Executive Summary: Pearland ISD and 240 Certification seek to enter into memorandum of understanding (MOU) between Pearland Independent School District and 240 Certification. 240 Certification (formerly Educators of Excellence) is a Texas Education Agency–approved Educator Preparation Program (EPP) that prepares teacher candidates for state certification through field-based observation, internship, and clinical teaching experiences. This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) establishes a partnership between Pearland ISD and 240 Certification to provide authentic campus-based and/or virtual field placement opportunities for student observers, interns, and clinical/student teachers.

This agreement formalizes a partnership between Pearland ISD and 240 Certification to support the preparation and development of future educators by providing structured field-based observation, internship, and clinical teaching opportunities within district campuses. Through these placements, candidates gain authentic, supervised classroom experience while meeting Texas Education Agency certification requirements, ultimately strengthening the district's educator pipeline and supporting high-quality instruction for students.

Subject: Consider the Renewal of Competitive Sealed Proposal for Bid #24-1119-1 Leased Wide Area Network (Year 2 of 5)

Executive Summary: On February 11, 2025, the Board of Trustees approved Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP) #24-1119-1, awarding a contract with an initial term of five years and the option to extend for up two additional five-year renewals. At this time, the District would like to proceed with the execution of renewal year 2 of 5, in accordance with the terms and conditions outlined in the original submittals.

Competitive Sealed Proposal (CSP) #24-1119-1 was issued to acquire proposals from vendors for Leased Wide Area Network. The CSP was advertised in accordance with Texas Education Code (TEC) Ch. 44.031 and automatically sent to all corresponding vendors registered on our electronic bidding system. Invitations were extended to 570 potential proposers; 4 proposals were received. The District awarded a contract to the vendor whose proposal met the CSP specifications and provided the best value to the District, at a total cost of \$556,500 for an initial term of five (5) years, with the option to negotiate pricing upon optional renewal periods.

Initial Contract Term: July 1, 2025 – September 30, 2030, with two additional five-year renewal options.

Executive Summary: Pearland ISD is applying to the state through the Houston-Galveston Area Council for a truancy continuation grant to support Pearland High School students who have 5 or more absences by providing intervention before the student is considered truant and referred for Truancy Court.

If awarded, the grant funds will continue covering 100% of costs associated with contracting services for the case management of Pearland High School students with 5 or more absences and providing appropriate intervention supports for the 2026-2027 school year. The case management contract is planned for Community in Schools (CIS) of Southeast Harris and Brazoria County, to provide a CIS Site Coordinator program for Pearland High School; additional contracted services are planned for community services referrals, if such interventions are needed.

There is no requirement for district matching costs. The application is for \$63,216.79 for programming plus indirect costs and is due February 12, 2026. If awarded, the grant runs September 1, 2026 – August 31, 2027.

Executive Summary:

In accordance with local policy DEA, the administration submits the attached resolution for consideration by the Board of Trustees. The resolution authorizes salary and wage payments to all employees and long-term substitutes for the date(s)/time missed due to the closure of schools as a result of inclement weather on January 26, 2026. In addition, the resolution provides supplemental compensation to critical wage-earning staff who were required to work during this same period.

Specifically, policy DEA Local states: During an emergency closure, all employees shall continue to be paid for their regular duty schedule unless otherwise provided by Board action. Following an emergency closure, the Board shall adopt a resolution or take other Board action establishing the purpose and parameters for such payments.

Nonexempt employees who are required to work during an emergency closing for a disaster, as declared by a federal, state, or local official or the Board, shall be paid at the rate of one and one-half times their regular rate of pay for all hours worked up to 40 hours per week. Overtime for time worked over 40 hours in a week shall be calculated and paid according to law. The Superintendent or designee shall approve payments and ensure that accurate time records are kept of actual hours worked during emergency closings.

Subject: 2026 Pearland ISD Report

Executive Summary: Purpose: To provide an update on the venue for Pearland ISD's 2026 graduation ceremonies and outline related logistical details for students, families, and guests.

Background:

Pearland ISD traditionally utilizes NRG for graduation ceremonies to accommodate families and guests. Due to the FIFA World Cup events scheduled in the Houston area during spring and summer 2026, NRG Stadium will not be available for district use during the graduation window. As a result, Pearland ISD will host the 2026 graduation ceremonies at Pearland ISD Stadium. We believe that Pearland ISD Stadium offers several advantages that support both operational efficiency and community accessibility. These include:

- Increased convenience for students, families, and community members by hosting ceremonies within Pearland
- Significant cost savings compared to off-site venues
- Greater scheduling flexibility and logistical control
- Continued ability to safely host large-scale district events

Based on these benefits, the district plans to continue utilizing Pearland ISD Stadium for future graduation ceremonies, barring unforeseen circumstances.

Graduation Guest Information:

To ensure a safe and comfortable experience for all attendees and to avoid exceeding stadium capacity, Pearland ISD will not implement a ticket system for graduation ceremonies. However, families are strongly encouraged to limit attendance to no more than ten guests per graduate.

Prohibited Items:

The following items will not be permitted inside the stadium:

- Strollers
- Umbrellas
- Noisemakers
- Large signs
- Balloons

Outside food or drink (clear water bottles only)

Clear Bag Policy:

The district's clear bag policy will be strictly enforced. While guests are encouraged not to bring bags, if possible, the following are permitted:

Executive Summary: The Interim Financial Statement Report provides an estimate for the Fiscal Year 2025-26 six-month period ending December 31, 2025. This report includes an interim statement of revenues and expenditures for all appropriated funds (i.e., General Fund, Food Service Fund, and Debt Service Fund.)

- General Fund – Revenues realized total 43.1% of the budget while actual expenditures total 47.5% which are covered by fund balance reserves.
