After graduation from Heidelberg College, Mrs. Rouser began her career as a business teacher at Hopewell-Loudon School in 1964. She taught typing, shorthand, accounting, office practice, economics, speedwriting, business law, and general business. Sandy took on many other duties over the years, including serving 6 times as the senior class advisor, and 5 times as the junior class advisor. She was the student school newsletter advisor for the Scarlet Banner and Tepee Talk. She was responsible for publication and mailing of the district newsletter as well. You could always find her selling football and basketball tickets, which she did for over 15 years, and at proms, class trips, and working concession stands.

Mrs. Rouser was named Who's Who Among America's Teachers in 1995. The Hopewell-Loudon yearbook was dedicated to her 3 times. She was named Hopewell-Loudon Teacher of the Year for the 1990-1991 school year, and was an Honorary FFA Chapter Farmer.

Sandy's devotion to her students did not end at their graduation. She continued her role as a guide and mentor as they started life after high school. She was instrumental in helping them obtain employment using the skills learned in her business classes.

Mrs. Rouser retired from teaching in 1998 after 34 years at Hopewell-Loudon School.
