OTHER EXPENSES

Books	Expenses vary according to each student’s course selections but typically average \$500 per year.
Laptop Computer	NMH recommends an Apple (Mac) or Microsoft Windows-based laptop computer manufactured within the last three years. Estimated costs range from \$300 to \$1,200. Apple iPads, Microsoft Surface tablets, and Chromebooks are not recommended as a student’s primary computer.
Student Personal Spending	While at NMH, students’ spending needs will vary based on their individual circumstances. These may include snacks, personal care items, clothing, gifts, athletics gear, local shopping, restaurants, theater, and occasional admission charges to campus events. Student budgets for incidental items vary greatly. Families should discuss a budget they feel is appropriate.
Travel	A charter bus to New York City, Boston, or airports costs \$50 to \$100 for a one-way trip.
Cellphone	Students are required to have a cellphone from a domestic carrier that accepts text messages.
Other Possible Costs	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Athletics gear (team apparel and/or equipment): approximately \$150 per sport. • College application fees and SAT/PSAT/ACT fees will vary. • Costs not covered by your health insurance and transportation to a doctor’s office. • Music and dance lessons: \$75 per one-hour lesson for 2025-26 • Performing arts gear (dance shoes, leotards, etc.): approximately \$150.

***EXPLANATION OF SCHOOL FEES**

Activities	This fee covers expenses associated with a student’s initial ID card, post office box rental, registration and orientation, and school activities.
Technology	This fee covers software and network resources, internet access, maintenance, and support.
Health Services	This fee covers routine physician and nursing services and overnight stays at the O’Connor Health and Wellness Center.
Tuition Refund Plan	This plan is billed at 1.85% of your tuition responsibility (tuition less grant). This plan is mandatory unless the full year’s tuition and fees are paid by July 1 and the option to waive this plan is chosen on the Enrollment Agreement. See details of the coverage available . This fee may be waived if certain conditions are met.
Health Insurance	Health insurance is mandatory for all students. All international students with F-1 status, without exception, are required to enroll in the school insurance plan. You will be asked to enroll and pay for the school insurance plan no later than June 15. All other students are required to provide proof of valid primary healthcare insurance. A copy of the front and back of your health insurance card is required in the Magnus Health Portal when completing health forms in June.
Meals	The fee for meals is charged to day students only. It covers all meals for which a student is required to be on campus.
International Student	This fee is for international students with F-1 status. It covers the maintenance of students’ Form I-20s and their SEVIS record.

All fees are mandatory except where noted.

BILLING SCHEDULE AND PAYMENT OPTIONS

The Northfield Mount Hermon experience enriches each student’s development. As the cost is substantial, we want to provide you with information about billing schedules and financing options that can make this opportunity affordable for your family. These financing plans can supplement need-based financial assistance or can provide primary funding sources for those families ineligible for financial aid.

Standard Biannual Option	NMH traditionally bills twice a year: The first 65% of a family’s portion of tuition and fees is due on July 1, 2026; the remaining 35% is due on Nov. 1, 2026.
Nine-Month Payment Plan <i>(not available to families of graduating seniors or postgraduates)</i>	This plan divides the cost of tuition and mandatory fees into nine equal payments (June to February). There is a nonrefundable application fee of \$50.
Seven-Month Payment Plan <i>(exclusive to seniors and postgraduates)</i>	This plan divides the cost of tuition and mandatory fees into seven equal payments (June to December). There is a nonrefundable application fee of \$50.
