The Almond Fire and EMS Department Needs You

The Almond Fire and EMS Department needs your help. It has become increasingly difficult to recruit new members. When I started with the fire department 35 years ago, we had a full roster of 35 members. We currently have 21 members, 9 Firefighters, 7 EMS, 5 Fire & EMS, and we have had calls where we had only 5 personnel answer the call for help. Our current roster is getting older. This year we had 3 members retire, and 2 more that are planning on retiring this year. We cannot safely respond to fire calls without relying on our neighboring departments for help. Over the years we have made changes on how we operate on calls and have purchased equipment to help us be more efficient on the emergency scene.

Your community needs your help. I know that it is not an easy job. There is required state training that you will need to take to become a Firefighter or an Emergency Medical Responder unless you are a nurse. This takes time away from other parts of your life. But the job has a lot of rewards. You will learn skills that may help your own family, plus you will become part of the larger Emergency Responder family, and have pride in helping your neighbors.

I am looking into making some changes in the Fire Department. I would like to have you consider joining us as a member. If someone has experience or would be willing to help as a grant writer.

If you feel you don't have the time to be a firefighter or EMR responder, I would like to get new members for the fire auxiliary to help us with these roles. A few examples of the roles you would be filling, could be driving a water tender to shuttle water to our fires, or bringing food and drinking water out to help the firefighters, or it could be pulling an equipment trailer out to us. This will free up some of my current firefighters to do other jobs on the scene.

Please consider helping your neighbors in their time of need. Stop in and check us out, we are at the fire station for training and maintenance on the 1st and 2nd Monday nights of each month or contact me at (715) 366-7181 or email me at chief@almondfd.com and we can find a role that will help your community.
