



SUMMER SCHOOL OPPORTUNITIES



Conejo Valley Unified School District is proud to support its students' diverse academic needs and ambitions. The following are popular accredited summer school options, although the list is not exhaustive. Coursework completed at other accredited institutions will be eligible for placement on the high school transcript.

- Students may choose to enroll in a summer school program for acceleration and/or credit recovery purposes.
- **Students cannot enroll in two public high school programs concurrently.**
- Students may enroll in any accredited summer school program and earn up to 20 credits per summer. Students may apply a maximum of 40 outside credits to their CVUSD transcript over their high school career.
- Students intending to apply directly to four year colleges and universities should ensure the summer course is A-G approved by visiting **UC Doorways** online.

CVUSD Credit Recovery Summer School

Students may enroll in CVUSD's free credit recovery summer school, if they qualify, with guidance from their assigned high school counselors. Any student who earns a D or F in a graduation-required course should enroll in the CVUSD Credit Recovery Summer School program. This program is for students that need to repeat one or two semesters of a course in order to repair their grade. **This year the CVUSD Credit Recovery Summer School program will occur July 6th – 31st at Newbury Park High School.**
