For the 2024-2025 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given. Our school was labeled as needing targeted support and interventions

Our eleventh-grade students were able to take the SAT during the 2024-2025 school year. The results indicate that Flushing High School is competitive with county and state averages in all areas of assessment. Additionally, in 2024-2025, students in ninth and tenth grades also participated in state testing via the PSAT 10 and PSAT 8/9 assessments. The addition of testing in younger grades provides students, staff, and parents with valuable data that will allow for both better growth tracking and improved instruction. Our ninth and tenth graders were also competitive with other county schools in most areas.

State law requires that we also report the following additional information:

1. Students who live within the designated school boundaries can attend Flushing High School. Families who are not residents of Flushing Community School may apply for Out of District Schools of Choice. Please contact Mr. Kevin Foltz, Principal, for assistance.
2. Our school is following the district MICIP plan. We have goals written to support 10% growth in ELA scores on M-Step or PSAT/SAT over the next five years. To view a copy, please submit a request to our main office.
3. Flushing High School provides instruction for students in grades 9-12. Some juniors and seniors attend the Genesee Career Institute for a portion of the day which provides instruction for students from each of the county's public high schools. During the 2024-2025 school year, we also provided education to our students through our Alternative Education program. Flushing Community Schools continued to offer the Raider Virtual Academy (RVA) which is an online learning program. During the 2024-2025 school year, we also completed the seventh year of our Early College Program Flushing Raider Early College (FREC).
4. Curriculum is developed and implemented based on the Michigan Merit Curriculum and aligned with the Common Core Standards and Michigan High School expectations. Our curriculum is on a rotation basis in which each year there is

at least one subject area that goes through a curriculum rewrite as needed. This includes the incorporation of the Common Core in all subject areas. For a copy of the core curriculum, please contact Mr. Kevin Foltz, Principal.

5. Flushing High School students are near the state level at all grade levels in all academic areas on the Michigan Merit Exam (MME).

6. During the 2024-2025 school year, we offered families the opportunity to attend conferences in-person at FHS. During our fall conferences, 33% of students were represented while 30% of our students were represented at spring conferences. Although these percentages fall short of the 100% attendance rate that we desire, our parents are in communication with staff throughout the school year through telephone conversations, email communication, and tracking their child's progress on ParentVue/StudentVue.

7. During the 2024-2025 school year, Flushing High School had 104 students take a total of 605 Dual Enrollment classes. During the 2024-2025 school year, Flushing High School offered ten Advanced Placement classes, including AP Art Drawing, AP PreCalculus, AP Calculus, AP Chemistry, AP Human Geography, AP Language, AP Statistics, AP US Government, AP US History, and AP World History. Based on student interest, we were able to run all ten of the courses. We also had 19 students taking online AP Classes (AP Psychology, Physics 1, Computer Science, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Biology, European History, Spanish, & Environmental Science). During the 2024-2025 school year, 190 Flushing High School students were enrolled in one or more Advanced Placement classes (online and in-person).

During the 2024-2025 school year, Flushing High School students attempted a total of 285 AP Exams. Of those exams, 235 of the exams were passed earning a qualifying score leading to college credit with a 82% success rate.

Flushing High School enjoyed an outstanding 2024-2025 school year both inside and outside the classroom. We are proud to announce that 284 students received their high school diploma upon meeting the requirements for graduation in June. The Class of 2025 also posted SAT scores at or above the state and county averages.

Flushing High School students were also successful outside of the classroom. The Marching Band continued to score as one of the top ten marching bands in the state of Michigan. Our Concert Band and Wind Ensemble both received first division ratings at the District & State Band Festivals. In addition to their MCBA competitions, our marching band was able to perform the National Anthem at a Detroit Tigers game for the fourth year in a row.

Flushing High School took 1st place in the Flint Metro League Math/Science Competition finishing ahead of eleven other schools. At the 2025 Michigan Industrial & Technology Education Society (MITES) State Student Project Competition, Flushing High School entered 72 CAD/Engineering projects into the regional competition, of which 68 finished high enough to qualify for the State Competition. At the State level, of those 68 projects, 10 were awarded a 1st place, 6 were awarded a 2nd place, and 7 were awarded a 3rd place. Additionally, three projects were selected as GRAND awards, meaning they were the best projects in the entire state regardless of age group, etc. One GRAND award was won in Mechanical Drafting, one GRAND award for Architectural Drafting, and one GRAND award for Additive Manufacturing. Finally, one project was selected to win the Divisional Award, meaning it was selected as the best project for that age group out of all submissions in all categories. Our Flushing Raider Robotics team continues to have a great deal of success throughout the season. They ranked 8 of 39 at the FIM District Milford Event and 15 of 39 at the FIM District Kettering University #2 Event. Their overall rank was 259 of 619 teams in the FIRST in Michigan District.

Our men's and women's athletic teams did well, earning several championships during the 2024-2025 school year. The boys' and girls' tennis, and boys' golf teams won league championships. Our boys' track teams won a divisional championship. The volleyball team won an MHSAA district championship. We had eleven individuals qualify for the

state finals. Six of our coaches earned Coach of the Year recognition. Additionally, we had 21 individuals, and five teams earned academic all-state honors during the 2024-2025 school year. Flushing High School was the Flint Metro League Stripes Division overall points Champion in 2024-2025, this was the first time since the 2014-2015 school year.

Our drama department continues to perform at a level recognized throughout the state. Our students also continue to put in countless hours volunteering and raising money for local charities including our Blueberry Ambassadors, Rotary Interact Club, KEY Club, International Club, and Student Council.

We are very proud of our students and their accomplishments throughout the 2024-2025 school year. We look forward to even greater successes in the coming years.
