Pin Pals: This fun club run by Ms. Westad will introduce students to the mechanics and etiquette of tenpin bowling. They will then practice their skills. Students may or may not use bumpers depending on their skill level. Students will be provided their own lane, ball (if necessary), and shoes (if necessary) for each one hour session. Students will be transported to the bowling alley. **Students will not be transported back to the school.** Parents will be required to pick up their child/children from the bowling alley promptly at 4:00 PM. This is for **grades 3-6.**



Volleyball: This Volleyball course introduces students to the fundamentals of volleyball in a fun, supportive environment. Participants build skills such as passing, serving, teamwork, and sportsmanship through age-appropriate drills and games, while staying active and developing confidence.
This fun club run by Ms. Fisher is for **Grades 3-6**



STEM Club: Do you want to join our fun, hands-on club where curious kids can explore Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math through exciting experiments, building challenges, and creative projects like, robot building, simple coding, and designing structures, fostering teamwork, critical thinking, and a lifelong love for discovery in a playful setting. Students will be introduced to Merge Cubes and Tale Bot Robots during Session 3. This exciting STEM club run by Ms. Cooke is for **Grades 3-6.**



Local History Mystery: Come join this afterschool enrichment session led by Mrs. Jill Boucher that explores the history of Fort Edward through the stories of Jane McCrea, Sarah McNeil, and Duncan Campbell. Students investigate these historical figures while building curiosity and a stronger connection to local history.
This class is for **grades 3-6.**



Escape Room: In this enriching class students will develop skills to "escape" a room. Creative thinking is involved in set/staging design while critical thinking skills will be practiced to escape both virtual and actual rooms. Students will then create an escape room of their own and invite people to try it out. The feedback received from the invitees will be used to imitate the iterative process used in engineering design.
This class taught by Ms. Potter is for grades 4, 5 and 6.



Wrestling: Students will be introduced to the fundamentals of amateur folkstyle wrestling (high school wrestling).
Some of the many benefits of wrestling include: confidence, body awareness, sportsmanship development, respect for peer competitors and fitness.
This exciting class run by Mr. Terry is for **Grades 3 and 4.**
