# ATTENDANCE



School districts are required by law to inform parents/guardians of their child's absences from school, whether they were excused or unexcused absences. Often, the number of hours that students are absent from school can accumulate without parents realizing how much instructional time their child missed. Chronic absences means missing at least 10% of instructional time for *any reason* in the school year. Student absences from school, whether excused, medically excused, or unexcused, take away from instructional time and have an adverse effect on student learning.
