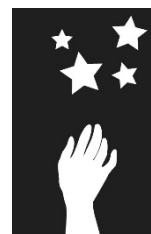

### Scholarship History:

This scholarship was created in 2024 by Bill’s family members from the memorial gifts received following Bill’s death.

**Eligibility:** This \$1,000 non-renewable scholarship will be awarded to a student from Central High School who played varsity baseball for at least two years at Central, and who intends to pursue higher education at either a 2- year or 4-year accredited college or university. Students must have a minimum GPA of 3.0. They do NOT need to pursue playing baseball at the collegiate level.

**Requirements:** Applicants must have graduated from Central High School to be eligible to apply for this scholarship. In addition to requirements listed above, applicants should exhibit the following qualities: be a student/athlete, assume a leadership role, have coachability, show a strong work ethic, have a team attitude, and the heart and passion for baseball. A short (300 word or less) essay on “How Central High baseball has made a difference in my life” is also required on the application.

### Deadline & Application:

Application deadline is February 22, on or before 11:59 P.M.

**Award:** This is an annual \$1,000, non-renewable scholarship that will be awarded until the funds are depleted.

**Selection Committee:** Applications will be reviewed and the winner selected by the scholarship committee comprised of: Central Baseball Coach (Colin Gisel), Central Athletic

Failure to submit the Student Information Form may forfeit an award. Award funds will be distributed to the institution of enrollment in August.
