### January Recap and February: Screeners and Intervention Continues

Wishram High and Elementary School uses screeners to give insight to teachers about how their students are performing academically. Additionally, this helps identify students who may benefit from intervention support. This year we used EasyCBM grades K-8 and MAPS for grades K-12.

Cycle 2 ended on January 9th and Cycle 3 interventions began on February 3rd. They will be 6 week cycles to provide additional literacy skills supports for students K-12. Parents are notified via a take home letter about intervention details and updates on their progress.
