Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Pleasant Lake Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2025-26 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2024-25. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%, failed to exit CSI status in 2024-25, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Our school has not been given one of these labels.

School Improvement Plan

At Pleasant Lake Elementary we continue to focus our school improvement efforts on supporting the District Improvement goals of student success in literacy and math as well as maintaining a positive school climate. We are focusing on small group instruction using actionable data from multiple assessments supported by our district professional development plans. We are also focusing on our school-wide positive behavior intervention and supports to ensure a positive school climate for all through the use of our Second Step curriculum and PBIS expectations of "Shark Pride": being respectful, responsible, and cooperative in all places and spaces around Pleasant Lake.

In addition to classroom instruction provided by highly-qualified teachers, identified students are supported with services such as Reading Recovery, literacy groups, small group instruction in math, and one-to-one literacy support provided by our Title I Interventionists. This multi-tiered system of support also provides scaffolded instruction for students with disabilities and Multi-Language Learners. Moreover, we provide multiple opportunities to engage parents and guardians in their child's learning, including the provision of strategies and materials that can be utilized at home to support student progress and assistance with Title I parent liaison personnel.

We are focused on achieving the goals below:

- All students at Pleasant Lake Elementary will make their Individual Typical Growth in Math.
- All students at Pleasant Lake Elementary will make their Individual Typical Growth in Reading.

Our goals along with the student leadership mindset challenges students to take leadership of their academic and social success. Pleasant Lake Elementary is a school that creates an environment that assists students become successful leaders well beyond the school day and year.

We are extremely proud of the Reading and Math iReady student growth that our school has exhibited each testing window. The before mentioned performance indicator is evidence that our staff is committed to supporting ALL students to grow and reach their potential.

Achievement Testing

At the elementary level, the Walled Lake Schools has a balanced assessment program to gauge students' progress and provide valuable information to teachers, parents, and students.

The i-Ready mathematics and reading diagnostics are given to students in grades K-5 three times per year. This balanced assessment plan provides teachers and schools with valuable information about each child's growth and allows our professional educators to individualize instruction to meet every child's needs.

Kindergarten through third grade students who are identified as needing an Individual Reading Improvement Plan take the Developmental Reading Assessment (DRA) several times per year to determine students' progress in reading.

For grades K-5 in writing, we utilize rubrics that are aligned with our writing curriculum which assess student growth with narrative, informational, and opinion writing. Last spring all Walled Lake Consolidated Schools students in grades 3-5 participated in the M-STEP state assessments.

Parent-Teacher Conferences

- 442 of Pleasant Lake Elementary students were represented by parents at parent-teacher conferences in 2023-24.
- 399 of Pleasant Lake Elementary students were represented by parents at parent-teacher conferences in 2024-25.
- 92% of Pleasant Lake Elementary students were represented by parents at parent-teacher conferences in 2023-24.
- 98% of Pleasant Lake Elementary students were represented by parents at parent-teacher conferences in 2024-25.
