# Directions

1. Choose a book. If you are not sure about the book you have chosen, please ask your teacher or Mrs. Knott if the book will work for this project. You must also choose a book that you have access to and are able to read. It could be an online book or an actual book you have.
2. Read the entire book.
3. Complete the trifold board using all of the required elements. Choose the list of required elements that matches your book's genre (fiction or nonfiction). All information must be included to receive full credit. You can type or neatly write your information.
4. Be creative with how you decorate your board. Think about your book and decorate it to match the topic or theme of the book. Use your imagination!
5. Turn in the board when your entire project is complete. It is due by February 27th, but you can also turn it in early.

**Reminder: We encourage you to be very creative with these projects. You can add any additional effects to the board. However, we ask that you do not add any perishable food items because the boards will be on display for several days.**

**\*\*\*Do NOT include your name anywhere on the front of your project. Your name is already written on the back of the board. You will be assigned a number for judging so it is anonymous\*\*\***

# 2nd-3rd Grade

## Definitions

### **Title**

- The name of the book

### **Author**

- The name of the person who wrote the book

### **Characters**

- The most important characters in the story
- May be people, animals, or other objects

### **Setting**

- The time and place of the story

### **Summary**

- The main things that happened in the story
- Describe the important events in order
- Your teacher may have called this the plot

### **Author's Purpose**

- The reason the author wrote the story

### **Theme**

- The lesson or message of the story

### **Problem and Solution**

- The main problem that the character faces and how that problem is solved

### **Book review**

- A paragraph that tells us your thoughts and opinions about the book.
- Would you recommend that others read this book? Why or why not?

### **Genre**

- What genre, or category, is your book?

### **Interesting Facts**

- List 3 interesting facts you learned from the book.

### **Interesting Words**

- List 3 interesting words you found in the book. Give their definition.
