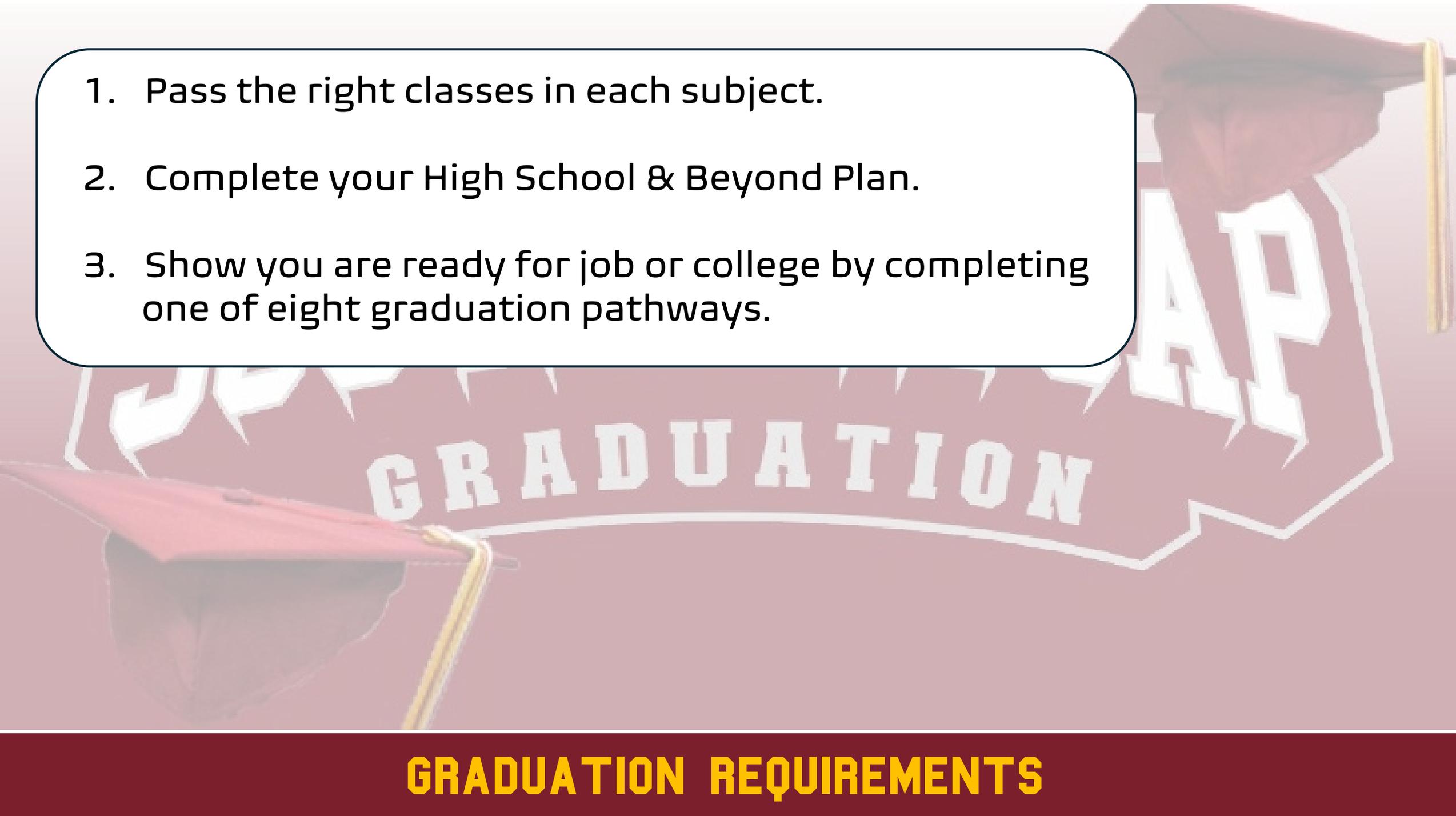
Parent/Guardian Communication is very important

 - Your HSBP will reflect your intentions for the first year out of high school, such as career/technical field, military enlistment, or general post-secondary education.
 - It is a WA State graduation requirement.

- Complete 2.0 or more CTE credits in the same CTE program area with one of the courses that either includes a CTE Dual Credit, or industry recognized credential, aligned with your High School & Beyond Plan.
- ASVAB Score
- Smarter Balanced HS Assessment or WA-AIM (English and/or Math)
- SAT or ACT scores on English and/or Math sections
- Earn College Credit in English and/or Math
- Transition Course in English and/or Math
- AP, College in the high school (CiHS) or Exams in English and/or Math
- Combination of English and Math option from any of the General Postsecondary Education Pathways

GRADUATION PATHWAYS

PROGRAMS TO EARN COLLEGE CREDIT

➤ **College in the High School (Freshman-Seniors)**

College curriculum and textbooks from a partner college and earn both high school and college credit upon successful completion of a CiHS course through UW, CWU or EWU.

➤ **Advanced Placement (AP)**

We offer AP classes that may earn college credit if students score high enough on the spring AP exam. Check college websites for acceptable scores.

➤ **CTE Dual Credit**

Completing CTE courses that offer students the opportunity to obtain college credit in addition to the high school credit if they achieve a 'C' grade or better in a qualifying class.

COLLEGE CREDIT

CiHS Courses for 2026-27

- College in the High School (CiHS) programs provide college academic courses to *9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade students.
- Each course is taught by high school teachers with college curriculum, textbooks and oversight by college faculty.
- These courses are challenging and a rigorous option for students who want to earn credit before enrolling in a 2- or 4-year college.

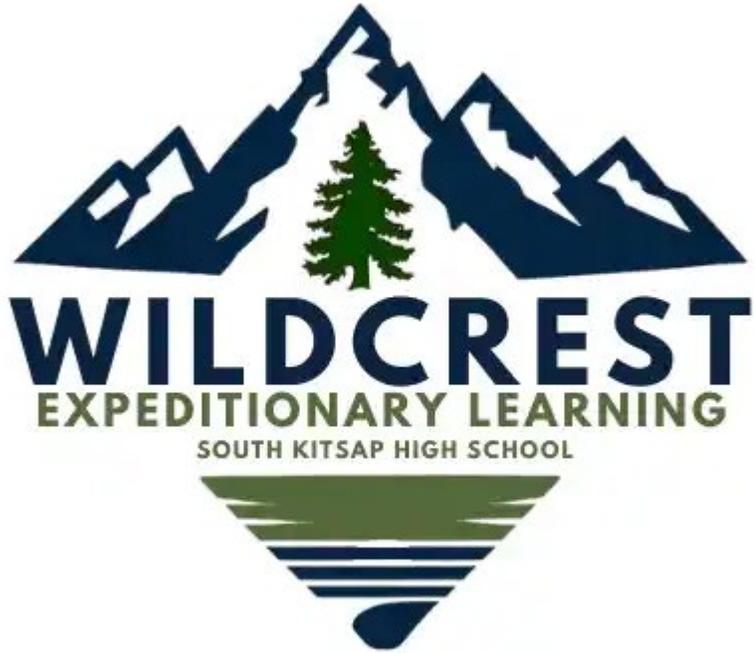
