

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

Q: Can I volunteer for a few days? If I am hired, do I have to stay all summer?

A: We are unable to accept volunteers over the summer season. Because training and team cohesion are essential, full-season commitment is expected for staff, though rare exceptions may be made. Staff receive a break week over the 4th of July. Tatiyee can also sign off for experience hours for employees & can serve as paid internships if applicable.

Q: Are there any qualifications?

A: Have a growth mindset, and be ready to learn. In our training you will become certified in CPR, First Aid, and Prevention & Support. As well as workshops to learn ASL, & community inclusion.



Q: What Programs are offered through Tatiyee?

A: Camp Tatiyee has a focus on thinking about the “how not if” mentality regarding inclusion & accommodations. We work to create memorable activities for all campers. Program include but at not limited to: off-road go-karting, archery, kayaking, physical arts, STEAM, recreation/sports, performing arts, culinary, field trips, escape rooms, campfires, dances, waterslides, & so much more!

Q: What types of campers come to camp?

A: Each week of camp has a new set of campers with different needs and ages. The weeks are broken up by types of disability and by age. Some examples of disabilities you may see our campers have would be, spina bifida, muscular dystrophy, down syndrome, autism, cerebral palsey, traumatic brain injuries, amputees, visual impairments, hearing impairments epilepsy, learning disabilities, or a mixture of disabilities.
