

Northview High School Governance Council Meeting Summary January 2026



Date: Tuesday, December 9th, 2025

Time: 7:30 AM – 8:15 AM

Location: Media Center Conference Room

The School Governance Council met on January 29, 2026, in the Media Center Conference Room. Members Dismuke, Jiménez, Chen, Pope, Doble, Neal, Wang, Mann, Nguyen, and guests Bounds and Sylvester were present. The meeting was called to order at 7:34 a.m. December meeting minutes were approved, and the January agenda was amended and approved.

During the Principal's Update, CCRI results were officially shared, noting that Northview earned the highest CCRI score among comprehensive high schools in Georgia (98.5). Enrollment projections for the 2026–2027 school year were reviewed, with a total enrollment of 1,519 students, including 17 COSA and 40 self-contained students, and grade-level breakdowns provided.

Several school announcements were shared, including a February 20 pep rally recognizing the Teacher and Staff Member of the Year as well as the Valedictorian and Salutatorian. Upcoming events included rising 9th grade visits on February 5–6, a parent meeting and tour on February 9, and no school for students on February 16–17.

The council discussed SGC elections, noting that there will be one parent seat and one teacher seat open for the upcoming term.

During the Mini-Grants Update, members reviewed requests and confirmed that additional funding discussions may continue beyond the current budget cycle. Several mini-grants were approved, totaling \$4,973.71, with additional requests placed on hold pending further review. One project was approved through alternate funding sources.

Budget updates were shared, including a budget review meeting on February 13, a budget subcommittee meeting on February 17, a leadership meeting on February 18, and a full SGC discussion of budget projections scheduled for February 26. Members were encouraged to bring budget-related questions to the subcommittee or the February SGC meeting.

A Memorial Project Update was provided, focusing on the selection of two quotations. Facilities concerns were also discussed, particularly a drainage issue near the brick area of the campus, with potential solutions ranging from installation and landscaping to club involvement or an Eagle Scout project.

The Parent Advisory Council Update included highlights from a November virtual meeting and a January in-person meeting. Parent feedback addressed calendar considerations, building needs, and community engagement. Specific concerns included program funding changes, start dates, fall break alignment, safety and access issues, transportation, antisemitism, and support for students in need.

The meeting also included Strategic District and Program Updates, highlighting ongoing focus areas such as budget planning, SGC elections, the memorial project, and Strategic District Emphasis initiatives. Updates were shared regarding the school's designation as a Certified Magnet Program and an emphasis on leadership development.

The meeting adjourned at 8:21 a.m.
