HOW TO APPLY

1. APPLY ONLINE AT PORTAL.MTEC.EDU

Applying is free and easy. First-time applicants can only choose “undecided” as a program choice.

2. ENTRANCE ASSESSMENT

Admission requirements may be met by taking the Entrance Assessment OR by providing qualifying documentation. The Entrance Assessment can be taken at at the Lehi, Provo, or Payson campus. To waive the assessment, proper documentation can be brought to a Testing Center or emailed to transcripts@mtec.edu.

After this step, a Student ID and login information will be provided.

3. PROGRAM-SPECIFIC PREREQUISITES

Some programs have required prerequisites that must be completed before registration. To find these requirements, please visit the individual program webpage.

4. REGISTRATION & PAYMENT

Once previous steps have been completed, eligibility is met to register for the first course within each program. Registration opens at 8:00 AM on the assigned registration day and is on a first-come, first-served basis. Tuition and fees are due for the first course upon registration. Students can register online through Learning Stream.

High school students must register with their high school and MTECH separately.

5. ORIENTATION & STUDENT ID

New Student Orientation can be completed online at mtec.edu/orientation.

Student ID cards are given within the first week of class by instructors. To ensure this happens, a photo must be taken by the Testing Center (typically completed with Entrance Assessment).
