

 - AP English Language and Composition (1 credit)

12th Grade

- Students can replace **English 12** (1 credit) with one of the following:
 - Introduction to College English (1 credit)
 - College I & II (1 credit and if taken in the high school building)
 - AP English Literature and Composition (1 credit)

Timeline of Scheduling

February 6th at 3:00 PM

- Scheduling request window opens for all students to request their courses.

February 16th at 8:00 PM

- The scheduling request window will close and students will no longer be able to request courses.

February 17th- April 1st:

- Counselors meet with students to ensure they have all the courses needed to stay on track to graduate.

Advanced Placement ,Concurrent Enrollment, & Dual Enrollment Courses

PVHS offers numerous options for students to earn college credit while still in high school.

- **Advanced Placement-** Earn a 3 or higher on an AP exam to earn credits
- **Concurrent Enrollment-** You need a C or higher in a class to earn credits.

Concurrent Enrollment courses:

- **AP English Language and Composition:** Earn 4 credits through Moravian
- **AP Statistics:** Earn 4 credits through Moravian
- **General and Special Education Essentials:** 6 credits through Northampton Community College.
- **Early Childhood Development and Learning:** 6 credits through Northampton Community College.
- **College English I & II:** Dual Enrollment course. 6 credits through Northampton Community College.
-NCC Instructor comes in and teaches the course with PV teacher support.

Advanced Placement (AP) Request Information

- AP courses listed in PVHS Program of studies
- Your AP scores could earn you college credit or advanced placement (meaning you could skip certain courses in college).

- Required to take the AP Exam if taking an AP course (unless taking the course as concurrent enrollment)
- The district will pay for all AP Exams or will pay for concurrent enrollment (one or the other)
- Students that request an AP course during the course request window must also complete an **AP Course Request Form** and submit it to the guidance office no later than **February 17th**. If approved, the AP course will be added to the students schedule.

Dual Enrollment Opportunities

- The student will be responsible for getting themselves to and from the accredited institution.
- These classes will not count towards the students' High School credits or cumulative average. The student must be in good academic standing to be eligible (coming into their senior year with at least 19 credits).
- The student can sign up to do dual enrollment outside of school hours as an 11th grader. As a 12th grader, it can be during school hours.
- Classes can be taken through NCC or ESU
- Please see your school counselor for a sign-up form and more information about eligibility requirements.



Traditional Pathway to Keystone Exam Completion

End-of-Course Keystone Title	Associated Course	Grade Taken	Keystone Exam Administration
Algebra I Keystone	Algebra 1 (or equivalent)	9*	Spring (May)
	Algebra 1A/1B	10	
Biology Keystone	Biology (or equivalent)	9	Spring (May)
Literature Keystone	English 10 (or equivalent)	10	Spring (May)

Keystone Proficiency: Students achieving a minimum scaled score of **1500** **or better** in each of the three Keystone Exams (Algebra I, Biology, and Literature) demonstrate Keystone Proficiency and meet statewide requirements for high school graduation.

*or 8th grade for some advanced math students





If remediation and retesting have been attempted and you are still unsuccessful, Guidance will help you determine the next steps to achieve a graduation pathway alternatively (3, 4, or 5)

Keystone Proficiency PATHWAY

Meets proficiency or advanced on each of the Keystone Exams

- Algebra I
- Biology
- Literature

Keystone Composite PATHWAY

Demonstrate proficiency by earning a satisfactory composite score on the Algebra I, Literature, and Biology Keystone Exams of 4452

Must achieve at least a proficient score on one of the three exams and no less than a basic score on the remaining two

CTE PATHWAY

1. Successful completion of Keystone course
2. **AND** the attainment of **one** of the following:
 - a. An industry-based competency certification
 - b. Demonstration of a high likelihood of

- c. Readiness for continued meaningful engagement in the CTE concentrator's program of study

Alternate Assessment PATHWAY

1. Successful completion of Keystone course
2. **AND** the attainment of **one** of the following:
 - a. Established score on an approved alternate assessment (SAT, PSAT, ACT, ASVAB, AP, IB)
 - b. Successful completion of a concurrent course

- c. Successful completion of a pre-apprenticeship program
- d. Accepted in an accredited 4-year nonprofit institution of higher education and have evidence of the ability to enroll in college-level coursework

Evidence Based PATHWAY

1. Successful completion of Keystone course
2. Three pieces of evidence consistent with the student's goals and career plans

Other PATHWAY

1. Graduation based on IEP team decisions based upon academic goals
2. Superintendent's waiver for students with extenuating circumstances (5%)
