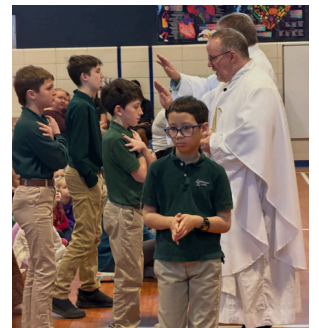

Celebrating Martin Luther King Jr.

Monday 1/19 was Martin Luther King Jr. Day. But who was he?

Martin Luther King Jr. was named Michael King at his birth (January 15th, 1929). His parents, Michael King Senior and Alberta Williams King, learned about a man named Martin Luther (but he's another story). They agreed with his ideas and had Michael's and their son's name changed to Martin Luther King. As Martin grew up, his childhood was cloaked in segregation. Blacks and whites had to use different bathrooms, buses, drinking fountains, and schools. He wanted to do something. Many years later, he got a chance. Martin led many marches and boycotts to try to stop this racism. He was Christian, and he made sure he used nonviolent civil disobedience. This meant he protested, but did so without harm. But one day, Bloody Sunday happened!

It was March 7th, 1965. Martin was protesting and marching with some others. Suddenly, the police came and attacked the protesters! 17 went to the hospital, and 50 were badly hurt. But Martin didn't give up. His family was a happy family. His wife was named Coretta Scott, and he had 4 children. They were named Yolanda, Martin, Dexter, and Bernice. In 1963, on August 28th, he presented his I Have A Dream speech. He won the Nobel Peace Prize the next year. On April 4th, 1968, Martin was preaching on his motel balcony. Suddenly, he was shot! He was rushed to the hospital and died in the evening. A man named James Earl Ray was found guilty and went to jail. Thanks for reading! Gearing Up For the Winter Olympics

This year's Winter Olympics is hosted by Milan and Cortina d'Ampezzo, Italy, featuring around 3,000 athletes across multiple venues across northern Italy. Milan will host ice events, while Cortina will be hosting outdoor and snow sports.

If you have watched the Winter Olympics before, then you know the games. If you haven't, then I'll tell you about a few of the games and a little bit about each of them.

We will first learn about three of the following types of skiing: Alpine, freestyle, and cross-country. Alpine skiing involves sliding down snow-covered slopes on skis with fixed heels. Freestyle skiing consists of aerial tricks, bumps, and obstacle courses. Cross-country skiing involves gliding over snow on long, thin skis with flexible boots while using poles.

Now we will move on to ice skating. In the Winter Olympics, there are three different types of ice skating, including figure skating, speed skating, and short track. Figure skating is an artistic sport where individuals, pairs, or groups perform spins, jumps, lifts, and intricate footwork on skates.

Speed skating is a competitive sport where athletes race on ice skates around an oval track to cover a set distance in the fastest time. Short track speed skating is an Olympic sport where multiple skaters race head-to-head inside a standard hockey rink.

There are three types of Olympic sliding sports: bobsleigh, luge, and skeleton. Bobsleigh, or bobsled, is a Winter Olympic sport where teams race sleek, aerodynamic sleds down a winding ice track, aiming for the fastest time over multiple runs. Luge is a fast gravity sport where athletes race feet-first on small sleds down an icy track. And last but not least is skeleton, which is a thrilling head-first, prone sliding sport where athletes race on small, flat boards down icy tracks, reaching speeds over 80 mph and steering with subtle body movements.

The last sport is ice hockey. Ice hockey is a fast-paced, physical team sport played with two teams of skaters using sticks to shoot a rubber puck into the opponent's net. I hope this article has persuaded you to watch the Winter Olympics from February 6th–22nd. Hope you enjoy the Winter Olympics this year.

There are some people who can't afford pets because they are too expensive. I am one of those people! I love animals and love pets, but if we bought all the pets I wanted, we would probably have just two dollars left. So what I do is catch pets, although I only really recommend water animals. I have had a pet crayfish, and right now I have a pet salamander. I have had her for about a year, and it is very easy to take care of her. In this article, I will tell you how to take care of these two pets.

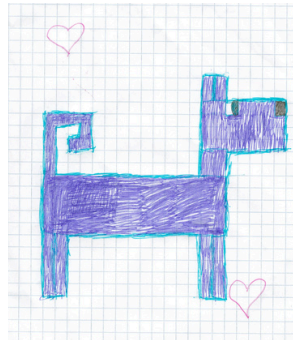
Crayfish: This animal is pretty easy to take care of. All you need is a tank or large jar, a bubbler (you can buy it on Amazon), and food. Crayfish will eat fish food. After you have had them for a while, you can try feeding them with tweezers. They also eat small worms and small pieces of carrots and peas. If you're using a large jar, cut a hole in the top for the bubbler tube to fit into. Don't make the hole too big because they can and will try to escape. Try to make their habitat as natural as possible. Crayfish make fun pets. Some are friendlier than others, but they are very interesting to watch because they are very busy critters.

Salamanders: I have a pet salamander. Salamanders are fun pets. I found mine in a creek when she was a baby. You can tell they're a baby when they live underwater and have gills on the side of their head, like axolotls. Salamanders transform from water animals to land animals. You can tell when they're transforming into a land animal when their gills disappear and their tails start to get thinner. The salamander is another very easy animal to take care of. All you need is a tank, a bubbler, and food. Add rocks to the bottom of the tank and create a good hiding space because salamanders love to hide. The tank needs to be an actual tank, and it has to be a good size: about 12" L x 5" W x 8" H. Salamanders love to escape as well, so make sure the hole is pretty small, and make sure there are no areas where the salamander can fit its head through because they can and will escape. Salamanders love to eat worms that sometimes need to be cut to size. They don't need to eat every day, and their food is free most of the year. I hope this article helps you find a good pet. My favorite is the salamander! Sometimes you don't need to spend a lot of time and money on a pet. Sometimes all you need to do is look in your own backyard.

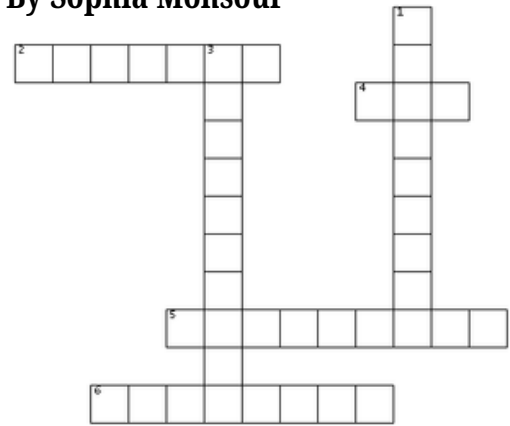

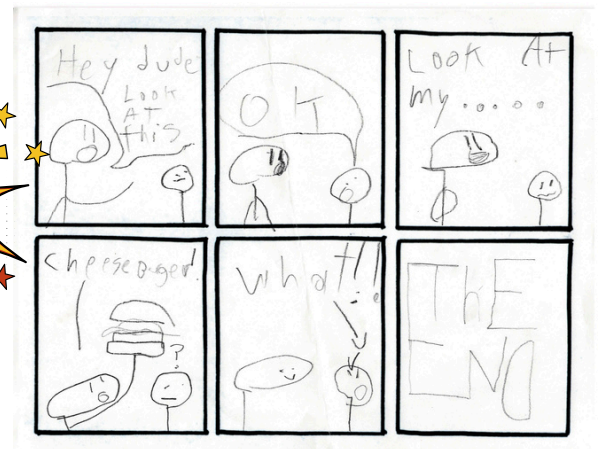
