



### **Dress Code Goals and Responsibilities:**

- The school district and individual schools are responsible for ensuring that student attire does not interfere with the health or safety of any student and that student attire does not contribute to a hostile or intimidating atmosphere for any student.
- Maintain a safe learning environment that is conducive to learning.
- The primary responsibility for a student's attire adhering to the school dress code resides with the student and parents or guardians.

### **Dress Code Policy:**

- **Students Must Wear**
  - polo/t-shirt/sweater/sweatshirt/hoodie/coat
  - Bottom: dress pants/sweatpants/shorts/skirt/dress/leggings/jeans
  - Shoes (activity-specific shoes are permitted; for example sports, and P.E.)
- **Examples of items Students May Wear**
  - Hoodies (with hoods down)
  - Fitted pants, including leggings, yoga pants, and "skinny jeans"
  - Shorts (length and fit should be appropriate for school)
  - Athletic attire
- **Items Students Cannot Wear**
  - Violent language or images
  - Images depicting drugs, alcohol (or any illegal item or activity), or use of the same, and/or hate speech, profanity, or sexually explicit images.
  - Pajamas or blankets
  - Pants with holes, rips, tears above mid-thigh
  - Images or language that creates a hostile or intimidating environment
  - Underwear and abdomen must not be showing
  - Headgear/Hats of any kind that obscure the face; this includes scarves, bandannas, etc.
  - Shirts/tank tops that reveal the midriff
  - volleyball/spandex shorts

### **Dress Code Enforcement:**

- Violations will be a minor infraction. To resolve dress code issues, students can call parents to bring in appropriate clothing or given "school clothing" as a last resort.
- Administration reserves the right to deal with any apparel determined to be inappropriate in a fashion they see fit.
