Over her 14-year career at Hopewell-Loudon School, Donna taught second grade, high school business courses, and was the high school guidance counselor. She also served as senior class advisor, school newspaper advisor, yearbook advisor, and was honored with two Hopewell-Loudon yearbook dedications.

In her retirement, Mrs. March continued to support Hopewell-Loudon by assisting with the creation of the H-L Alumni organization, and served on the Hopewell-Loudon Heritage Committee during the construction of the new school. As a memorial to family members, she established two scholarships for Hopewell-Loudon students.

Mrs. March was a very loyal Chieftain fan, and her former students from Hopewell-Loudon think very fondly of and remember her as their beloved “Miss Warns.”
