Dual Enrollment

- Opportunity for students to earn credit hours toward certificate, degree or diploma while meeting high school graduation requirements



Benefits of Dual Enrollment

- Benefits

- Increases exposure to college-level classes while still in high school
- Take classes that may not be offered in high school
- Build confidence and allows students with specific goals (academic or career) greater flexibility to attain those goals.
- In most cases, required standard tuition, mandatory fees and required book expenses are covered
- Reduced costs to the student and/or families: covers tuition, mandatory fees, and required textbooks (professor recommended book may not be covered)
- DE Core courses meet the Academic Rigor requirements for HOPE
- Students receive both high school and post-secondary credit at the same time

Eligibility

Summer 2020 and Beyond

- **9th Grade- Ineligible**
- **10th Grade**
 - May enroll in Career, Technical and Agricultural Education (CTAE) courses at a participating TCSG institution only
 - High Achievers- SAT score of 1200 or an ACT score of 26, prior to the summer 2020, may enroll in any approved Dual Enrollment courses at a TCSG, USG or private eligible participating postsecondary institution.
- **11th & 12th Grade**
 - Must meet post-secondary admission requirements to take any approved Dual Enrollment courses at an eligible USG, TCSG or private institution until they reach their capped number of hours.

Funding Cap

- Effective Summer term 2020 and beyond
 - **All first-time DE students have a Funding Cap of 30 semester** or 45 quarter hours
 - 3 credit hour classes X 10 college classes
- Maximum of 15 semester/12 quarter hours per term regardless of number of institutions enrolled
- Student who have reached the DE funding cap may be eligible for HOPE Grant and HOPE Career Grant Programs at TCSG institutions

Dual Enrollment Awards

- DE Awards
 - Tuition, mandatory fees and required books
 - Paid directly to Georgia Finance Commission
- Expenses Not Covered by Dual Enrollment
 - Lost or damaged book fees
 - Course-related fees and supplies for a particular course or optional fees
 - Courses not on the approved Dual Enrollment course list
- Satisfactory academic progress (SAP) at the college is required to continue participation in DE

When are you required to Self-Pay

- ▶ The term in which the student reaches the Funding Cap, the Eligible Postsecondary Institution may charge Tuition and a prorated portion of the Mandatory Fees and book costs, based on credit hours not covered by Dual Enrollment funding.
- ▶ The Eligible Postsecondary Institution may charge for courses that do not appear on the approved course directory but which the student chooses to enroll: 11th & 12th grade only
- ▶ A student is ineligible to receive Dual Enrollment funding payment, for courses not specific to his or her grade level eligibility.
- ▶ Effective Summer term 2020 (FY2021) and beyond, a student is ineligible to receive Dual Enrollment funding to repeat or retake a course.
- ▶ If a student officially or unofficially withdraws or drops out prior to the postsecondary institutions' drop/add period, he or she is ineligible to receive Dual Enrollment program funding payment for that school term. Students that drop out during the drop/add period are subject to the provisions in accordance with *Section 1612 (See 2020-2021 DE Regulations)*.
- ▶ Student becomes ineligible to continue receiving Dual Enrollment program funding after his or her second (2nd) course withdrawal from an approved Dual Enrollment course(s), occurring Summer term 2020 or later, regardless of the total Paid Hours or Funding Cap calculation.

Withdrawal & Retake Policies

- Students may not receive funding for the same DE course twice. DE courses (passed/ failed/withdrawn) cannot be retaken and receive funding.
- Grades of W, WD or WF (withdrawal from a course) given at the college will equate to a “F” on the high school transcript.
- Students becomes ineligible to continue to receive funding from the program after their 2nd withdrawal.
- Students who wish to retake a course or continue participating after 2 withdrawals may request an Extenuating Circumstance Exception.

Eligibility vs Readiness

Eligibility versus Readiness

Points to consider:

- Student's *maturity* level
- Academic *rigor* of classes
- Choosing a class with a certain *major* in mind
- *Initiative* in college classes vs high school

Students need to be Eligible and Ready!

Looking Beyond GPA...

Let's assess the student's readiness...

- Disorganized
- Perfectionist
- Easily Overwhelmed
- Unassertive/Unwilling to ask for help
- Procrastinator
- Unable to work independently (navigating the process/coursework)

GRCCA Students:

2. Apply to the college
3. Complete funding application in gafutures.org
4. Meet with your school counselor
 - a. Join DE Remind Group
5. School counselor will send necessary documents to DE Contact

• Who can participate?

- High School Juniors and Seniors
- Sophomores who meet SAT/ACT testing scores
 - SAT must meet 1200
 - ACT must have a composite score of a 26

• What are the requirements?

- The student must be on track for graduation
- A High School Academic GPA of 3.0 for sophomores and 3.0 for juniors/seniors
