What they do

Battalion Commander (BC)

The JROTC Battalion Commander (BC) is the highest-ranking cadet responsible for the overall success, training, discipline, and morale of the entire battalion. They set the standard for behavior and appearance, command formations, and coordinate with instructors to execute all unit events.

Battalion Executive Officer (XO)

The JROTC Battalion Executive Officer (XO) serves as the second-in-command and the Chief of Staff for the cadet battalion. Their primary role is to manage the daily operations of the staff to allow the Battalion Commander (BC) to focus on leadership, planning, and high-level decisions.

Battalion Command Sergeant Major (CSM)

The JROTC Battalion Command Sergeant Major (CSM) is the senior enlisted cadet, acting as the primary advisor to the Battalion Commander on morale, discipline, and training. They supervise NCOs, manage enlisted personnel, ensure proper drill and ceremony, and maintain high standards for uniforms and training throughout the battalion.

Adjutant (S1)

The JROTC Adjutant (S1) is the battalion staff officer responsible for all human resources, personnel records, and administrative actions. Key duties include maintaining the JUMS database (cadet data, promotions, awards, demerits), managing unit rosters, and supporting the Command Staff with administrative tasks.

Security Officer (S2)

The JROTC Security Officer (S2) is responsible for the protection, inventory, and accountability of all sensitive battalion property, including weapons, air rifles, and equipment. They conduct regular inspections to ensure security, manage risk assessments for events, and may handle intel like weather updates for training.

Training Officer (S3)

The JROTC Training Officer (S3) is responsible for planning, coordinating, and supervising all training activities and operations for the cadet battalion. They are the main staff officer in charge of creating the training schedule and ensuring the battalion is ready for events.

Logistics Officer (S4)

The JROTC Logistics Officer (S4) manages all battalion supplies, equipment, and uniforms, ensuring cadets have necessary gear for events. Key duties include maintaining inventory, handling uniform issues/turns-ins, managing the supply room, and coordinating transportation. The S4 reports to the Executive Officer (XO) and Instructors.

Public Affairs Officer (S5)

The JROTC Public Affairs Officer (S5) manages the battalion's public image, media relations, and internal communications. Key responsibilities include photographing/videoing events, publishing newsletters, updating social media/bulletin boards, creating the end-of-year video, and recruiting new cadets. The S5 acts as the liaison between the unit, school, and community.

Company Commander (CC)

The JROTC Company Commander (CC) is a senior cadet responsible for everything their company does or fails to do, leading roughly 30–100+ cadets. They command company training, discipline, appearance, and morale while serving as the primary liaison between cadets and instructors.

Company First Sergeant (1SGT)

The JROTC Company First Sergeant (1SGT) is the senior enlisted leader responsible for the discipline, training, morale, and appearance of all company cadets. They act as the primary advisor to the Company Commander on enlisted matters, manage formations, handle daily accountability, and ensure compliance with uniform and drill standards.
