MHS Box 2: Employability Skills Information

Project-Based Learning: Allows students to gain knowledge and skills by working for an extended period of time to investigate and respond to an authentic, engaging and complex question, problem, or challenge. Students engage in a rigorous, extended process of asking questions, finding resources, and applying information. These projects can be established within certain Capstone classes, and must include creation of a student work product that is validated by the high school. Completion of Verification Form with Essay is required.

Service-Based Learning: Integrates meaningful service to enrich and apply academic knowledge, teach civic and personal responsibility (and other employability skills), and strengthen communities. At MHS, **participation in a school-based activity that is co-curricular/extra-curricular such as sports, clubs and activities can count toward accumulation of points.** These points can be added together so the student can accumulate 8 TOTAL POINTS over the course of their time at MHS. See the chart below for activities and points awarded. Completion of Verification Form with Essay is required.

Work-Based Learning: Allows students to apply classroom theories to practical problems, to explore career options, and pursue personal and professional goals. This includes activities that occur in workplaces and involve an employer assigning a student meaningful job tasks to develop their skills, knowledge, and readiness for work. **Hours spent working at a part-time job can be counted toward this requirement.** (Students must be able to produce a paystub if asked.) Completion of Verification Form with Essay is required.

All Indiana students are required to complete the Box 2 requirement for Graduation Pathways. Students can do so by being active in clubs, sports, and other extracurricular activities and must accumulate 80 hours of service (8 points TOTAL) during their time in high school. Students participating in activities not listed above are encouraged to talk with their school counselors to see if those activities can count toward the Box 2 requirement.
