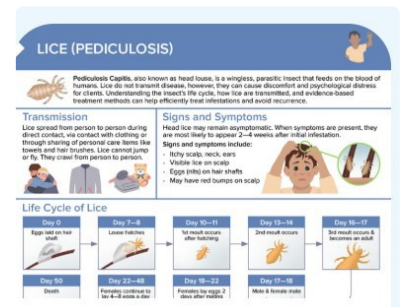

Reminder for Students & Parents -Online Safety & Digital Footprints



- As part of our school's partnership with [NJ4S/Compass](#), we recently held student workshops focused on *online safety, cyberbullying and Social Media Safety*.
- As students grow to be responsible digital citizens, it is important that they understand the negative effects that technology misuse can have on others and on themselves.

Please talk with your student about these key considerations before posting or messaging

- **THINK acronym:** Before posting, ask: Is it True, Helpful, Inspiring, Necessary, Kind?.
- **Privacy & Safety:** Be cautious about sharing personal details (full name, location, school) that can be exploited by strangers or criminals.
- **Future Impact:** Remember that colleges and employers often review social media, so posts should reflect positively on you.
- **Empathy:** Would you want someone to post this about you? Would it embarrass or negatively portray someone else?.

- **Mental Health:** Impulsive posting can lead to anxiety and mood swings; pausing helps prevent regrettable actions.
 - **Digital Footprint:** Anything online can be permanent; assume it's public, even with privacy settings.
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Student Attendance Matters

- Daily attendance is essential for the academic success and personal development of students. Consistent participation enhances understanding of the curriculum, fosters a sense of community, and develops important skills such as punctuality and responsibility.
- Students who attend classes regularly are more likely to complete assignments, perform better academically, and build positive relationships with educators. These connections provide valuable support as students navigate their high school experience. Prioritizing daily attendance is crucial for ensuring that every student has the opportunity to thrive and succeed in their educational journey.



The State of NJ Recognizes the Following as Excused Absences Only:

- Religious observance ([N.J.A.C. 6A:32-8.3\(h\)](#))
- College visits (up to 3 days per school year for students in grades 11 and 12)
- "Take Our Children to Work Day"
- Participation in observance of Veterans Day (N.J.S.A. 18A: 36-13.2)
- The closure of a busing district that prevents a student from having transportation to the school
- Participation in district board of election membership activities.

When to Keep your Child Home From School...

- A child with heavy cold symptoms, deep or uncontrollable coughing
- If your child has a fever, keep them home for at least 24 hours after the fever is gone without the use of fever-reducing medicines.
- If your child has pain in their ears, throat, head or chest and can not comfortably participate in school activities.
- If your child is vomiting or has diarrhea, they must have neither for 24 hours before they can return to school.

Locations

Preschool classrooms are located at Cambridge Park Community Center, 1012 Pacific Elementary School.

Classes

Classes are limited and will fill on a first-come, first-served basis.

- Conduct comprehensive evaluations, including cognitive, academic, and social-emotional assessments, to determine eligibility for special education services
- Interpret assessment data and shares findings with families and staff in a clear, supportive, and culturally responsive manner
- Participate in the development, implementation, and ongoing review of Individualized Education Programs (IEPs)
- Provide consultation to teachers and administrators to support evidence-based instructional and behavioral interventions
- Monitor student progress and recommends data-driven interventions and program modifications
- Collaborate with key staff members, including counselors to evaluate, and support students experiencing academic, behavioral, social, or emotional challenges

- Support a multidisciplinary, collaborative approach that promotes inclusive practices and student success within the general education setting
- Serve as a liaison between school, families, and community resources to ensure coordinated support for students
