The Gilbert School Class of 2007 was pleased to welcome Rear Admiral Karen Flaherty Oxler, graduate of the Class of 1970, as Commencement Speaker for this year's graduation ceremonies. Mrs. Oxler joined the United States Navy as a Corps Candidate in July of 1973. She is a graduate of Skidmore College and received a master of science degree from the University of Pennsylvania.

With more than 30 years' experience in the United States Navy, Mrs. Oxler has served reserve tours at several Naval Fleet Hospitals and was recalled in support of Operation Desert Shield/Storm with Fleet Hospital 15, Al Jubail, Saudi Arabia, in February of 1991. She has also served in a variety of roles that include commanding officer for Naval Reserve Hospital Fort Dix, a 500 bed field hospital.

She was recently selected for promotion to the rank of Rear Admiral (Lower Half) for the Navy Nurse Corps, Reserve Component. She is one of only four women in the Nursing Corps to hold this prestigious rank.

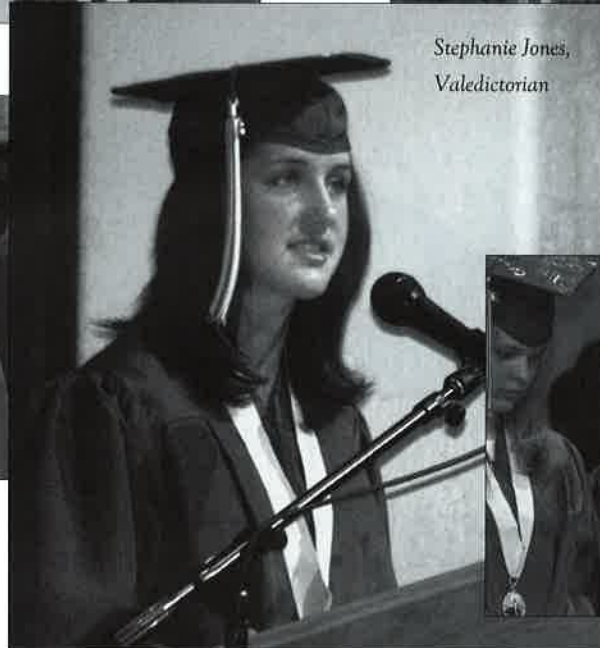
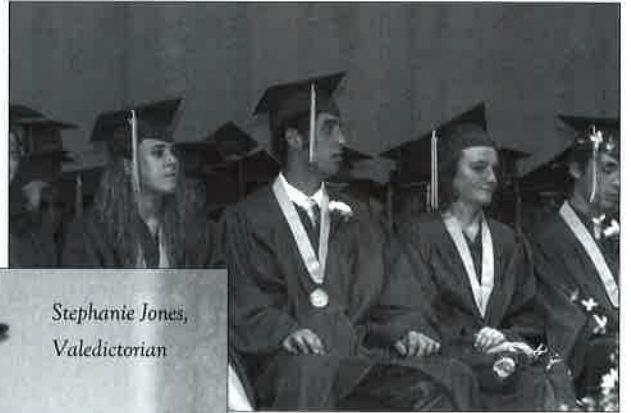
Mrs. Oxler is currently associate director for patient and nursing services at the Philadelphia VA Medical Center, a position she has held since September 2001. ❖

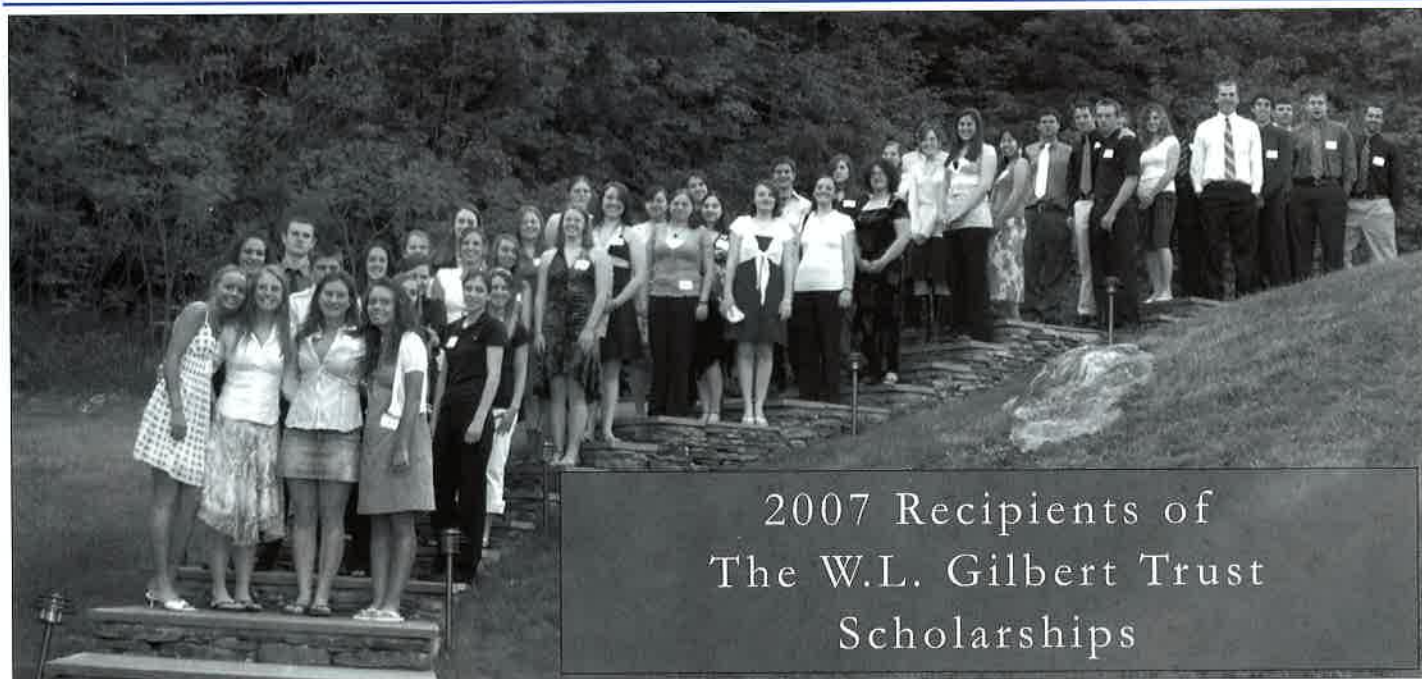

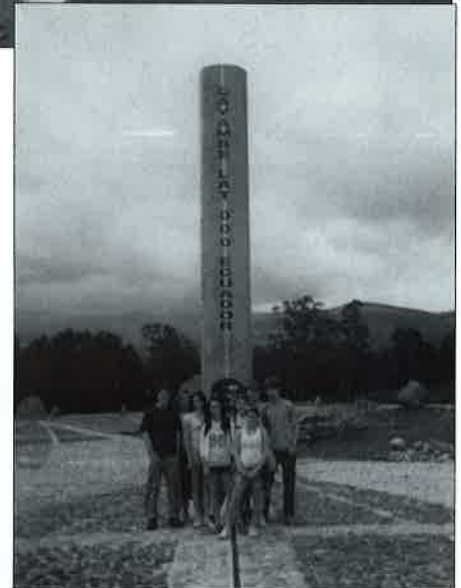

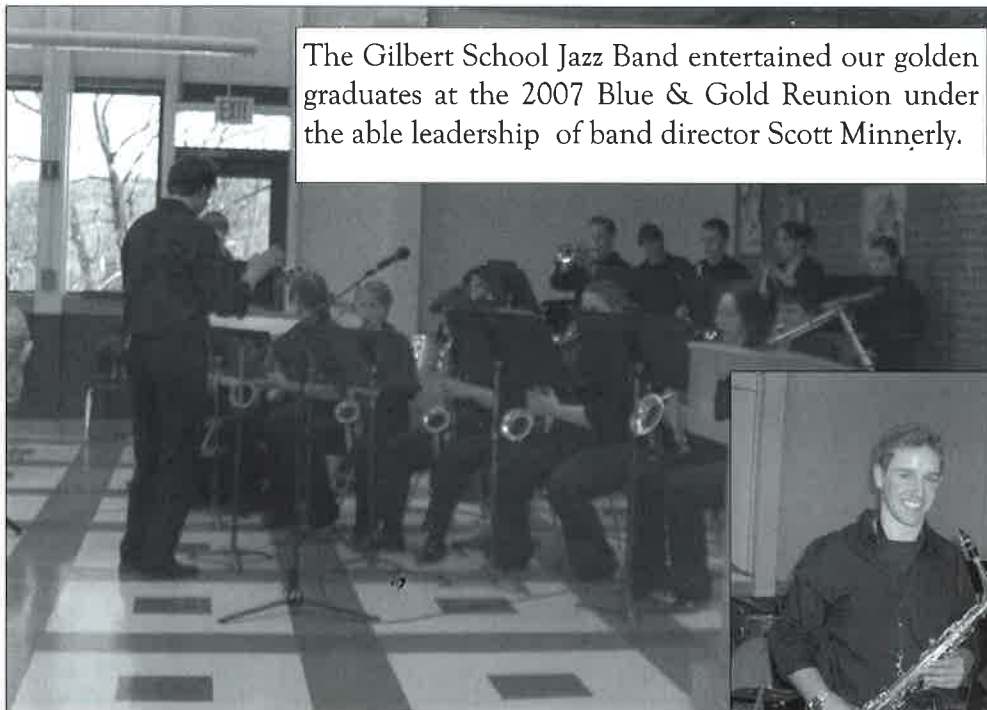
