures.



CHRISTMAS MATH CHAIN

Adamsville Elementary fourth graders began calculating long division problems. To add a little festive cheer to the task, students have solved a long division problem on a strip of paper and checked their work with multiplication. When the numbers matched, students attached their paper strip to a colorful Christmas chain. The Columbus Zoo educators shared fascinating facts, encouraged thoughtful questions, and helped students understand the importance of caring for animals and the environment. Students were especially excited to learn about Sunny the sloth. The zoo educators taught interesting facts about sloths, including how they move very slowly, spend most of their time in trees, and sleep for many hours each day. Students also learned about the sloth's habitat and how its slow movements help it stay safe in the wild. Seeing and learning about a sloth up close made the experience memorable and helped students better understand how unique animals survive in their environments. This visit was a memorable experience for our students! We are grateful to the Columbus Zoo and Aquarium for taking the time to visit Nashport and inspire curiosity and learning.
