Dear parents and pupils,

Uniform

Following pupil and parent consultation, our uniform policy has been updated over the last year. All pupils consulted wanted to continue to have a distinct school identity however they wanted to try to exercise more of their individual identity by having some more choices. We were happy to support this movement however do ask that all pupils are in their chosen full uniform at all times from September.

The key changes we made were as follows:

- The full range of choices are available to all pupils across lower, middle and upper school.
- Pupils may wear trainers that are fully black and have a fully black sole. No additional colours on footwear are allowed. For example, no coloured writing or slogans, no white soles.
- There are no stipulation on the colour of socks.
- There are no stipulation on the colour of bags.

There is no requirement to have badged items however this is fully acceptable for those that wish to do so. Iron on badges are also available from local stockists.

The uniform from September is therefore as follows for pupils of all ages:

Bottoms

Choose from grey tailored shorts, culottes, trousers, skirt, pinafore or Nantgwyn tartan skirt or pinafore.

Leggings, jeans, sportswear are not permitted.

Tops

Choose from a white or royal blue polo t shirt or a white shirt or blouse. Where a white cotton shirt is worn, it must be accompanied by a Nantgwyn tie.

Choose from a plain and unbranded royal blue or navy sweatshirt, a royal blue or navy cardigan, or a navy v neck knitted jumper.

A navy blazer may be worn if a pupil so wishes.

Hoodies are not permitted. Branded sweatshirts are not permitted.

Footwear

Any fully black sensible footwear including plain black trainers with black soles. No additional colours are permitted on footwear.

Crocs, high heels, flip flops are examples of footwear that is not sensible for the school environment.

PE

- Black or navy shorts, jogging bottoms or leggings
- Royal blue or white t-shirt
- Optional royal blue quarter zip sweatshirt
- Trainers

Pupils should bring their PE kit to school with them when they have PE on their timetable and should change into their PE kit in school at the start of the PE lesson.

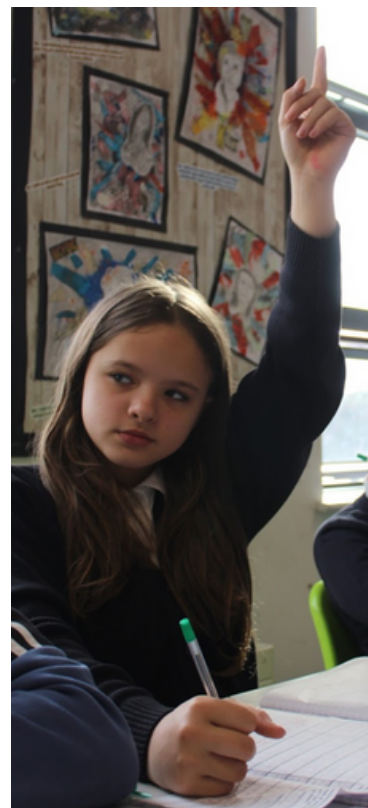
Equipment

Pupils will need to bring to school the following equipment:

- blue/ black writing pen
- spare pen
- a green pen
- pencils
- ruler
- rubber
- protractor
- scientific calculator
- a note book
- a reading book/ reading material

Parents may also want to purchase but they are not compulsory:

- coloured pencils
- felt pens
- highlighters
- sticky notes



Hwb and Google Classroom

Pupils use Hwb and Google Classroom as part of a blended learning approach. Pupils will be set tasks by their teachers and should upload their work to this area. Pupils will receive their account details for Google Classroom from their form tutor along with their Hwb account details.



YSGOL NANTGWYN: OUR CURRICULUM

VISION

At Ysgol Nantgwyn, our curriculum vision is based around our school statement; 'when we are ready, respectful and responsible, everything is possible'. It takes into account our school population and their needs and helps them to be ready to respond to the demands of our world and be responsible and respectful in doing so. To support this, it is informed by our local, regional, national and global context. The Ysgol Nantgwyn curriculum ensures that all pupils gain good knowledge and skills through a range of learning experiences so that they make good progress from nursery to year 11 and are ready to be successful in their chosen pathway when they leave school.

OUR CURRICULUM

The Ysgol Nantgwyn curriculum is designed to take account of the needs of all pupils and offers a broad and balanced range of experiences for all pupils. We recognise that pupils are individuals and therefore the way in which they experience the curriculum may differ. Our curriculum is iterative in its development and provides opportunities for pupils to inform and lead their learning. It provides opportunities for pupils to have meaningful learning experiences, to consider themselves and others and the part they can play in their local community as well as the wider world. The Ysgol Nantgwyn curriculum presents pupils with a range of big questions, gives them the opportunity to ask questions and enables their development of knowledge and skills in the exploration of possible answers through a variety of learning experiences. Our staff will carefully listen to our pupils and ensure that their thoughts, views and needs inform their learning.

Through consultation with pupils, parents, staff and governors, we have agreed that our curriculum will place increased emphasis on the following identified needs:

- Understanding their responsibilities and rights
- Respecting the rights and needs of others
- Thinking creatively to solve problems
- Sharing ideas and emotions in a variety of ways
- Setting goals
- Speaking and listening to others effectively
- Building up and applying knowledge
- Forming good relationships based on trust and mutual respect
- Building mental and emotional well-being

AREAS OF LEARNING AND EXPERIENCE

Our curriculum will provide learning which encompasses six areas of learning and experience. These are:

- Language, literacy and communication
- Mathematics and numeracy
- Expressive arts
- Humanities
- Health and well-being
- Science and technology

Each area of learning and experience has a set of 'what matters' statements. Staff use these statements and the concepts within them to design and plan the learning for pupils. These statements support pupils to make good progress by developing the skills and knowledge gained from their learning experiences from nursery through to year 11.

Our curriculum ensures that pupils learn about diversity, human rights and the rights of the child, relationships and sexuality education (RSE), Welsh and religion, values and ethics (RVE).

FOUR PURPOSES

Our curriculum will be designed, developed and delivered with the four purposes at the centre to ensure that pupils become:

- Ambitious, capable learners, ready to learn throughout their lives.
- Enterprising, creative contributors, ready to play a full part in life and work.
- Ethical, informed citizens of Wales and the world.
- Healthy, confident individuals, ready to lead fulfilling lives as valued members of society.

CROSS CURRICULAR

Our pupils will develop skills and knowledge relating to literacy (oracy, reading and writing), numeracy (including reasoning) and digital competence across the full breadth of the curriculum.

DESIGN

Our curriculum design has been informed by our pupils, parents, governors and community members and staff as well as our cluster schools and external partners. Our design has centred around ensuring an inclusive, progressive curriculum that meets the needs of our pupils to ensure that they have the very best experience at school and are ready to succeed in the opportunities and challenges that will present throughout their life.

ASSESSMENT

Assessment will continue to be part of our daily teaching and learning as pupils and teachers use information from time spent with pupils to plan the next steps in each individual pupils' learning. As part of this process, pupils will engage with feedback from teachers about their learning so that they know how well they are doing and what they can do to improve and progress. Ysgol Nantgwyn will review the progress of each individual pupil regularly across the year and use this information to plan for individuals and groups to ensure that all make at least good progress and are well supported in doing so. We will report to pupils and parents about progress and approach to learning at regular points in the year.

REVIEW

The Ysgol Nantgwyn curriculum will go through a process of iterative evaluation and development to ensure that all pupils are experiencing the very quality of provision that we can provide. We will work with a range of people to gather a range of information from many different activities that include pupils, parents and teachers to inform our evaluations and planning for development. These evaluations will sit as part of our robust monitoring and evaluation work.

Independent learning

We call our homework independent learning and it is our expectation that all pupils complete this in line with the deadline. Independent learning tasks support and strengthen the learning that has taken place in class and, on occasions, is essential for helping to understand future learning. For nursery through to year 8, there will be one task per curriculum area per half term. Pupils receive positive points for all tasks that they complete. Please could you encourage your child to complete these tasks - sheets are emailed to pupils and Parentmailed to parents at the same time so that you are aware of the expectations for your child.

Attendance

At Ysgol Nantgwyn we expect all pupils to have 95% or more attendance. When children attend school consistently they are more likely to do well with their studies but also build strong relationships and feel connected with the school community. It also demonstrates reliability which will help prepare children for life beyond education and looks positive to future employers.

Attendance to school- How can parents help?

- Make school attendance a priority and talk about the importance of attending school every day.
- Ensure that your child attends school on time so that they do not miss their morning mark.
- Help your child maintain daily routines, such as finishing homework, packing their bag the night before and getting a good night's sleep.
- Try not to schedule dental and medical appointments during the school day.
- Don't let your child stay home unless truly sick. Complaints of headaches or stomach aches may be signs of anxiety.
- Talk to your child's school team if they have any worries or anxieties about school- these can quite often be resolved easily.
- Check on your child's attendance to be sure absences are not piling up.
- Ask for help from the school, other parents or community agencies if you're having trouble getting your child to school.

Unauthorised absences

It is vitally important that your child's absence is reported to us on the first day of absence and each subsequent day of absence unless there has been medical authorisation for a period of absence granted on day one. Reasons for not attending school should be specific rather than 'unwell.' Please can parents use www.mychildatschool.com to report absence. It is very quick and easy to do this. If you are unsure or do not have your login details, please contact your child's relevant school team who will be happy to help. Medical evidence is required to authorise absences.

Reporting absences

Parents will need to go to MyChildAtSchool > Dashboard > Attendance > click on the Report an Absence button.

- Pupils will receive their individual access code during their first week in September.



Mobile phone and device policy

Mobiles may be in school but they must not be seen or heard. “Out of sight is alright” - “On display - taken away”

Mobile phones are not permitted to be used or seen on the school site at any time unless permitted by a member of staff (this includes break and lunch times). All pupils must not under any circumstances take a mobile phone into a room or other area where examinations are being held. Any portable device such as airpods / headphones / smart watches should not be used or visible whilst moving around the school site. This does not include those pupils who require the use of electronic devices as an essential tool for their learning or safety.

If parents need to contact their children urgently they should phone the school office and a message can be relayed promptly.

If a pupil is seen with or using a mobile phone (or other portable device), the phone will be confiscated by a member of staff and stored safely and securely within the school building.

Schools are permitted to confiscate phones from learners under sections 91 and 94 of the Education and Inspections Act 2006.

If a mobile phone needs to be confiscated, then:

The pupil will be expected to hand the phone to the member of staff in line with this school policy . The mobile phone will be stored safely and securely so that it is returned to the correct person. The reasons for confiscation will be recorded on Class Charts.

If a pupil refuses to hand over their mobile phone to any member of staff then parents will be contacted to attend a meeting at school immediately. This rule similarly applies to the use of headphones / smartwatches / airpods.

1st time The mobile phone will be confiscated. 2 negative behaviour points will be issued on Class Charts The phone can be collected at the end of the day by the pupil from pupil reception.

2nd time The mobile phone will be confiscated. 5 negative behaviour points will be issued on Class Charts The phone can be collected after the end of the school day, but no later than 15:30, by the parent from main reception. If not, it will be held until the end of the next school day, and so on.

Third time The mobile phone will be confiscated. 10 negative points will be issued on Class Charts The phone can be collected after the end of the school day, but no later than 15:30, by the parent from main reception. If not, it will be held until the end of the next school day, and so on. Parents will be invited to school to meet with a member of the school team to discuss the continuous breach of this policy.

Uniform grants

Welsh Government issue all pupils eligible for free school meals in year 7 with a uniform grant, details on how to apply can be found below. Online Payments

Ysgol Nantgwyn uses a completely cashless system. Ysgol Nantgwyn use the Local Authority Online Payment System for parents and carers can make secure payments for school lunch money and school activities with no transaction fees. Example activities for online payments could be a school trip, a revision guide, music lessons or any reason you may have to pay money to the school. Please set up an account directly with RCT on their website (details below) and over the summer your child's unique 10 digit reference number for the catering service will be sent to you during the first week of September for new pupils (Existing Ysgol Nantgwyn pupils' codes will remain the same). New pupils will still be able to receive lunches whilst they are waiting to receive their code for the first week. **It is suggested that all pupils bring a packed lunch on their first day.**
