Memorial High School (MHS) is a comprehensive public high school (grades 9-12) offering a rigorous college preparatory program that supports excellence in academics and pride in performance. Our community is primarily composed of professional and business families who hold high expectations for academic excellence.

MHS consistently earns distinctions from the Texas Education Agency and is regularly included in recognitions such as Best High Schools in Area, Children at Risk; College Readiness Award, Texas ACT Council; America's Best High Schools, U.S. News and World Report; America's Most Challenging High Schools, Washington Post; and, Best Public High Schools, Niche.

Weighted grade points are awarded for only one course per year, grades 9-12, in each of the four core curricular areas (English, math, science, social studies). GPA is determined by dividing the total grade points by the number of courses attempted. Courses not included in the calculation of GPA include those taken as correspondence/online, credit by examination and those taken in summer school and middle school. An expanded grading scale includes Special Education. Spring Branch ISD reports class rank outside the top 10% only for those students who make a formal request to have it included on their transcript.
