2. Hold parent-teacher conferences during which this compact will be discussed as it relates to the individual child's achievement. Specifically, those conferences will be held:
 - *At a minimum, one parent conference will be held to discuss contents of this compact. Additionally, student and parent conferences will be held to discuss student achievement or the lack thereof. The Annual Title I Parent Meeting will be held on August 14, 2025, at Paul W. Bryant High School. Parents are asked to provide at least a 24-hour notice for conferences but teachers are flexible and will meet with parents upon request. Teachers are available to meet during planning time on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, before school and after-school to discuss the achievement level of their child or children.*
3. Provide parents with frequent reports on their children's progress. Specifically, the school will provide reports as follows:
 - *Teachers will provide parents with regular progress reports and report cards at least once every 4.5 weeks through student distribution. Teachers are also required to notify parents of student progress periodically through phone calls and emails. Teachers also use technology applications (Remind) and Schoology as means of keeping parents abreast of student progress.*
4. Provide parents reasonable access to staff. Specifically, staff will be available for consultation with parents as follows:
 - *Faculty and staff are available for consultation with parents as needed and have options of scheduling meetings during the following times: planning period on Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, before school, after school, or upon request.*

5. Provide parents opportunities to volunteer and participate in their child's class, and to observe classroom activities, as follows:
 - *Parents are offered multiple opportunities through which to volunteer and participate in their child's class. These activities include but are not limited to the following: Classroom moms/dads, PTSA, Booster Organizations, Adopt a School Partnerships, Mentoring and Parent Involvement Committees.*

6. Ensure regular two-way, meaningful communication between family members and school staff, and, to the extent practicable, in a language that family members can understand.
 - *Teachers will have access to Language Line to ensure proper lines of communication are open and accessible to all family members. Teachers and administrators will also use Schoology, Remind, Peach Jar and Parent Link as a communication tool.*

Parent Responsibilities
