Blended Learning

Blended learning combines traditional face-to-face activities with online education. Students learn through online delivery of content and instruction. This allows some students control over time, place, path, or pace. Blended learning classes are available to 11th/12th grade students. A great option for a more flexible schedule, allowing a later start or earlier finish to the school day.



Online (21f courses)

In 2013, the State School Aid Act established that Michigan public school students (with the consent of parent or legal guardian) may enroll in up to two virtual courses per term as requested by the students. A catalog of online courses can be made available through the LOHS counselor, who can provide specific enrollment procedures and guidelines.
