
Superintendent Term Contract

This Superintendent Term Contract ("Contract") is entered into between the Board of Trustees (the "Board") of BOERNE INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT (the "District") and Dr. Kristin Craft (the "Superintendent").

The Board and the Superintendent, for and in consideration for the terms stated in this Contract, and pursuant to Chapter 11, Subchapters D and E, Section 11.201 and Chapter 21 of the Texas Education Code hereby agree as follows:

1. **Term.** The Board agrees to employ the Superintendent for a term beginning January 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2029. The Board and the Superintendent (the "Parties") may extend the term of this Contract by agreement.
2. **Certification.** The Superintendent agrees to maintain the required certification throughout the term of employment with the District. If the Superintendent's certification expires, is canceled, or is revoked, this Contract is void.
3. **Representations.** The Superintendent makes the following representations:
 - 3.1 **Beginning of Contract:** At the beginning of this Contract, and at any time during this Contract, the Superintendent specifically agrees to submit to a review of her national criminal history record information (NCHRI) if required by the District, TEA, or SBEC. The Superintendent understands that a criminal history record acceptable to the Board, at its sole discretion, is a condition precedent to this Contract.
 - 3.2 **During Contract:** The Superintendent also agrees that, during the term of this Contract, the Superintendent will notify the Board in writing of any arrest or of any indictment, conviction, no contest or guilty plea, or other adjudication of the Superintendent for any felony, any offense involving moral turpitude, and any offenses set forth in Policy DH (Local). The Superintendent agrees to provide such notification in writing within the period specified in Board policy.
 - 3.3 **False Statements and Misrepresentations:** The Superintendent represents that any records or information provided in connection with her employment application are true and correct. Any false statements, misrepresentations, omissions of requested information, intentionally made, or fraud by the Superintendent in or concerning any required records or in the employment application may be grounds for termination or nonrenewal, as applicable.
4. **Duties.** The Superintendent shall be the educational leader and chief executive officer of the District. The Superintendent agrees to perform her duties as follows:
 - 4.1 **Authority:** The Superintendent shall perform such duties and have such powers as may be prescribed in the job description, by law including sections 11.201(d), 11.1512 and 11.1513 of the Texas Education Code ("TEC") and as may be lawfully assigned

by the Board. The Board shall have the right to assign additional duties to the Superintendent and to make changes in responsibilities or work at any time during the Contract term. All duties assigned by the Board shall be appropriate to and consistent with the professional role and responsibility of the Superintendent.

4.2 **Standard:** Except as otherwise permitted by this Contract, the Superintendent agrees to devote her full time and energy to the performance of her duties. The Superintendent shall perform her duties with reasonable care, skill, and diligence. The Superintendent shall comply with all lawful Board directives, state and federal laws and rules, Board policy, and regulations as they exist or may hereafter be amended.

5. **Compensation.** The District shall pay the Superintendent an annual salary as follows:

5.1 **Salary.** The District shall pay the Superintendent an annual salary of two-hundred fifty-three thousand dollars (\$253,000.00). The annual salary shall be paid to the Superintendent in equal monthly installments consistent with the Board's policies. At any time during the term of this Contract, the Board may, in its discretion, review and adjust the salary of the Superintendent, but in no event shall the Superintendent be paid less than the salary set forth in Section 5.1 of this Contract except by mutual agreement of the two parties or as permitted by law, subject to any legal challenges by the Superintendent as indicated below. Such adjustments, if any, shall be made pursuant to a lawful Board resolution. In such event, the parties agree to provide their best efforts and reasonable cooperation to execute a new contract incorporating the adjusted salary. Subject to and without waiving any Constitutional and/or other legal challenges by the Superintendent, the Superintendent acknowledges that the District may have certain rights pursuant to Education Code Sections 21.4021 and/or 21.4032

5.2 **Benefits.** In addition to the benefits expressly set forth herein, the District shall provide other benefits to the Superintendent as provided to District employees by state law and Board policies. The Board reserves the right to amend its policies at any time during the term of this Contract to reduce or increase such other benefits, at the Board's sole discretion.

5.3 **Texas Teacher Retirement System.** For performance of Superintendent duties, the District shall supplement the Superintendent's salary by an amount equal to the Superintendent's portion of the member contribution to the Texas Teacher Retirement System ("TRS") during the Term of this Contract, including any extensions thereof. This supplement shall include the retirement and the TRS-Care parts of the TRS member contribution, as applicable. This additional salary supplement for services rendered shall be paid to the Superintendent in regular monthly payroll installments and shall be reported as "creditable compensation" by the District for purposes of TRS, to the extent permitted by TRS.

5.4 **Travel reimbursement.** The Superintendent will be reimbursed by the District on a per mile basis for business travel outside of the District and Region 20 Service Center

area in the Superintendent's personal automobile in accordance with District policy as for other administrative employees on twelve-month contracts.

- 5.5 **Laptop Computer or Similar Electronic Device and Communications Device.** The District shall provide a laptop computer or similar electronic device and communications device for the Superintendent's business and personal use, at the sole cost and expense of the District. These devices, as with all District property, shall be returned by the Superintendent to the District promptly upon the termination of the Superintendent's employment with the District.
- 5.6 **Civic Activities.** The Superintendent is encouraged to participate in community and civic affairs. The expense of these activities, subject to Board approval in advance, shall be borne by the District.
- 5.7 **Professional Organizations.** The Superintendent shall devote the Superintendent's time, attention, and energy to the direction, administration, and supervision of the District. The Board, however, encourages the continued professional growth of the Superintendent through the Superintendent's active attendance and participation in appropriate professional meetings, seminars, conferences, or courses at the local, regional, state, and national level. In its encouragement of the Superintendent to grow professionally, the Board shall permit a reasonable amount of release time for the Superintendent as the Superintendent and the Board deem appropriate, to attend such meetings, seminars, conferences, or courses. The District does hereby agree to provide in the District's budget per contract year an amount to be used for registration, travel, meals, lodging, and other related expenses. The District shall pay for the Superintendent's membership dues to the Texas Association of School Administrators and one other professional organization selected by the Superintendent. The District shall bear the reasonable cost and expense for registration, travel, meals, lodging, and other related expenses for such attendance and membership which are in accordance with the approved District budget.
- 5.8 **Residence in District.** As a condition of employment with the Boerne Independent School District, the Superintendent shall reside within the geographic boundaries of the District at all times while employed as Superintendent by the District.
- 5.09 **Expenses.** The District shall pay or reimburse the Superintendent for reasonable expenses incurred by the Superintendent in the continuing performance of the Superintendent's duties under this Contract as provided in Board policy. The District agrees to pay the actual and incidental costs incurred by the Superintendent for travel outside the District and the Region 20 Service Area in accordance with section 5.5 and Board policy. Such actual or incidental costs may include, but are not limited to, gasoline, hotels and accommodations, meals, rental car, and other expenses incurred in the performance of the business of the District. The Superintendent shall comply with all procedures and documentation requirements in accordance with Board policies.
- 5.10 **Vacation, Holiday and Personal Leave.** The Superintendent may take the same

number of days of vacation authorized by policies adopted by the Board for administrators on twelve-month contracts, the days to be taken in a single period or at different times. The vacation days taken by the Superintendent will be taken at such time or times as will least interfere with the performance of the Superintendent's duties as set forth in this Contract. Any unused vacation days shall accumulate and carry forward from year to year during the term of this Contract. All accumulated unused vacation days shall be paid out at the Superintendent's daily rate upon retirement or separation for any reason. The Superintendent's daily rate shall be calculated by their then TRS creditable compensation as reported to the Texas Teacher Retirement System divided by 226 days. The Superintendent shall observe the same legal holidays as provided by Board policies for administrative employees on twelve-month contracts. The Superintendent is hereby granted the same personal leave benefits as authorized by Board policies for administrative employees on twelve-month contracts, except that the Superintendent, at her discretion and with the approval of the Board president, may utilize all accrued but unused leave days to be taken in a single period or at different times during the term of this Contract.

5.11 **Supplemental Retirement Plan.** For each payroll period during the Term of this Contract, including any extensions thereof, the District shall add to the Salary of the Superintendent the amount necessary to contribute twenty-five percent (25%) of the maximum combined voluntary contribution amount allowable under Section 402(g) of the Code for a 403(b) and a 457(b) Plan, at the beginning of the Contract year, as indexed, including the age-based catch-up provisions, if applicable. One-twelfth of this amount shall be paid as a monthly salary deferral contribution, at the election of the Superintendent, to a plan established by the District under Section 403(b) and/or Section 457(b) of the Code. ("Additional Salary"). In the event the Superintendent executes a salary deferral agreement in accordance with the requirements of Sections 403(b) and/or 457(b) of the Internal Revenue Code (the "Code") in at least the amount of the Additional Salary, the Additional Salary shall be paid as a salary deferral contribution ("Salary Deferral Contribution"). Under and pursuant to applicable Internal Revenue Service rules the Superintendent shall have the option to elect to receive the Additional Salary in cash rather than as a Salary Deferral Contribution. All such Salary Deferral Contributions contemplated herein shall be paid to a plan established by the District under Section 403(b) and/or Section 457(b) of the Code. Such plans shall include investments as allowed under Sections 403(b), 403(b)(7) and/or 457(b) of the Code, respectively, and the investments for the Superintendent's accounts shall be solely at his discretion. The Superintendent shall always be 100% vested in his account under the 403(b) and/or 457(b) plan. The Salary Deferral Contributions contemplated herein shall be treated as salary deferrals under the Code and shall be reported as "creditable compensation" by the District for purposes of the Teacher Retirement System of Texas. No payments under this Section shall be made after the Superintendent's employment terminates.

6. **Suspension.** In accordance with Texas Education Code chapter 21, the Board may suspend the Superintendent without pay during the term of this Contract for good cause as determined by the Board.

7. **Termination and Nonrenewal of Contract.** Termination or nonrenewal of this contract, or resignation under this contract, will be pursuant to Texas Education Code chapter 21.

8. **General Provisions.**

- 8.1 **Amendment:** This Contract may not be amended except by written agreement of the Parties.
- 8.2 **Severability:** If any provision in this Contract is, for any reason, held to be invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability shall not affect any other provision of the Contract. This Contract shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been a part of the Contract.
- 8.3 **Entire Agreement:** All existing agreements and contracts, both verbal and written, between the Parties regarding the employment of the Superintendent for the term stated herein are superseded by this Contract. This Contract constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties.
- 8.4 **Applicable Law and Venue:** Texas law shall govern construction of this Contract. The Parties agree that venue for any litigation relating to the Superintendent's employment with the District, including this Contract, shall be the county in which the District's administration building is located. If litigation is brought in federal court, the Parties agree that venue shall be the federal district and division in which the district' administration building is located.

- 8.5 **Paragraph Headings:** The headings used at the beginning of each numbered paragraph in this Contract are not intended to have any legal effect; the headings do not limit or expand the meaning of the paragraphs that follow them.
- 8.6 **Legal Representation:** Both Parties have been represented by legal counsel of their choice, or have had the opportunity to consult with legal counsel, in the negotiation and execution of this Contract.
- 8.7 **Conflicts.** In the event of any conflict between the terms, conditions, and provisions of this Contract and the provisions of the Board's policies, or any permissive state or federal law, then, unless otherwise prohibited by law, the terms of this Contract shall take precedence over the contrary provisions of the Board's policies or any such permissive law during the term of the Contract except as noted in paragraph 5.1 in accordance with Education Code Sections 21.4021 and/or 21.4032, subject to any legal challenges by the Superintendent.
9. **Notices.**
- 9.1 **To Superintendent:** The Superintendent agrees to keep a current address on file with the District's human resources office and the Board President. The Superintendent agrees that the Board may meet any legal obligation it has to give the Superintendent written notice regarding this Contract or the Superintendent's employment by hand-delivery, or by certified mail, regular mail, and/or express delivery service to the Superintendent's address of record.
- 9.2 **To Board:** The Board agrees that the Superintendent may meet any legal obligation to give the Board written notice regarding this Contract or the Superintendent's employment by providing one copy of the notice to the President of the Board and one copy to the Vice President of the Board. The Superintendent may provide such notices by hand delivery, or by certified mail, regular mail, and/or express delivery service, to the Board President and Vice President's addresses of record, as provided to the District.
10. **Employment.**
- 10.1 **Reassignment.** The Superintendent cannot be reassigned from the position of Superintendent to another position without the Superintendent's express written consent.
- 10.2 **Board Meetings.** The Superintendent has a duty and not a right to attend all meetings of the Board, both public and closed, except for those closed meetings devoted to the consideration of any action or lack of action on the Superintendent's Contract, or the Superintendent's evaluation, or for purposes of resolving conflicts between individual Board members, or when the Board is acting in its capacity as a tribunal. In the event of illness or Board-approved absence, the Superintendent's designee may attend such meetings subject to the Board's approval. Further, the Superintendent shall provide recommendation(s) and/or information as to each of the items of business considered at each meeting as needed or requested by the Board.

10.3 **Liability Insurance:** The District's Professional Liability insurance policy provides coverage for the Superintendent, as set forth in the policy, and this policy or one with similar coverage will be kept in full force and effect during the term of this Contract and shall be maintained for a sufficient period to provide coverage for claims raised after the term of the Contract but which arose from acts during the Contract term.
