

Central Office departments and staff work in close partnership with our schools to support students, families, and staff across the district. In addition to instructional support, the district provides a wide range of services and programs that strengthen our community, including enrichment and extracurricular opportunities, Food Services, Nursing and School-Based Health Centers, Mentoring Program, and the TreeHouse before and after-school childcare.

## Special Education Overview

Groton Public Schools is committed to supporting students who may be experiencing learning delays so they can make meaningful progress in school. To help identify student needs, the district conducts individualized evaluations with input from families. Through this process, the Planning and Placement Team (PPT) at each school determines a student's eligibility for special education services and the level of support needed in the general education setting, in accordance with the 2004 Individuals with Disabilities Education Improvement Act (IDEA) and state regulations. This process ensures that eligible students ages 3 through 22 who have not earned a regular high school diploma receive a free and appropriate public education.

Once a student is found eligible for special education services, the district and school team work in partnership with families to develop a written Individualized Education Program (IEP). The IEP reflects the student's unique strengths and needs and guides the delivery of services. It is implemented by the school team and reviewed and revised regularly to ensure the student continues to make progress.

Groton Public Schools is committed to educating students with disabilities alongside their non-disabled peers to the maximum extent appropriate. To support this commitment, the district provides a full continuum of programs and services, including more intensive or specialized instruction when needed to implement a student's IEP. Students receiving special education and related services attend their zoned school unless a different placement is required based on the student's IEP.

### Early Childhood Education:

- Connecticut has established an Early Childhood Education Endowment to support and expand early learning opportunities statewide. Funding for school districts is provided through the Smart Start Grant.
- Groton Public Schools has been awarded \$600,000 in grant funding to renovate Mary Morrisson Elementary School into an Early Childhood Learning Center.
- Beginning Fall 2026, Groton Public Schools will use additional Smart Start funds to:
  - Add two additional preschool classrooms, and
  - Expand all preschool programs to full-day sessions for children who are 4 years old on or before September 1, 2026.

### DID YOU KNOW?

- 79% of students with disabilities attend general education classes for 80-100% of the day (23-24 SY).
- Connecticut's definition of a Developmental Delay has been expanded to include children ages 3 - 8 who have a documented significant delay in one or more developmental areas.
- Groton Public Schools has received \$229,067.00 from the State of Connecticut Special Education Expansion and Development (SEED) grant to fund the hiring of additional special education teachers and related service providers.
- Funds received from the Individuals with Disabilities Grant are allocated to supplement the cost of paraeducators and staff for the Extended School Year Program.

# Robert E. Fitch High School

Our mission at Robert E. Fitch High School is to educate our students to become outstanding global citizens equipped with 21st-century learning skills. The faculty and staff collaborate with the home and community to promote academic excellence, personal wellness, and social awareness. The ultimate expectation is for our students to become lifelong learners. We model and strongly support our students to R.I.S.E. and thrive under our vision of the Fitch graduate, which is to be **R**esilient Individuals, **I**nnovative Learners, **S**ocially Aware Citizens, and **E**ngaged Learners.

### School Highlights:

- **A Globally Recognized IB World School Experience:** International Baccalaureate World School offering the full continuum: Middle Years Programme (MYP), Diploma Programme (DP), and Career-related Programme (CP), preparing students for college, career, and global citizenship.
- **College-Level Learning & Early Credit Opportunities:** 16+ Advanced Placement (AP) courses, including Early College Experience (ECE) partnerships with Connecticut colleges and universities, including the University of Connecticut.
- **Robust College and Career Pathways:** NJROTC for leadership and military-connected experiences, Project Lead the Way for aspiring engineers, EdRising for future educators, and Nursing and Emergency Medical Technician (EMT) pathways.
- **Industry & Workforce Connections:** Hands-on manufacturing partnership with Electric Boat through the Boats for the Next Generation program, connecting students directly to high-demand careers. The former Auto Shop has been transformed into a D.R.E.A.M. (Department of Robotics, Engineering, Architecture, and Manufacturing) space.
- **Athletics, Clubs & Student Life:** 31 Varsity interscholastic athletic teams and 50+ extracurricular clubs, including a competitive debate team affiliated with the Connecticut Debate Association and the award-winning FIRST Robotics Team, the Aluminum Falcons.
- **Award-Winning Arts & Music:** Nationally recognized music and arts programs, including: Amphora, the student-produced literary magazine and the Falcons Marching Band, who placed 2nd at Met-Life Stadium (2025).

## Groton Middle School

Groton Middle School welcomes 6th - 8th grade students from across Groton. GMS's mission is to create a unified, inclusive, and safe learning community, which meets the needs of all learners. Faculty and staff work collaboratively and respectfully with families to inspire students to become inquiring, engaged, and compassionate members of their communities. These efforts aim to encourage students to move forward as globally responsible individuals who consider and value the experiences of others that may differ from their own.

### School Highlights:

- **An IB World School with a STEAM Focus:** Authorized International Baccalaureate Middle Years Programme (MYP) School, integrating a strong STEAM approach to learning.
- **Learning That Connects to the Real World:** The MYP emphasizes intellectual challenge, encouraging students to make meaningful connections between traditional academic subjects and real-world applications through science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics.
- **Exploration, Choice & Preparation:** Diverse course offerings allow students to explore college and career interests while preparing them for high school pathways and advanced coursework.
- **STEM & Innovation Opportunities:** 10 Project Lead the Way (PLTW) courses plus four additional computer and STEM courses, giving students hands-on experience in problem-solving, design, and innovation.
- **Robust Arts & Creative Expression:** Extensive arts opportunities, including band, orchestra, chorus, world drumming, and guitar; theater, playwriting, and visual & fine arts; and multimedia, broadcasting, and video production.
- **Purpose-Built Learning Spaces:** Specialized facilities that support hands-on, creative learning, including: a broadcasting studio, Black box theater, STEAM lab and art studio, fitness and dance studio, alongside traditional classrooms and science labs.
- **Athletics & Student Life:** 20+ athletic and intramural opportunities and a wide range of special-interest student clubs, encouraging engagement, teamwork, and school connection.

# Catherine Kolnaski Magnet Elementary School

### Magnet Theme: STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts, Math)

Catherine Kolnaski Magnet School is one of Groton's five magnet-themed elementary schools, welcoming students in grades K-5. Catherine Kolnaski provides students with a strong foundation through STEAM-based experiences, classes, lessons, and opportunities to engage in real-world problem-solving using a multidisciplinary approach and by integrating technology with the arts. In addition to problem-solving, an emphasis is placed on providing students with opportunities to express their creativity and discover talents and passions that lead to lifelong learning.

### School Highlights:

- **A STEAM-Rich Elementary Learning Environment:** A hands-on, inquiry-based program where science, technology, engineering, arts, and mathematics are integrated across learning experiences for all students in grades K-5.
- **Strong Community Partnerships:** Learning is enriched through partnerships with leading organizations, including the Connecticut Science Center, Project Oceanology, New England Science and Sailing (NESS).
- **Guaranteed STEAM Experiences for Every Student:** All K-5 students participate in engineering, computer science and coding, LEGO robotics, and maker education through art and media.
- **Enrichment Beyond the Classroom:** Expanded learning opportunities include a school-wide STEAM fair, 3D printing, piano instruction beginning in Grade 1, and strings instruction beginning in Grade 2.
- **Real-World STEM Connections:** Participation in Electric Boat's Boat for Kids Program, a hands-on STEM experience introducing students to manufacturing and engineering careers.
- **Innovation & Student Creativity:** 3rd- and 5th-grade students participate in the annual Invention Convention, showcasing creativity, problem-solving, and design thinking. An annual STEAM Night highlights student projects and brings together families and community partners.
- **Learning Inspired by Nature:** A unique campus set in a private, wooded environment, surrounded by town open space with hiking trails. Outdoor learning is supported through an outdoor classroom and school garden, extending STEAM learning beyond our classrooms.

# Charles Barnum Magnet Elementary School

### Magnet Theme: Discovery

Charles Barnum Magnet School is one of Groton's five magnet-themed elementary schools, welcoming students in grades K-5 and serving a high population of military students. Charles Barnum is dedicated to providing educational experiences that foster discovery through creativity, curiosity, and exploration. Student-led learning experiences help each student find their gifts, talents, and interests. We proudly nurture a learning environment, rooted in optimism, where all children can engage, connect, explore, and reach their full potential.

### School Highlights:

- **Meaningful Community & Military Partnerships:** Strong partnerships that enhance learning and student well-being, including the Life is Good Playmaker Project and Denison Pequot Nature Center. The Submarine Force Library and Museum provides opportunities for Sailors to share lessons and experiences with students.
- **Real-World STEM Connections:** Participation in Electric Boat's Boat for Kids Program, a hands-on STEM experience introducing students to manufacturing and engineering careers.
- **Family-Centered Literacy Engagement:** Literacy How Partnership offers three evening literacy events each year, bringing students and families together to support reading and learning at home.
- **Personalized Learning & Exploration:** A weekly Discovery Block (Clusters) that allows students to explore personal interests in small groups, fostering curiosity, collaboration, and choice.
- **Enrichment Beyond the School Day:** An ever-changing variety of before- and after-school enrichment clubs, giving students opportunities to pursue interests, develop new skills, and build friendships.
- **Supporting Military-Connected Students:** A student-led Anchored for Life program focused on supporting military-connected students, with an emphasis on transitions, belonging, and peer connection.

## Mystic River Magnet Elementary School

### Magnet Theme: Active Play and Exploration

Mystic River Magnet School is one of Groton's two newest elementary schools, built in 2021 as part of the Groton 2020 construction project. It welcomes students in grades Preschool - Grade 5. Mystic River also hosts our specialized autism program (K-5). It is also one of Groton Public Schools' five magnet-themed intra-district magnet elementary schools. Mystic River's Play and Ingenuity theme is focused on finding new ways to engage our students meaningfully in play-based learning with a focus on Active Exploration. Students benefit from making social-emotional connections in creative, hands-on learning environments while working collaboratively and thinking critically with their peers.

### School Highlights:

- **Community Magnet Partnerships:** Learning is enriched through partnerships with Life is Good, Niantic Children's Museum, and New England Science and Sailing, and the Watershed Alliance.
- **Real-World STEM Experiences:** Participation in Electric Boat's Boat for Kids Program, a hands-on STEM initiative that introduces students to engineering, design, and manufacturing careers.
- **Active Exploration in Grades K-2:** Developmentally appropriate, play-based learning that encourages curiosity and creativity. Students actively explore topics through hands-on experiences that strengthen brain pathways and support meaning-making through play, problem-solving, and cross-disciplinary learning.
- **Active Exploration in Grades 3-5:** Learning through games and collaborative challenges that promote both mental and physical engagement. A strong problem-solving framework helps students understand information across content areas. Collaboration between students and teachers supports tackling increasingly complex, interdisciplinary problems.

# Northeast Academy Magnet Elementary School

### Magnet Theme: Arts

Northeast Academy Magnet School is one of Groton's five magnet elementary schools, welcoming students in grades K-5. It was built in 2008. Northeast Academy students engage in challenging and complex instruction designed to develop creative thinkers and innovative learners. Through interdisciplinary projects with an arts focus, students are given opportunities to become creative, innovative learners who consistently strive for their personal best. Northeast Academy offers a variety of classes and activities that extend beyond the current arts curriculum of the Groton Public Schools.

### School Highlights:

- **Arts-Focused Magnet Partnerships:** Learning is enriched through creative partnerships with the Flock Theatre, Connecticut Storytelling Center, cARTie, and the Mystic Museum of Art.
- **Recognized for Academic Excellence:** Northeast Academy has been named a School of Distinction by the State of Connecticut in recent years for both academic achievement and academic growth.
- **Signature Drama & Performance Experiences:** The annual 4th and 5th-grade drama production, with a full cast and tech crew, is a cornerstone experience within the school's arts programming.
- **Social-Emotional Learning & Student Growth:** Students are supported through the Journey to Success program and Second Step, both of which emphasize key social-emotional learning principles and encourage every child to strive for their personal best.
- **Creative Exploration & Artistic Expression:** Students have opportunities to explore and develop their talents through vocal and instrumental music, visual arts, and multi-media productions.
- **Enrichment Beyond the Classroom:** A wide range of clubs, field trips, and enrichment activities focused on the arts provide students with authentic, hands-on creative experiences.

- Northeast Academy's annual Celebrate the Arts Festival occurs each March. All students participate in two consecutive days of arts workshops, activities, and performances geared towards our school's mission statement. ## Thames River Magnet Elementary School

### Magnet Theme: Environmental and Marine Science

Thames River Magnet School was built in 2021 as part of the Groton 2020 construction project. It welcomes K-5 students as well as three- and four-year-old children enrolled in the district's Early Childhood Program. Thames River Magnet is also home to the Transition-K and two Academy Programs, which are specialized behavioral programs (K-3). It is also one of Groton Public Schools' five intra-district magnet elementary schools. Thames River students engage in daily instruction in all core curriculum areas combined with a marine science and environmental focus.

### School Highlights:

- **Hands-On Learning Through Community Partnerships:** Learning is enriched through strong partnerships with Project Oceanology, Mystic Aquarium, and New England Science and Sailing. These partners engage students in hands-on lessons and meaningful field trip experiences. Project Oceanology educators deliver NGSS-aligned instruction and support year-long, project-based learning action projects in addition to field trips and lab work.
- **Sustainability & Outdoor Learning:** A strong commitment to environmental sustainability supported by an expansive outdoor classroom, featuring a greenhouse and garden beds, a large outdoor pavilion, composting initiatives, and two walking trails that extend learning beyond the classroom walls.
- **Peer leadership Opportunities:** Grades 4 and 5 students have the opportunity to serve as peer leaders, taking on meaningful roles throughout the school community. In these roles, students support younger learners by helping them navigate the school, strengthening literacy and math skills, welcoming students each day, and providing student input regarding overall school climate.
- **Recognized for Student Growth:** Thames River was named a School of Distinction for High Growth for High Needs Students in math for the 24-25 school year by the State of Connecticut, reflecting a commitment to equity, progress, and student success.
- **Comprehensive Early Learning-to-Elementary Experience:** K-5 Elementary School offering a district Preschool for three- and four-year-old children along with a Transition Kindergarten program that supports a strong start to school.


- Enhance literacy instruction using research grounded in the science of reading using an approach that builds content knowledge and a core resource that is aligned, Grades K-8





Several self-contained programs provide specialized instruction for special education students with more significant needs in order to meet their individualized education plans.

 To provide pupils in Groton Public Schools and Sacred Heart School with good health care in case of accident or sudden illness and to provide identified pupils with various health services. Examples of other professional services include: Direct consultants, out of district evaluators, Medical Advisor, additional part-time tele-health speech and language pathologist. A grant from the State of Connecticut assists with the cost of the Sacred Heart nurse.

The program services students PreK-12 by providing a school physician and purchased services which include occupational therapy and physical therapy services in accordance with their Individual Education Program (IEP) or section 504 plan. In addition, this program provides, in accordance with the Individual Disability Education Act (IDEA), provisions for psychiatric, neurological, psychological, audio logical, and auditory processing as well as other types of specialized evaluations for children at Pequot Health Center as well as other institutions.

The program also provides 3.0 FTE occupational therapists (OT), 2.6 FTE certified occupational therapy assistants, 1.2 FTE physical therapists (PT) and 1.8 FTE BCBA to provide occupational, physical therapy and behavioral consultation to student's in accordance with their Individual Education Plans (IEP) or Section 504 Plans. The board contracts for these services with private agencies and LEARN.

 The Educational Media Services Program provides instruction in authentic information, problem solving and research strategies using both print and electronic resources, and guidance in the selection and use of materials for leisure enrichment and curriculum implementation. All library media centers contain resources in both print and electronic formats to implement, complement and supplement the curriculum. Library media specialists promote the enjoyment of reading for pleasure and personal enrichment, focusing on the development of lifelong reading habits.

Each elementary library media center employs the services of a certified library media specialist, where students are assigned a weekly formal period with limited flexible access. The secondary school library media centers employ 1.5 certified library media specialists and a full-time library technical assistant. High school and middle school students utilize the library with flexibility, as determined by both students and teachers.

The library media center is typically the center for video production projects which take place in the school.
