Blessing Elementary Campus Improvement Plan Synopsis 2025-2026

1. All STAAR tested grades and subjects will match or exceed the state average, and the campus will achieve an overall rating of 90%
2. Improve the number of students with masters performance on STAAR by a minimum of 5% in each tested area
3. All faculty and staff maintain “highly qualified” standards and obtain or maintain appropriate certification for their positions
4. Compensatory before- or after-school tutorials for struggling students
5. Continuation of daily WIN time in math and reading for all students grades K-5, inclusion support and dyslexia services to the students.
