





## 470: Candace Callan Scholarship

### Requirements

- Residence (county): Residents of Lane, Douglas, and Linn Counties
- Colleges: Oregon community, trade, and vocational colleges in Douglas, Lane, or Linn County only
- Major: Trade or vocational programs
- Preference for applicants who identify as female
- Preference: Applicants who have recently turned their lives around
- GPA: High school, 2.00+
- Enrollment: Minimum half-time (6 credits), undergraduate study
- FAFSA/ORSA: Required - based on financial need
- Automatic renewal with completion of the annual renewal application. May be received for a maximum of four years.

## 855: Doris and William Scharpf Scholarship

### Requirements

- Graduates of High Schools and GED recipients in Linn County
- Requirement: First-generation in family to attend college
- **Enrollment: Part-time enrollment (minimum six credit hours)**
- Colleges: Any 1, 2- or 4-year, public or private, nonprofit or for-profit, or accredited vocational/trade, Title IV postsecondary school in the United States
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Required - based on financial need
- Automatically renewable for up to six years if renewal criteria met.

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- **Non-Oregon Resident Requirement:**  
OSAC will *automatically* receive your FAFSA record if you are an Oregon resident or a non-Oregon resident with at least one Oregon institution selected on the FAFSA. **If you do not fall into either category, you must upload Page 1 and 2 of your FAFSA Submission Summary** to be considered for this scholarship. This information is required for financial need consideration.

## 142: Dorothy Campbell Memorial Scholarship

### Requirements

- Graduating seniors of an Oregon high school, or, prior graduate of an Oregon high school who has prior college experience.
- GPA: 2.75+
- Female
- Activities (preference): Participation on high school golf team, if available (including intramural team)
- Colleges: Oregon four-year public and nonprofit only
- Enrollment: Full-time enrollment required
- FAFSA: Required - based on financial need
- Automatically renewable if renewal criteria met

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- Essay: Describe your strong continuing interest in golf and contribution the sport has made to your development Length: 1 page
- Non-Oregon Resident Requirement:  
OSAC will *automatically* receive your FAFSA record if you are an Oregon resident or a non-Oregon resident with at least one Oregon institution selected on the FAFSA. **If you do not fall into either category, you must upload Page 1 and 2 of your FAFSA Submission Summary** to be considered for this scholarship. This information is required for financial need consideration.

## 304: Franz Stenzel M.D. and Kathryn Stenzel Scholarship

### Requirements

- Graduates of Oregon high schools (or were home-schooled or earned a GED in Oregon)
- GPA: High school (for first-time freshmen), 2.75+; college students, 2.50+
- Major: Medicine (pre-med and graduate-level), nursing, or medical/physician assistant
- Colleges: Any public or private, nonprofit, Title IV, postsecondary school in the United States
- Enrollment: Must enroll at least half time
- FAFSA/ORSA: Required - based on financial need
- Automatically renewable if renewal criteria met

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- Non-Oregon Resident Requirement:  
OSAC will *automatically* receive your FAFSA record if you are an Oregon resident or a non-Oregon resident with at least one Oregon institution selected on the FAFSA. **If you do not fall into either category, you must upload Page 1 and 2 of your FAFSA Submission Summary** to be considered for this scholarship. This information is required for financial need consideration.

## 251: Juanita Brown Struble Scholarship

### Requirements

- Preference #1: Graduating seniors of Lebanon High School
- Preference #2: Graduates of Lebanon High School who were prior recipients of the award
- Major (preference): Business, education, engineering, law, medicine, music, or science
- Colleges: Any 4-year, public or private nonprofit, Title IV, postsecondary school in Oregon.
- Enrollment: Full-time enrollment required
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Financial need is a consideration, FAFSA/ORSAA filing is required
- Apply-competes annually, may be received for a maximum of 4 years.

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- Non-Oregon Resident Requirement:  
OSAC will *automatically* receive your FAFSA record if you are an Oregon resident or a non-Oregon resident with at least one Oregon institution selected on the FAFSA. **If you do not fall into either category, you must upload Page 1 and 2 of your FAFSA Submission Summary** to be considered for this scholarship. This information is required for financial need consideration.

## 388: Glenn R. and Juanita B. Struble II Scholarship

### Requirements

- Graduates of Oregon high schools
- Residence (county): Benton, Douglas, Jackson, Lane, Linn, Marion, or Yamhill County
- GPA: 3.00+
- Major: Visual or performing arts, business management (preference for those wanting to own a business), or mechanical engineering (preference for manufacturing career)
- Colleges: Public and nonprofit only
- Enrollment: Undergraduate students must enroll full time. Graduate students must enroll at least half time.
- Apply-compete annually, may be received for a maximum of 4 years.
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Financial need is a consideration, FAFSA/ORSAA filing is required

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- Non-Oregon Resident Requirement:  
OSAC will *automatically* receive your FAFSA record if you are an Oregon resident *or* a non-Oregon resident with at least one Oregon institution selected on the FAFSA. **If you do not fall into either category, you must upload Page 1 and 2 of your FAFSA Submission Summary** to be considered for this scholarship. This information is required for financial need consideration.

## 472: HB Design Scholarship

### Requirements

- GPA: 3.00+
- Major: Graphic design or interactive/web design
- FAFSA: Required - based on financial need
- Colleges: Any four-year public, private non-profit, or for-profit institution in Oregon.
- Enrollment: Full-time enrollment required
- Semifinalists will be required to e-mail a design sample along with a 200-word description that includes the communication objective, intended audience, and the central idea behind the concept; do NOT send this sample and write-up to OSAC; instructions will be e-mailed to semifinalists
- Apply-compete annually, may be received for a maximum of 3 years.

## 808: Herron Family

### Requirements

- Graduates of Lebanon High School OR GED recipients of Linn County
- Residence (county): Linn County
- Enrollment: Must enroll at least half time
- Colleges: Public and nonprofit only
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Financial need is a consideration, FAFSA/ORSAA filing is not required
- Apply-compete annually

## 641: Home Building Foundation - Jim Irvine Statewide Scholarship

### Requirements

- Major: Architecture, construction, engineering (civil, electrical, industrial, management), interior design/architecture, or landscape architecture (preference for civil engineering and construction)
- Career field: Building/construction site management, CAD/CADD drafting and/or design technology, construction trades, engineering technology, general drafting and design technology, or HAC/HACR, HVAC, HVACR technician
- Colleges: Any public or private, nonprofit or for profit, Title IV, postsecondary school in Oregon
- GPA (preference): 3.00+
- Enrollment: Must enroll at least half time
- FAFSA: Required - financial need may or may not be considered
- Apply-compete annually, may be received for a maximum of 4 years.

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- Essay: What experience or person (e.g., mentor, supervisor, etc.) most influenced you in selecting the home building and construction industry as your career? How did it influence you? Length: 350-500 words

## 208: Huffstutter Family Stylist Scholarship

### Requirements

- Residence (state): Oregon or Washington
- Major: Cosmetology, beauty, barbering, hairdresser/hair stylist hair design
- Colleges: Oregon schools offering degrees or certificates in cosmetology or hair design
- Enrollment: Full-time enrollment required
- FAFSA: Required - based on financial need
- Apply-competes for one additional year

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- Non-Oregon Resident Requirement:  
OSAC will *automatically* receive your FAFSA record if you are an Oregon resident *or* a non-Oregon resident with at least one Oregon institution selected on the FAFSA. **If you do not fall into either category, you must upload Page 1 and 2 of your FAFSA Submission Summary** to be considered for this scholarship. This information is required for financial need consideration.

## 628: Jim and Dianna Murphy Scholarship

### Requirements

- Graduates (including GED recipients and home-schooled graduates) of Oregon high schools
- Major: Diesel mechanic/technician, driver/operator of commercial vehicle/bus/truck, or related areas leading to a career in the commercial trucking industry or in diesel technologies
- Colleges: Oregon two-year community colleges and for-profit schools only
- Enrollment: Must enroll at least half time
- FAFSA: Recommended - financial need may or may not be considered
- Apply/compete annually, may be received for a maximum of five academic years.

## 957: K. Miller Scholarship

### Requirements

- Residence (state): Oregon residents
- 1. Graduating high school seniors, prior high school graduates, GED recipients, undergraduates.
- 2. Excludes Home School graduates.
- Major: Career and Technical Education Programs (trade or vocational programs)
- Colleges: Any 2- or 4-year, public or private, nonprofit, Title IV postsecondary school in the United States
- Renewable: Automatically renewable for up to four years if renewal criteria met.
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Financial need is a consideration, FAFSA/ORSAA filing is required

## 231: Kerdragon Scholarship

### Requirements

- High school graduates (including GED recipients) who have not yet attended college
- GPA (preference): 3.00+
- Residence (state): Oregon residents
- Major: Fine arts, graphic arts, or photography
- Enrollment: Must enroll at least half time
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Financial need is a consideration, FAFSA/ORSAA filing is required
- Semifinalists will be asked to submit images of 5 pieces of art they have produced during prior four years or video/film work. Applicants should only apply with appropriate portfolio of work for submission. Instructions for submission will be emailed to semifinalists. Do not send them to OSAC.
- One-time award

## 851: Larry Pfeifer Memorial Scholarship

### Requirements

- Major (preference): Major in Fire Science, Paramedicine, or EMT preferred
- Residence (state): Oregon residents
- Graduating high school seniors and prior high school graduates (including GED recipients and home-schooled students), or college undergraduate students
- Colleges: Any 2- or 4-year public, Title IV, postsecondary school in Oregon
- Enrollment: Part-time enrollment (minimum six credit hours)
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Filing is required. Financial need is not a requirement, but it may be considered
- Apply-competes annually, may be received for a maximum of 4 years.

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- 851 Essay: Describe why you are interested in a career in fire service or emergency medical services (one page maximum PDF upload)

## 80: Maria C. Jackson/General George A. White Scholarship

### Requirements

- **Activities:** Applicants who served, or whose parents serve or have served, in U.S. armed forces and resided in Oregon at time of enlistment
- **GPA:** 3.75+ (there is no GPA requirement for graduate-level students and students attending a technical school)
- **Colleges:** Oregon only
- **Enrollment:** Full-time enrollment required
- **Apply-competes annually,** may be received for a maximum of 4 years.
- **Restriction:** U.S. Bank employees, their children, and near relatives are not eligible
- **FAFSA/ORSA:** Required - based on financial need

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- **Additional document:** Submit proof of service (DD93, DD214, or discharge papers). If the document contains a social security number (SSN), black out the first 5 digits of the SSN before scanning or copying.
- **Additional requirement:** Specify relationship to veteran and the state where that person resided at time of enlistment Length: 50 characters

## 966: Marilyn's Bootstrap Scholarship

### Requirements

- Graduating high school seniors, prior high school graduates, GED recipients, or college undergraduate students. Home schooled students are not eligible.
- Major: Natural and Physical Sciences
- Colleges: Any public or private, nonprofit, Title IV, postsecondary school in the United States
- Colleges (preference): Preference to support students who ultimately aspire to attend four-year institutions.
- Enrollment: Must enroll at least half time
- First-generation college attendee
- Automatically renewable for up to five years if renewal criteria met.
- FAFSA/ORSAA: Required - based on financial need

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- Non-Oregon Resident Requirement:  
OSAC will *automatically* receive your FAFSA record if you are an Oregon resident or a non-Oregon resident with at least one Oregon institution selected on the FAFSA. **If you do not fall into either category, you must upload Page 1 and 2 of your FAFSA Submission Summary** to be considered for this scholarship. This information is required for financial need consideration.
- Essay: Describe the support (or lack thereof) that you have received from your family in your endeavors to pursue a career in the sciences.

## 853: Martin-Baley Family Foundation Scholarship

### Requirements

- Residence (state): Oregon residents
- GPA: 3.0+ cumulative minimum high school/college GPA
- Enrollment: Must enroll at least half time
- Colleges: Oregon public and nonprofit only
- FAFSA/ORSA: Filing is required. Financial need is not a requirement, but it may be considered
- Apply-competitively annually, may be received for a maximum of 4 years.
- Top candidates will be required to participate in an on-line interview through ZOOM.

### Documents & Additional Requirements

- Essay Scholarship 853: In 250 words or less, please tell us why you chose the college/university you chose. Feel free to expand your answer to give the scholarship committee a deeper understanding of the reasoning behind your choice.

**Don't repeat Information (like your GPA)**

**Be clear about academic and career goals**

**Be careful about using too much humor**

## Be comfortable promoting yourself

- **How are you unique?**
- **What are your leadership qualities?**
- **How do you take initiative?**
- **What recognitions have you received?**
- **What are your passions?**



Carefully proofread and get feedback for your essays and applications



**Print it out and read it out loud, slowly**

**Read backwards sentence by sentence**

**Take a break and review it again**

**Have someone else proofread**

## Bad example

Write a statement of your realistic goals. Include your career choice, why you chose this area, and why you feel you will be successful in it.

After high school I plan to attend Oregon State University and study towards a major in electrical engineering. I chose this area of study because it increases us, especially since as time goes on we are becoming more and more dependent on the technologies that we use. I feel that I'll be successful in it because I have already taken classes in electronics and I am a very persistent and hard worker.

## Okay example

Write a statement of your realistic goals. Include your career choice, why you chose this area, and why you feel you will be successful in it.

As I went through high school, my goals and aspirations changed multiple times. I went in to high school thinking I wanted to be a medical examiner for the FBI, but because of my choice of electives I've grown to love something else.

I plan to become one of the few women in the field of Accounting and Finance. I don't want to just sit in a cubicle punching numbers on a 10-key in to a spreadsheet. I want to play a major role in a large firm. I believe that I will succeed because I am a very determined young woman. When I am passionate about something I put everything I have in to it. My advanced coursework and 4.0 GPA reflect that.

## Good example

Write a statement of your realistic goals. Include your career choice, why you chose this area, and why you feel you will be successful in it.

I have decided to study health/ fitness and nutrition next year in college because I want to be able to help people learn how to live healthy. I am still undecided about which career to choose because I want to pick one that will help me make the biggest impact. Whether that means being a health teacher so I can educate students on how to eat well and exercise, or be a nutritionist who works in schools or hospitals so I can work with people's diets directly, I still haven't made that decision. I feel passionate about nutrition because I know many people who struggle with diseases or health problems that have to do with their diet. Basically, I want to be a part of the growing movement that is working to prevent things instead of dealing with the plethora of health problems afterward. I know I sound extremely ambitious but I think if we as a nation start educating the younger generation on how to be in tune with their body, eat healthy, and exercise enough, we can make being healthy the social norm instead of being in the middle of an obesity crisis like we are now. I think I will be successful in this field of study because I am passionate about it and it's easy to be good at something you love to do!

- ✓ **Establish eye contact**
- ✓ **Display confident body language**

# WORDS OF WISDOM

- Be familiar with the application
- Research the “purpose” of the scholarship donor
- Read and follow all directions
- Provide all required documentation
- Allow 72 hours to get official transcript
- Allow 2 weeks to get letters of recommendation
- Type or legibly write in black or blue ink
- Review your application before submitting
- YOU should be the one filling out scholarship applications
